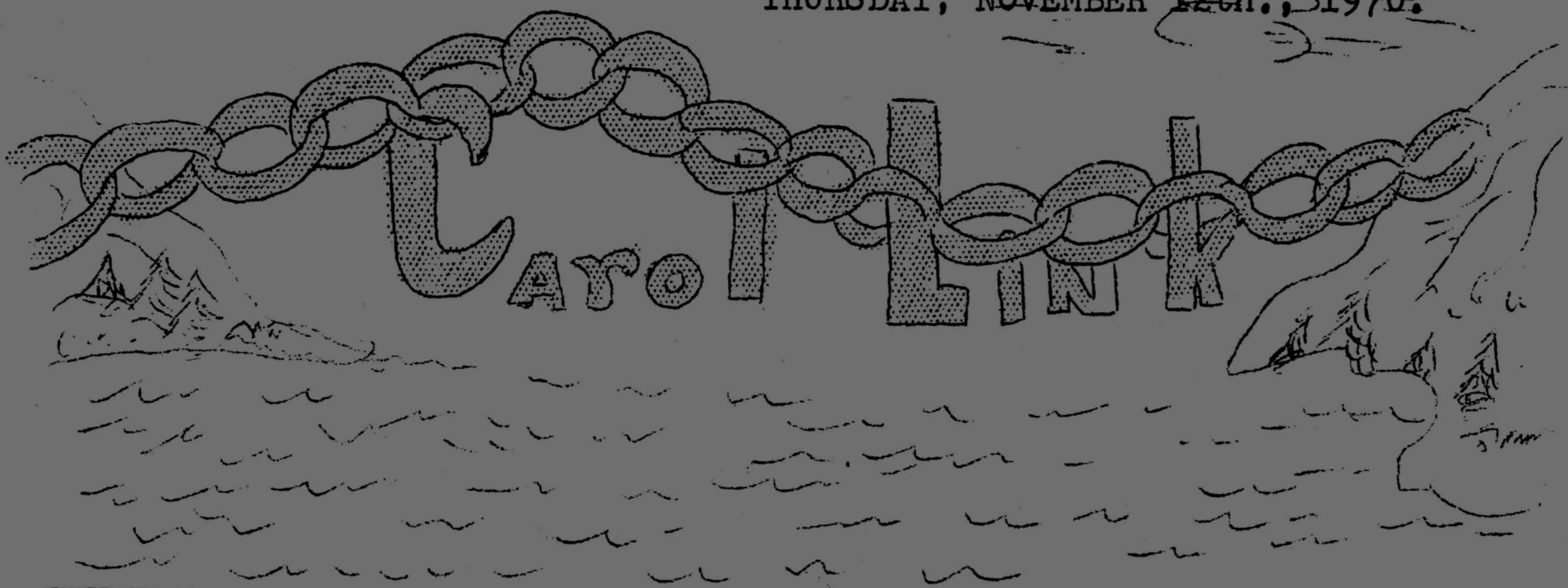

Today is November 11th., the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice between Germany and the Allies of the 11th hour of the 11th day of November, 1918. Many, however, were fortunate to return from the misery of the trenches, the horror of prison camps and the bloody battlegrounds of Europe.

We, the younger generation, have been required to accept the challenge and we hope we never will. However, out of all sincerity, we bestow our gratitude and respect and on this day of remembrance we again pay homage to the great mass who paid the price for the freedom which we today enjoy.
