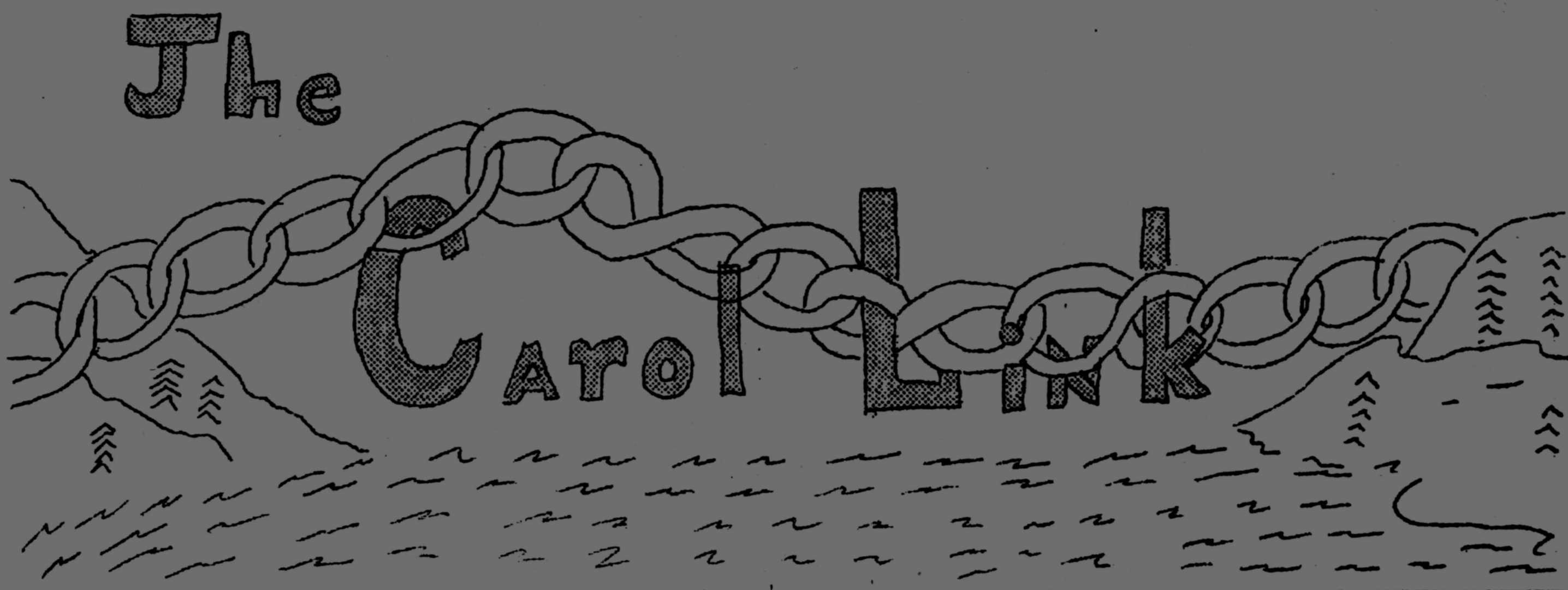

CANADIAN POLICE WEEK  
May 10 - May 16

IN AN INTERVIEW WITH OUR LOCAL RCMP DETACHMENT OFFICER, SERGEANT MULLALAY, HE EXPLAINED THAT THIS IS THE FIRST CANADIAN POLICE WEEK LAUNCHED UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE CANADIAN ASSOCIATION OF THE CHIEF'S OF POLICE, AND IS INTENDED TO BECOME AN ANNUAL EVENT.

THE OBJECT OF CANADIAN POLICE WEEK IS TO ENDEAVOUR TO ENHANCE THE POSITION OF THE POLICE OFFICER IN SOCIETY AND TO GAIN PUBLIC RESPECT FOR LAW AND ORDER.

THE RCMP ARE PARTICIPATING ALL ACROSS CANADA. OUR LOCAL RCMP DETACHMENT AT LABRADOR CITY TOOK PART BY ARRANGING FOR GROUPS OF STUDENTS FROM GRADES 9, 10, AND 11 OF LABRADOR CITY TO COME TO THE DETACHMENT, AND SHOW THEM THE WORKINGS OF THE DETACHMENT AND, EXPLAIN SOME OF THE EQUIPMENT.

APPROXIMATELY 300 STUDENTS TOOK PART, AND THEY WERE SHOWN THE COMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT, THE CRIMINAL INDEX, THE FINGER PRINTING EQUIPMENT, THE JAIL, THE GUNS, AND THE HAND CUFFS, BUT THE EQUIPMENT THAT APPEARED TO DRAW THE MOST ATTENTION WAS THE POLICE CARS AND THE RADAR EQUIPMENT.

OUR LOCAL DETACHMENT HAS TWO FULLY EQUIPPED POLICE CARS. (THE SERGEANT WOULD NOT DIVULGE WHAT WAS UNDER THE HOOD) THERE ARE EIGHT MEMBERS DESIGNATED TO THE DETACHMENT, FIVE OF WHICH ARE UNDER CONTRACT TO THE LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT AND THE OTHER THREE ARE UNDER CONTRACT TO THE PROVINCE OF NEWFOUNDLAND.

THE DUTIES OF THE RCMP ARE TO ENFORCE ALL LAWS UNDER THE FEDERAL STATUTES, THE PROVINCIAL STATUTES, AND MUNICIPAL BY-LAWS.

SERGEANT MULLALAY ASKED THAT IT BE DULY EXPLAINED THAT CANADIAN POLICE WEEK CONTINUES UNTIL MAY 16th. AND ANY CITIZEN IN THE AREA IS WELCOME TO COME TO THE DETACHMENT AND OUR LOCAL MEMBERS OF THE RCMP WOULD BE ONLY TOO GLAD TO GIVE THEM A CONDUCTED TOUR OF THE DETACHMENT.
