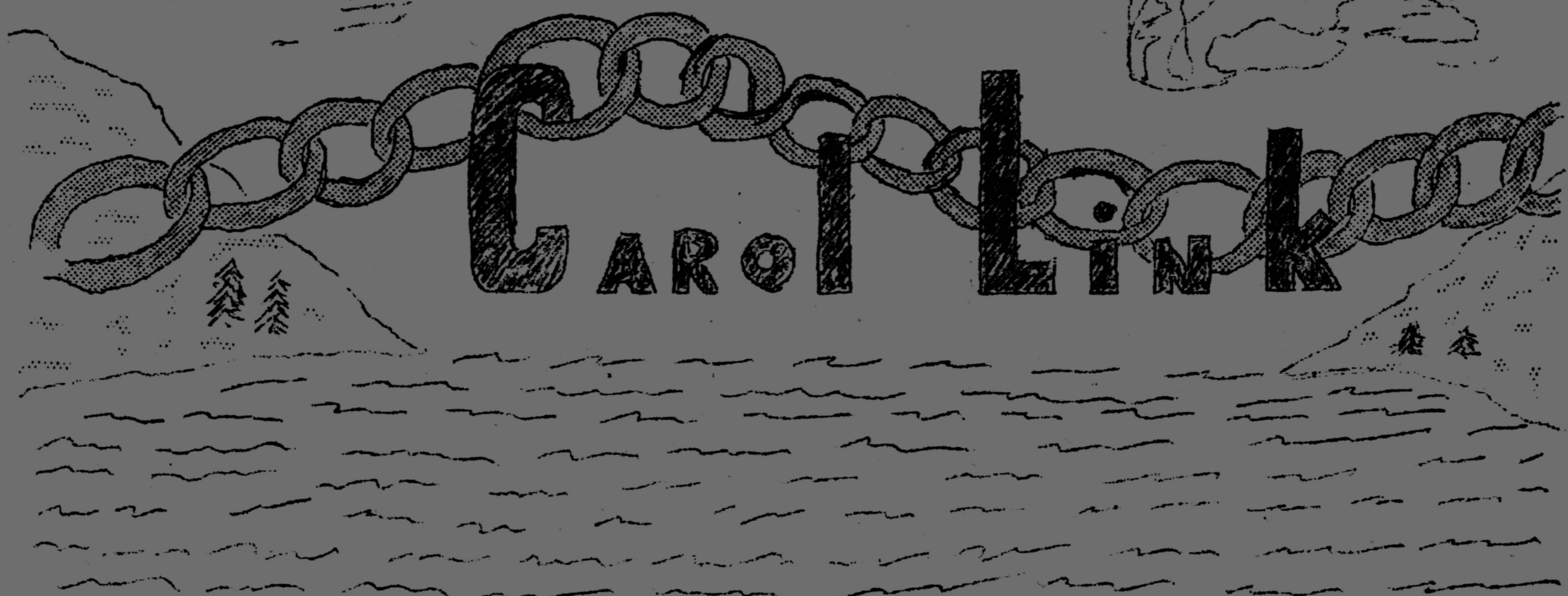

How large has our town of Labrador City grown, and how many cars are there within the town limits?

To both these questions I do not have the exact answers and these answers may be impossible to obtain, but our town has grown to the extent that between the hours of seven in the morning until one in the morning, there is an almost steady stream of traffic on our main street, Hudson Drive.

During the week, during school entrance and departure hours, the two traffic lights are operating, regulating traffic. This is well and correct. I wholeheartedly agree, but what about the remaining hours? During these hours there is no regulation of traffic, nothing to slow down traffic, and most of all, nothing to break the traffic flow, thereby giving a person entering this street an even chance to merge with the flow.

It has been brought to my attention by a commercial driver, and mentioned by quite a few more, that this street has sufficient traffic to recommend that these two lights be in operation from 7:00am to 1:00am. The facilities are there, so why not put them to their most efficient use.

Again in conversation with this same commercial driver, another topic came up, -- namely the removal of snow from our streets.

POLARIS FIGURE SKATING CLUB

Petra Burka, the 1965 World Figure Skating Champion will be in Labrador City, Monday, December 14, according to a spokesman from the Polaris Figure Skating Club.

Miss Burka, a former world champion and professional ice show star, is presently on a tour of the Newfoundland Section, her purpose being to promote and encourage young figure skaters.

During her brief 24-hour visit, Miss Burka will meet with the professional executive, and members of the skating club and will partake of various activities which the club has organized in her honour.

Miss Burka will visit the Labrador City Arena on Monday, Dec. 14th, where she will witness a typical skating session and talk with the skaters and other members present.

In early January of this year, the Honourable John Munroe, Minister of National Health and Welfare, and the Canadian Figure Skating Association, announced that they had acquired the services of Miss Burka. Miss Burka was 1965 World Figure Skating Champion and had just retired from a starring role in the professional show, "Holiday on Ice" which toured Europe.

Miss Burka's involvement with the Directorate and the CFSA came as a result of one of the recommendations of the Task Force Report on Sports, tabled in the House in May, 1969. The Minister said: "They recommend that we involve athletes who had given Canada recognition in World and Olympic events in organizational and promotional work once they retired." The Minister added that although her contract is with the CFSA, she was made available to assist in the promotion of the first Arctic Games (Yellowknife, March, 1970) and will be in attendance at the second Canadian Winter Games at (Saskatoon, February 11 - 22, 1971).

Her main job with the CFSA will be to promote figure skating as well as organizing skating clubs in the various regions of Canada. Petra has been through the club level and has been made acquainted with the problems that face the Association. Her knowledge and experience will aid greatly in making figure skating an even bigger sport in Canada.

Miss Burka, who is 24, moved to Toronto from her native Holland in 1951. She was coached during her entire career by her mother, Ellen, former Dutch Champion. Miss Burka was Canadian Champion in 1964, 1965, 1966; North American Champion in 1965; Bronze medallist 1964 Olympics in Innsbruck; 1965 World's Champion, Colorado Springs. In 1965 she attained this country's highest sports honour by being named Athlete of the Year and received the Lou Marsh Trophy. After retiring in 1966, she joined the European ice show "Holiday on Ice" as the star attraction before returning to Canada this year. Miss Burka took up residence in Ottawa on February 1.
