UNEMPLOYMENT

Reading the papers, as of late, and it is noted that unemployment is steadily on the increase, not only in our own province, but all across Canada .

Ontario, the best industrial developed province has a reading of 4.8% and British Columbia typifies the west at 10%.

I have no figures for unemployment here in Labrador West, but I would presume it is quite low. Manpower may have a list people seeking jobs , but these are mostly housewives or people who have come here to find employment. They cannot remain here long because of our high cost of living and the housing situation .

It is virtually impossible to live on unemployment insurance or welfare payments in our area, I have known a few who have tried but they have not lasted long .

The housing situation is critical, to say the least, housing is either owned by the companies or Royal Trust, so those coming here without jobs have nowhere to stay.

The price of food being approximately 25% higher than the mainland, and unemployment insurance based on mainland statistics leaves these people no choice , they are forced by circumstances to move out

He is a student member of the Chartered Institute of Secretaries in Canada, and is enrolled in the Government Sponsored Certificate Programme in Public Administration.

The Department of Labour for this Province is a sustaining member of the Canadian Standards Association and the Minister of Labour, the Honourable W.J. Keough, says that the Chief Boiler Inspector represents the Department on the following Committees:-

- (1) B51 Code for Construction and Inspection of Boilers and Pressure Vessels,
- (2) B52 Mechanical Refrigeration Code.

The Chief Elevator Inspector represents the Department on the B44 Safety Code for Elevators, Dumbwaiters and Escalators.

The Minister says that these committees are formed to meet the desire for uniform legislation throughout the various provinces and provide reasonable safety for those persons who come in contact with the boilers, pressure vessels and elevators. The various C.S.A. Codes establish minimum standards for design, installation and maintenance of equipment which may be hazardous to the general public. Each enforcing authority in Canada can, if they so desire, adopt the C.S.A. Standard in whole or by specific section or part.

Must the Montreal Gazette also do the same? An extra 5 cents is reasonable which is what we have paid up to now, but your unexplained 15 cents increase is too much.

A prompt reply would be appreciated to justify, if you can, this astronomical increase.
