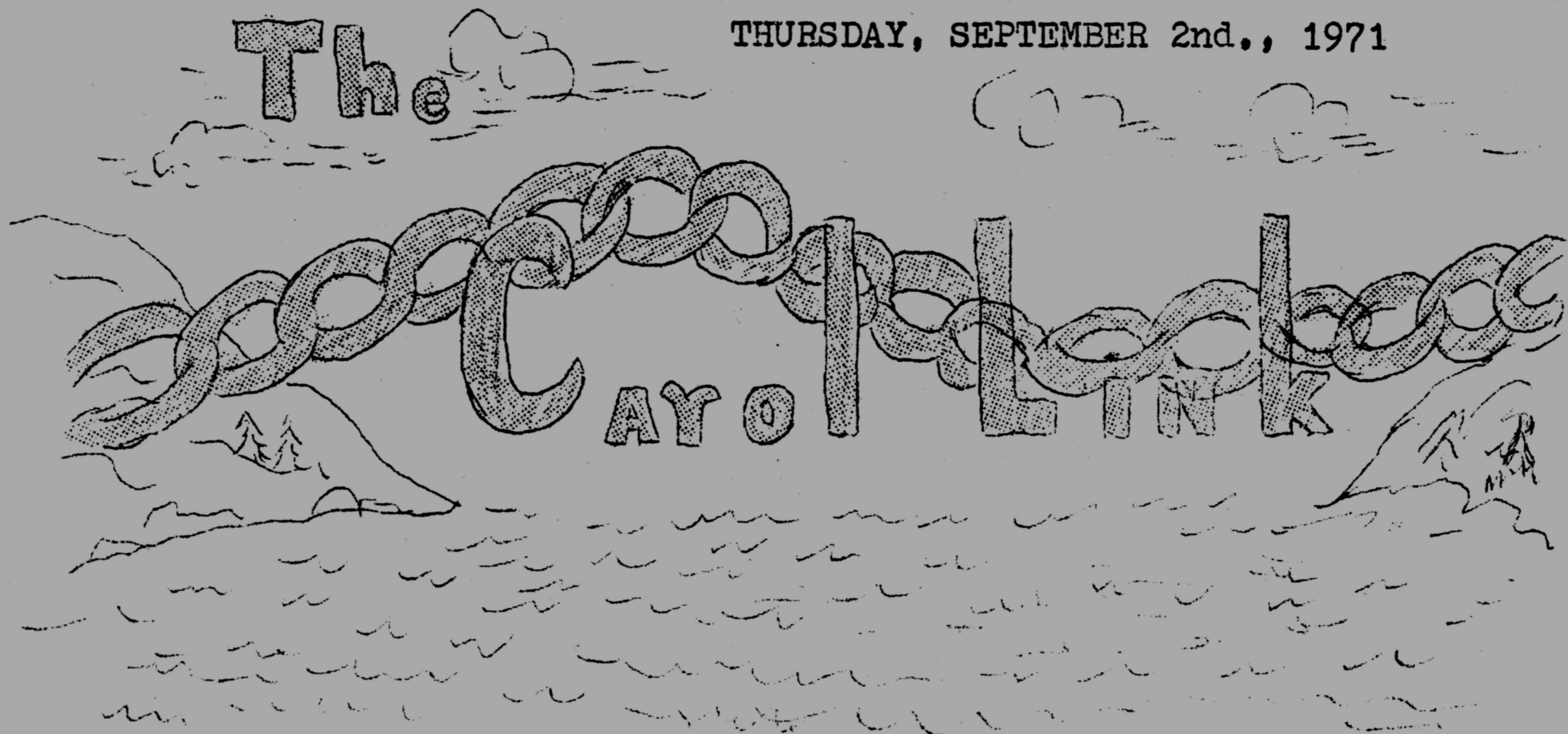

A factory for health, fitness and recreation is what's happening at the Wabush Recreation Association starting this fall..

A program fee, which will be a great saving over the year, will permit you to have access to recreational swims, fitness classes, (gym or pool), gym activities, basketball, floor hockey etc. There will be extra charges for special events or instructional programs. Program fee card holders will get these at a reduced rate.

There are some activities already in progress now. The gymnasium is open at different hours for different age groups where basketball, floor hockey, soccer, baseball and other activities are played. There is also a swimming fitness class every weekday between 12:30 and 1:00 p.m.

The teenagers have a room at the recreation center where they can drop in and dance, read, talk, play ping pong and other games.

There is also a daytime nursery, with supervision, where Moms and Dads can leave their pre-schoolers while they are involved in organized classes.

And she said unto her son, Bring me yet a vessel. And he said unto her, There is not a vessel more. And the oil stayed.
11 Kings 4:6.

A very interesting and thrilling story is recorded in 11 Kings ch. 4:1-7, of a widow who had been married to one of the prophets associated with Elisha, had come to the point of destitution. The creditors were about to take her two sons as slaves to make up for what she owed. When she cries to Elisha for aid, he asks her what she has in the house of value and she lists her assets as "one pot of oil." He tells her to borrow as many empty containers as she can, go into her house, shut the door, and begin to pour out the oil into the vessels. Her sons quickly gather for her some empty vessels and she does as the prophet commanded. When she has filled them all to the brim, the original pot of oil has not yet run dry. She asks her son for an additional container, but there are no more to be had; then, and only then, does the oil stop running. Had there been more vessels there would have been more oil! God has worked a miracle to deliver this poor widow, for she subsequently sold the oil and paid her debts. The lesson is plain: There is no limit to God's grace. He freely fills empty vessels. "God giveth not the Spirit by measure" (John 3:34). It is we who limit God; the oil never stops as long as we have room to receive it! Yes, you are His child, but have you received "abundance of grace"? (Romans 5:17) Someone has said we are like wicks. Our light for Christ in this world is proportionate to the oil to which we have access. There is a little parable about one who asks of a lamp, "Will you not soon burn to an end with your poor wick?" "No, I do not fear that, for the light does not burn me, though it burns on me. I only bear to it the oil which saturates my texture. I am but the ladder upon which it climbs. It is not I, but the oil that is in me, that furnishes the light!"

Vessels, empty of self, can hold the most oil and provide the most light.

Like the cruse of oil unfailing is His grace forevermore,
And His love unchanging still;
And according to His promise with the Holy Ghost and power,
He will every vessel fill..

"The Holy Spirit flows to those who are empty of self."

Mr. Dennis Storey, National President of the Canadian Society of Safety Engineering, was in Labrador City - Wabush area on August 29-30, to help organize a local branch of that Society.

Approximately 20 people, including safety personnel from the Iron Ore Company of Canada and Wabush Mines, attended a meeting at the O'Brien Hall on Monday, August 30.

At this meeting Mr. Storey explained the purpose and function of the Society. After a discussion period a steering committee was elected to organize a chapter of the Society in this area. The officers elected were Mr. John Murphy, Safety Supervisor, Iron Ore Company of Canada, as chairman; Mr. William Rough, Safety Supervisor, Wabush Mines; Mr. Eric March, Safety Inspector, Iron Ore Company and Mr. Phil Bolanger, Safety Supervisor, Canadian Bechtel, as vice-chairmen; and Mr. Frank Etsell, Safety Inspector, Iron Ore Company of Canada as Secretary Treasurer.

It is hoped that through this society safety personnel in the area will gain new knowledge and techniques and become better qualified to cope with the safety needs of the industrial complexes.
