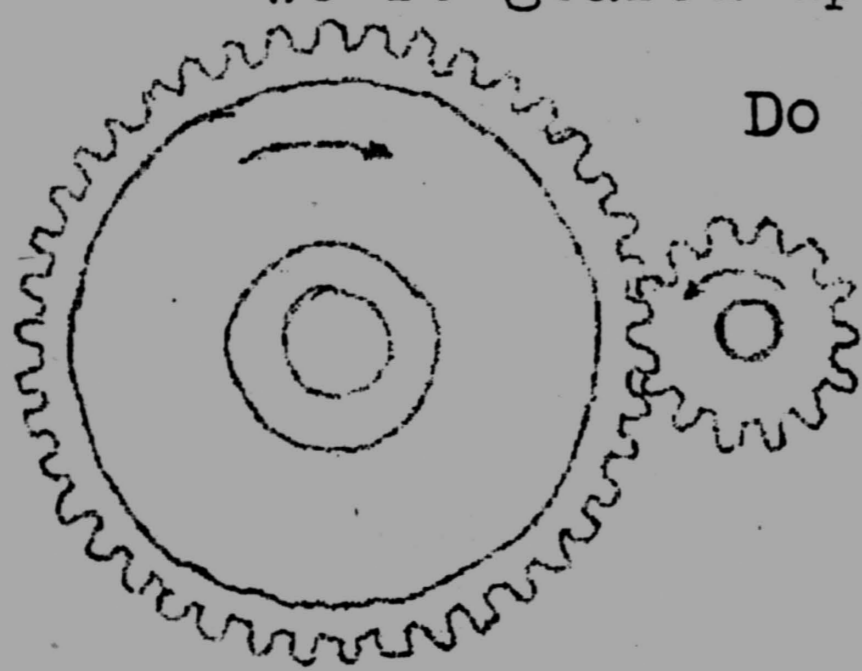

DAILY LIGHT  
by D.R. Parsons

If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me:  
Psalm 66:18

This is rather a pointed and incontrovertible statement, and so true! We either love our sins or we love the Lord and hate our sins. When a thrombus (a clot of blood) blocks some part of the circulatory system and obstructs circulation, physical life is endangered. When sin obstructs our fellowship, our communication with God, spiritual life is impaired. If I have a wicked end in view, if I cherish some thought of wrong-doing, let me not cry out to God. We all see iniquity in our hearts, and always will, until we have our body of perfection; consider "regard," alone, in the sense of "cherish."

In order to remove the danger to our lives, the thrombus must be removed. In order to remove the spiritual danger, cherished sin must be removed.

In our everyday mechanical world, when things are not performing correctly we either call the repair man, or we sit down and think through to see if we can correct the fault, a loose wire, a blown fuse, or out of fuel.. In our everyday spiritual world, we know when blessings are with-held (if we will be honest), and we know when answers to prayer seem few and far between. If this condition occurs, sit down with the instruction book (the Bible) and you will find the answer to your problems. Fall on your knees and start "sin hunting"; call on the Holy Spirit to reveal your sins to you; confess your sins to God and have the assurance that the Advocate with the Father has caused them to be blotted out. If this thrombus (sin) is removed, the circulation (answered prayer) is normal again.

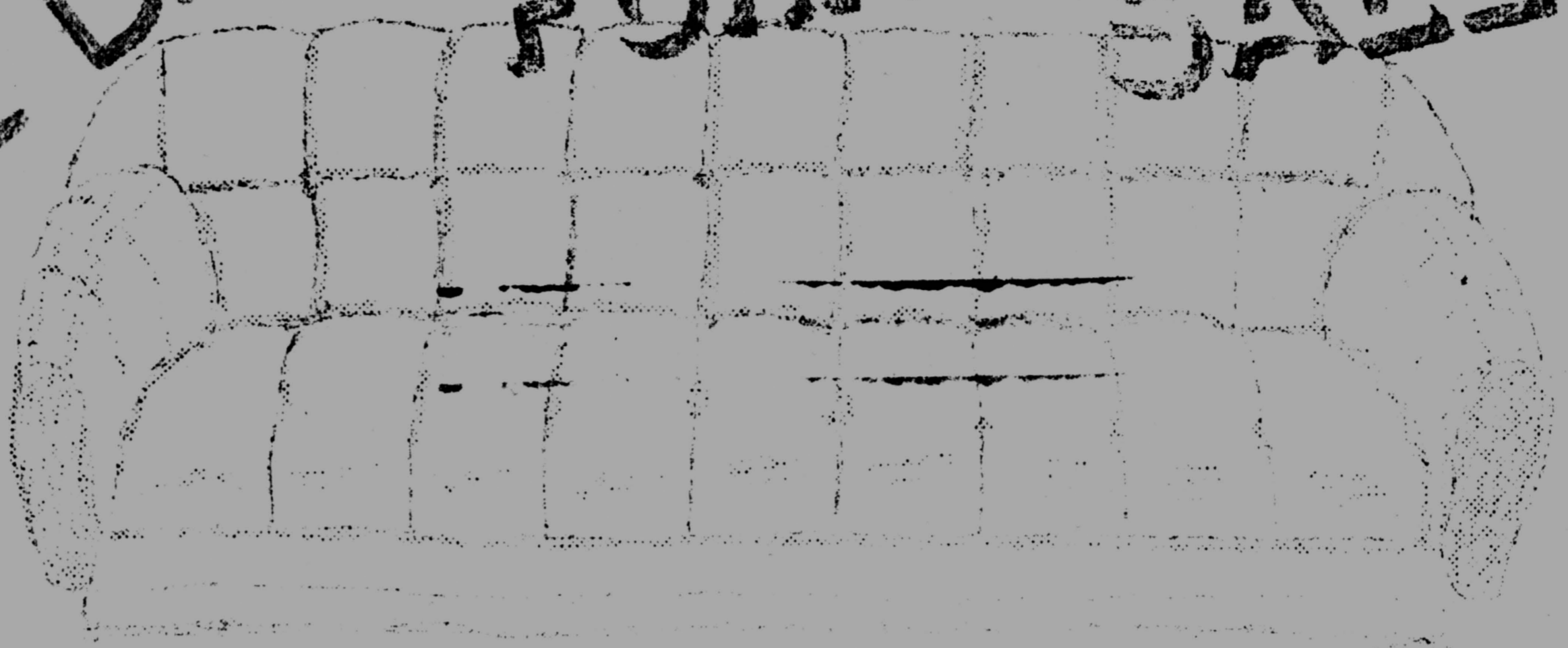

(Romans 10:17.)

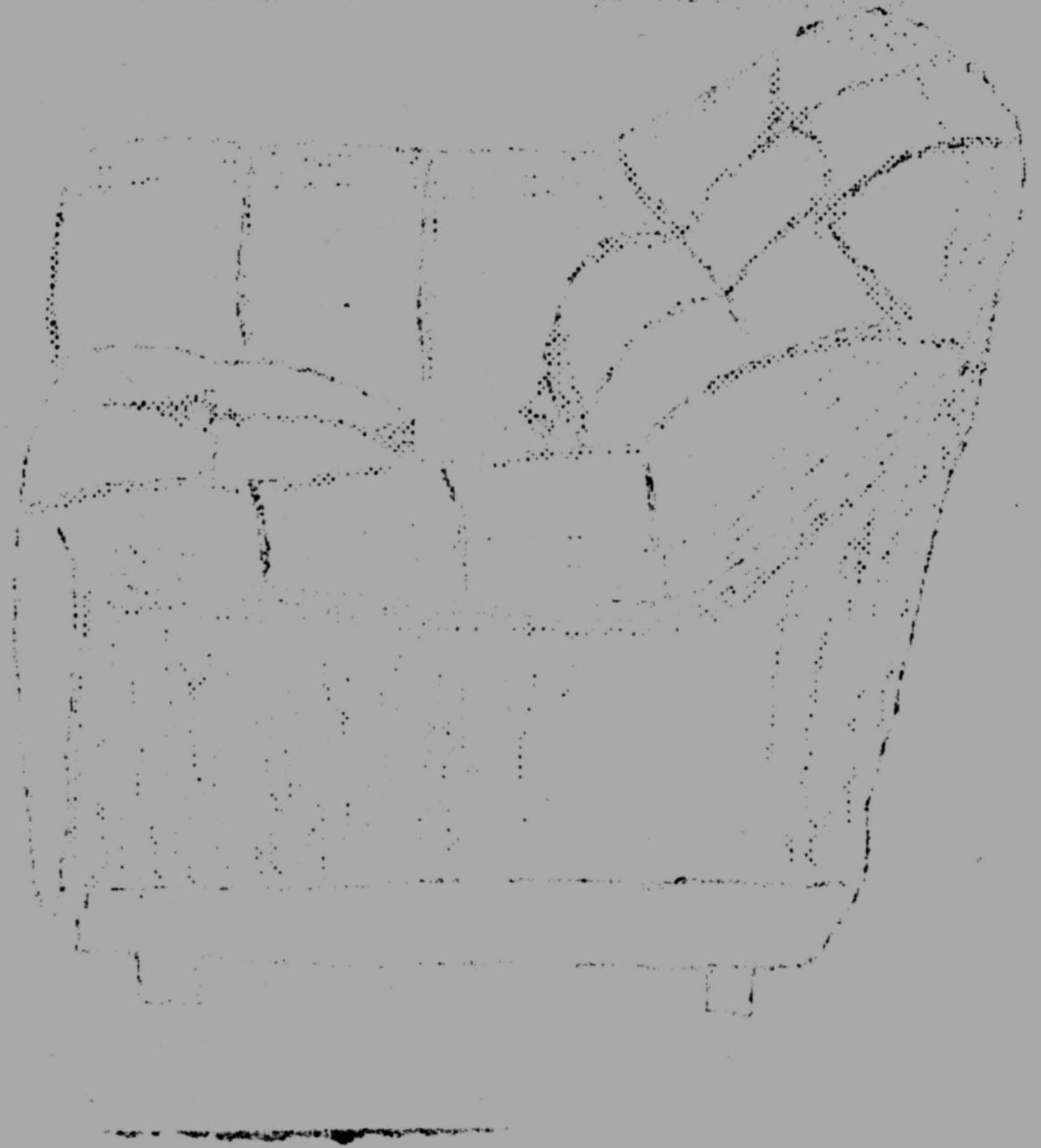

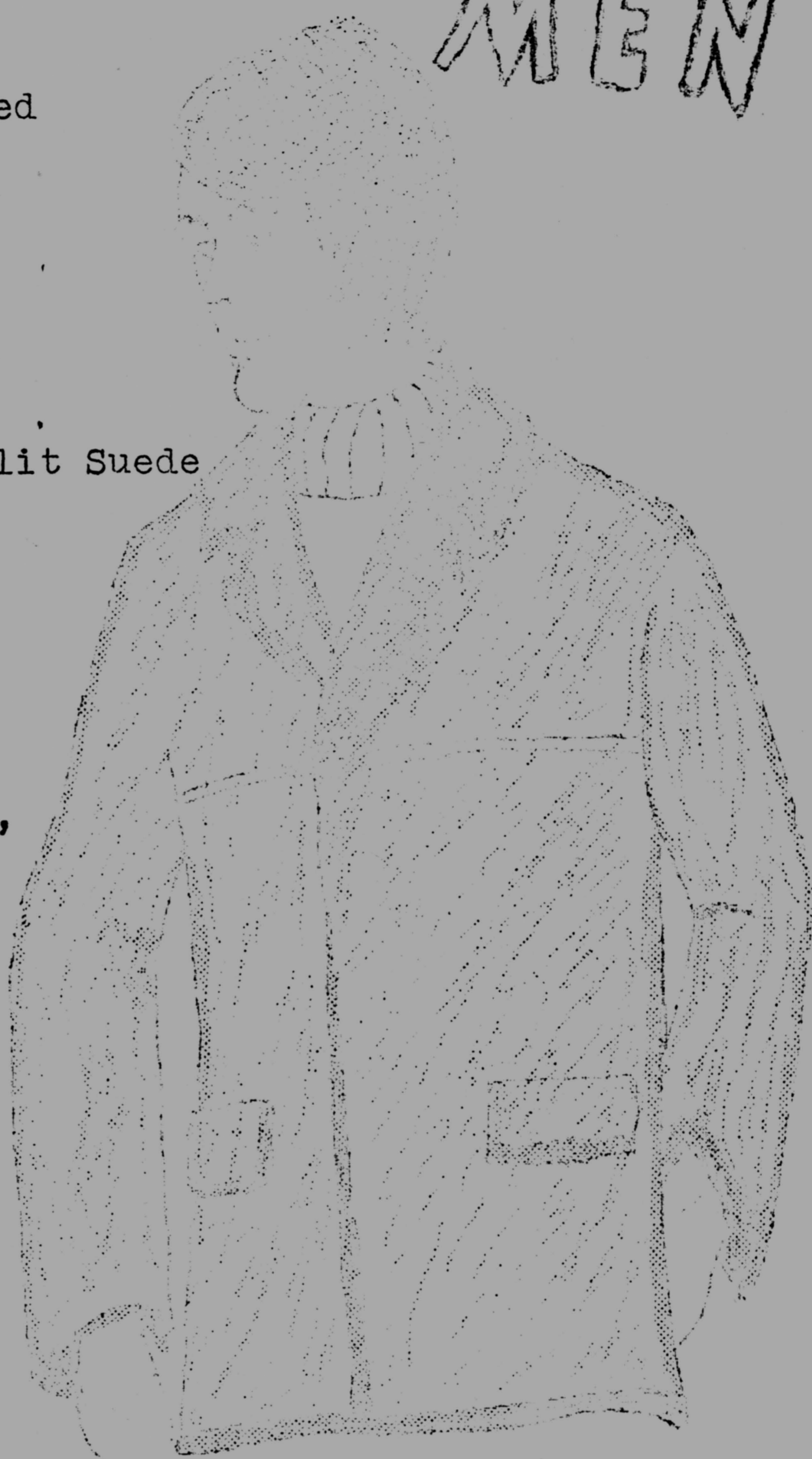
