NEWS RELEASE

The Honourable W.J. Keough, Minister of Labour and Member for St. George's District, has just been advised by the Dept. of Highways that the following work is planned for the Codroy Valley area in his District this year:

(a) Repave the Chip-seal road from Trans Canada Highway near Doyle's Station Road to Upper Ferry.

(b) Pave the one mile road known as Ben's Siding Road.

It was pointed out by the Department that this is the only paving that can be done in the Codroy Valley area this year because the road from Upper Ferry to Codroy and the road from Upper Ferry to Searston both need major reconstruction before any pavement can be laid. The Department will have the necessary engineering work done this summer so that tenders can be invited for both these projects and the contracts awarded early this fall for the reconstruction of these roads this year and their paving next year.

1 July, 1970.

The Honourable W.J. Keough, Minister of Labour and Member for St. George's District, has just been informed by the Dept. of Highways that the following work is being planned for the Heatherton-Jeffreys' area in his District this year:

The paving of the Jeffreys' Access Road from its junction with Trans-Canada Highway to Jeffreys' and thence via Cartyville to Robinsons and to Heatherton Station Road including the Spur Road from Robinsons to Robinsons' Station.

At the moment the Department are negotiating a contract with Nova Construction Company Limited and it looks as if a contract will be arranged within the next ten days. The Department states further that the contractor is prepared to undertake this work for the same unit prices as Trans-Canada Highway work with the exception that the Department has to increase the unit prices for granulars and the asphalt mix to cover the increased hauling costs.

The section of road from Robinsons Station to the Trans-Canada Highway is not in a condition to be paved and major reconstruction work is required. Whilst it can make no firm commitment that it will be able to pave this road next year the Department will do everything possible to have it included in its program.
