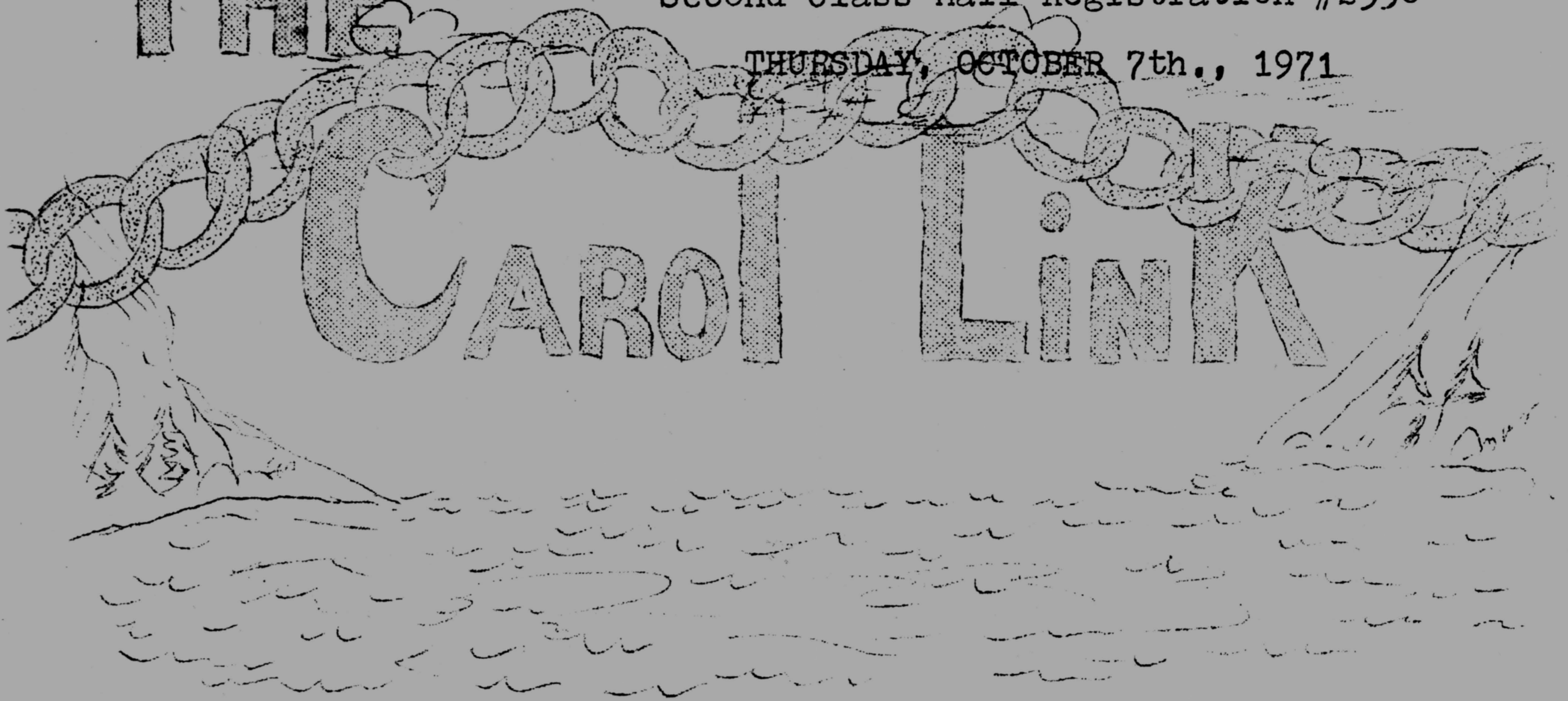

DAILY LIGHT

Then said the king unto her, what wilt thou, queen Esther? and what is thy request? It shall be even given thee to the half of the kingdom. Esther 5:3.

A moving sketch of queen Esther before the king, who is holding out his golden scepter, is superimposed on a larger sketch of the King of kings with His hand outstretched. The circumstances speak of a larger illustration and says, "Dost thou want nothing, O poor soul?"

Esther had approached her king with great courage. The scepter held out meant that she was accepted, and she gave her request. Time passed, and she gave it again. Her petition was laid fully before the king, and it was granted.

Why are we, as children of God, so fearful to go before Him with our petitions? We have a Mediator, the Man Christ Jesus, who is ever ready to go make intercession for us. His arm is outstretched to receive us, and the result of asking is receiving. "Dost thou want nothing, O poor soul?" Is there nothing you have to ask? Does the Father not know that your heart is breaking with requests and that your needs are great? Do not wait? Present them all to him. When you pour out your request to Him, it goes from your heart to the heart of God. If you have seen His generosity before, you will see it again, and He does not withhold that which we should have. "Cast thy burden upon the Lord, and he shall sustain thee." (Psalm 55:22.)

In doing this we must be willing for the Lord to ask us this question: "What wilt thou that I shall do unto thee?" (Luke 18:41.) When we tell Him our needs, we must in return give Him obedient hearts and wills. Trust and faith are required of us. We must express our love to Him. If we want His answer, we must do what He requires.

What does He require of me? "Fear the Lord thy God, . . . Walk in all His ways, and . . . love Him, and . . . serve the Lord thy God with all thy heart and all thy soul." (Deuteronomy 10:12.)

The scepter was outstretched. Esther drew near and touched the top of it. "What wilt thou, queen Esther?.. it shall be given thee to the half of the kingdom." His hand, the almighty Hand of our God, is reached toward us. Come, near. . . "Come now and let us reason together saith the Lord; though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool." (Isaiah 1:18.) Your step of faith brings you to the hand of God.

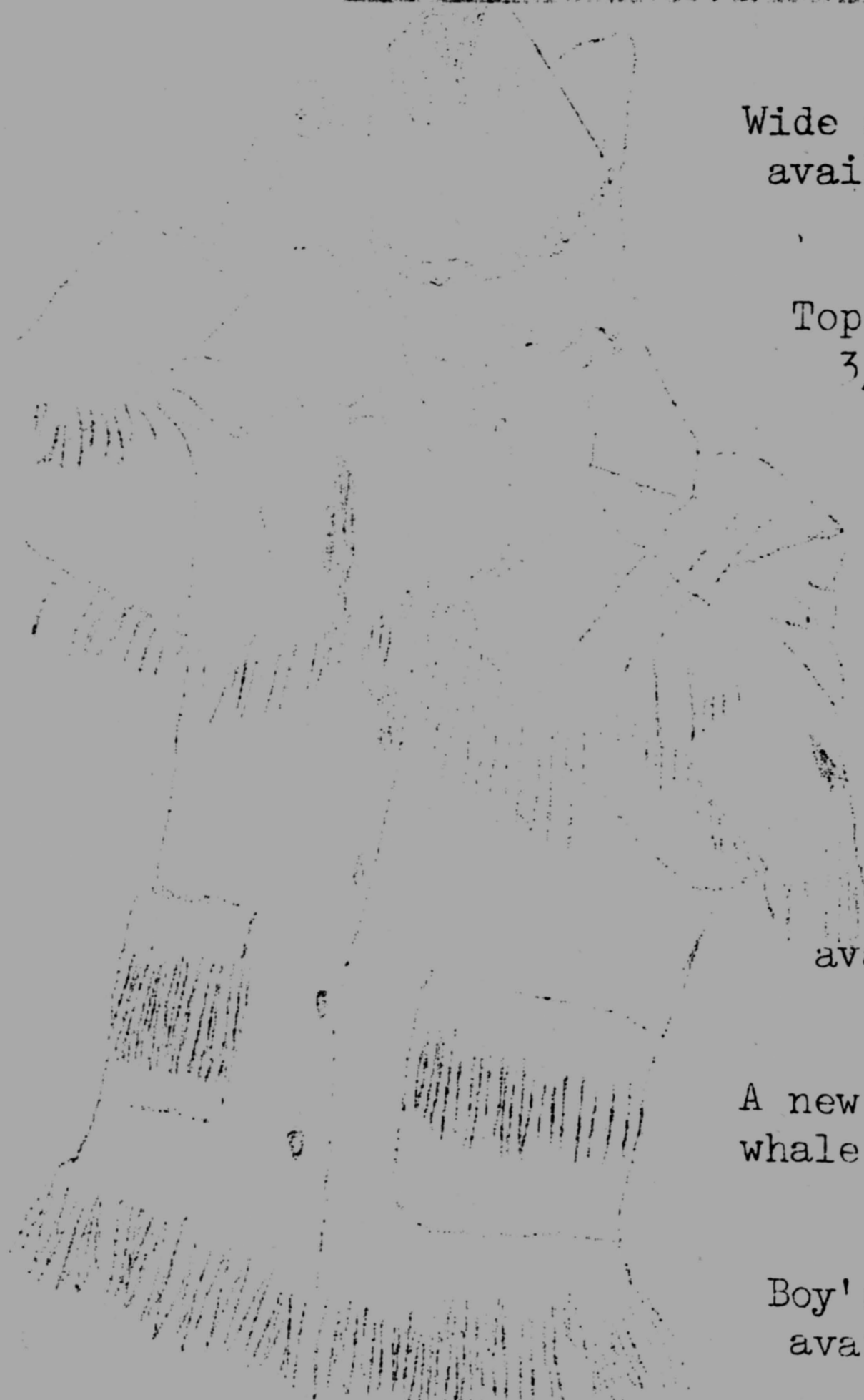
