SOCIETY FOR THE PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS
LABRADOR WEST

Tuesday, 9th. of March marked the turning point of your local S.P.C.A. From that date all stations were: Go, Go, Go.

A meeting was held at the O'Brien Hall on Tuesday evening, the attendance and response to the meeting was extremely good. It was quite evident from the number of people who attended, that, the S.P.C.A. was thriving, and more important, that the people in Labrador West are more animal conscious than most people in the area would believe. We feel sure that more people feel the same way but, to put it bluntly, are shy or otherwise, to be identified with an organization which is only concerned with the well being of animals.

It was noted, that a number of friends from Wabush were in attendance, it is good to feel that the cause of the society is being pursued in our twin towns. It is hoped that a meeting of the Society will be held in Wabush in the near future.

Mrs. M. Murphy (President), made two important announcements to the meeting: a) That a building for use as an animal shelter would be made available this year. This is the first positive step towards the aims of the society which were quoted in our last issue. The setting up of the shelter will involve considerable work in addition to that at present under way. It is anticipated that volunteers will be called for at a later date. b) That Mr. David B. Sparkes, lawyer-advocate, has agreed to act as legal adviser in an honorary capacity to the Society. This is another important step towards the development of the society.

Further discussion took place and it was agreed that the society growth was sufficient to warrant the implementation of a definite membership program. Membership cards are currently being processed with annual dues fixed at \$2.00

Suggestions for raising funds were called for and it was evident from the response that 1971 was going to be a most successful year for the society.

A "RAFFLE" is currently being organized and tickets will soon be on sale. The prize will be - One box of good cheer comprising of 3 bottles rum, 3 bottles scotch, 3 bottles rye, 3 bottles gin. One shopping voucher to the value of \$80.00 at the store of your choosing. Tickets will be on sale shortly at 50¢ each or 5 for \$2.00. Support your local S.P.C.A. by purchasing your tickets early.

Some time ago the comment was made that there appeared to be an increase in the number of animals roaming the streets. This was in all probability true, however, one must look closer to find the reason. It is common knowledge that the society do have a register containing all pertinent details such as age, type, colour and size along with the owners name and address or phone number. Well over 100 animals are on this register. In addition, each animal has a tag complete with the identification number. Such information makes the work of the S.P.C.A. easy when any of these animals go astray. Usually no great trouble is experienced in locating and returning these pets to their home.

In addition to the above service, a list of people requiring pets is also retained along with a list of unwanted animals. Despite this, an average of 6 animals per week during the winter months are reported found, invariably with no positive means of identification. In some cases the owners report the loss of their pet. This helps in location and return. In many cases, losses are never reported. This creates problems.
