Notice is hereby given that, under authority of The Hours of Work Act, His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to proclaim the following days for observance as holidays during the calendar year 1971 pursuant to the provisions of the said Act:

(g) Memorial Day	Monday, July 5th.
(h) Orangemen's Day	Monday, July 12th.
(i) Labour Day	Monday, September 6th.
(j) Armistice Day	Thursday, November 11th.
(k) Christmas Day	Saturday, December 25th.
(l) Boxing Day	Monday, December 27th.

These holidays are required, by law, to be observed by chartered banks and by all businesses to which the relevant provisions of The Hours of Work Act apply.

In the weeks in which Commonwealth (Empire) Day, Discovery Day, Memorial Day, Orangemen's Day and Labour Day are required to be observed as holidays pursuant to the foregoing, employees in shops to which The Hours of Work Act applies shall be given another full day off in addition to these days and in addition to Sunday, but shops will not be required to close on any day in the weeks concerned other than these days and Sunday.

On Monday evening at 11:05 p.m. there was a major power failure in Labrador City. A transformer at the Hudson Street sub station burned out, blacking out over half of the town. That is all streets west of Hudson Drive, including the west side of Hudson and the industrial section of town.

Power was partially restored at apporximately 7:10 a.m. and all power was back on at 9:00 a.m.

The people not affected by the power failure were surprised by the radio announcement Tuesday morning that they were asked to conserve electricity as most of them knew nothing about it.

It is lucky that the power was not off for a longer period of time as the temperature dipped to minus 37, with a wind of 20 - 25 mph. Most people affected awoke to a cold house, cars not starting, and having to go to work with little or no breakfast.

There were reports of frozen pipes in the staffhouses and bunkhouses. IOC accomodations had to evacuate staffhouse #1 for Tues. night and one of the bunkhouses.

Modern living is wonderful but, do we rely on electricity too much? If the electricity had remained off for two days or even 24 hours at these temperatures, what would have been the results?
