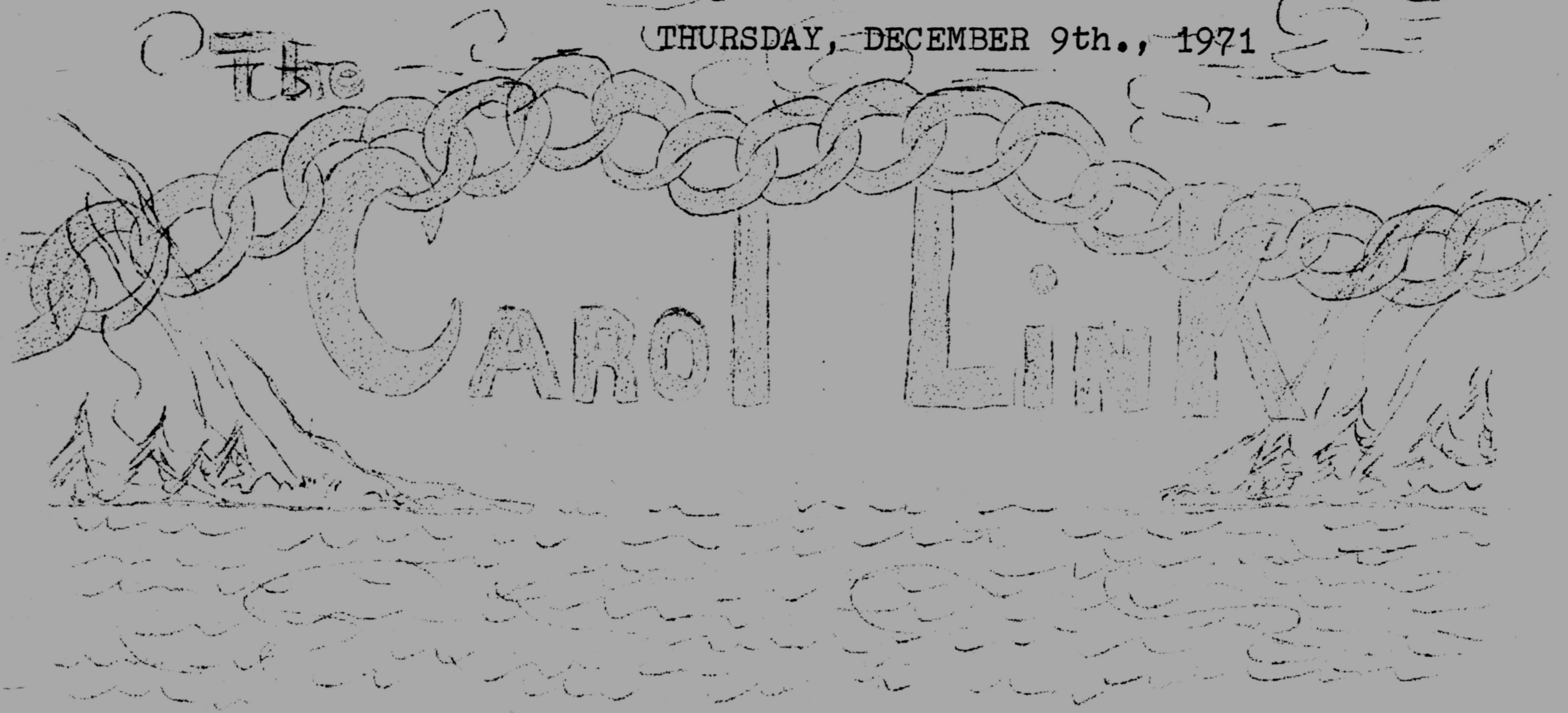

WHICH SIMPSON SEAR'S WISHING BOOK DID YOU USE?

It is a fact that two different catalogues from Simpson Sear's are being used by the residents of Labrador. One is issued from Toronto, the other from Halifax. If you have the Toronto catalogue and ordered your Xmas gifts from Toronto, you are one of the lucky ones. The Halifax prices are as much as 16% higher on many items. And most of these items are Xmas gifts.

The company as far as we can make out from the limited knowledge of laws concerning mail order companies, are not breaking any laws and can claim transportation costs as the price factor.

But, why only on some items and not on all? We did find a few items which were cheaper in the Halifax catalogue.

We tried to break down the code used in numbering the pages and the best we can come up with is the following; Toronto area code is a small figure two (2) beside the page number, and Halifax is the figure six (6).

Further to this price difference, we also take exception to the fact that we in Labrador City and Wabush must pay freight on bulk item orders. This company will pay the freight to Sept Iles, some two hundred miles south of us, connected by the Quebec North shore & Labrador Railway. We would not mind if they just charged us the freight from Sept Iles to here, but by the looks of things, we must be paying the complete freight from the factory.

Is there no justice for the people who live in the north? Yet the Government of Canada is forever asking men to settle up here. Maybe the government should live up here and put up with the injustice and discrimination we receive from our southern companies.

All of us have heard the old maxim: "Let your conscience be your guide." If I keep on doing wrong, it will turn until it wears the edges all off, and then it will not hurt me any more."

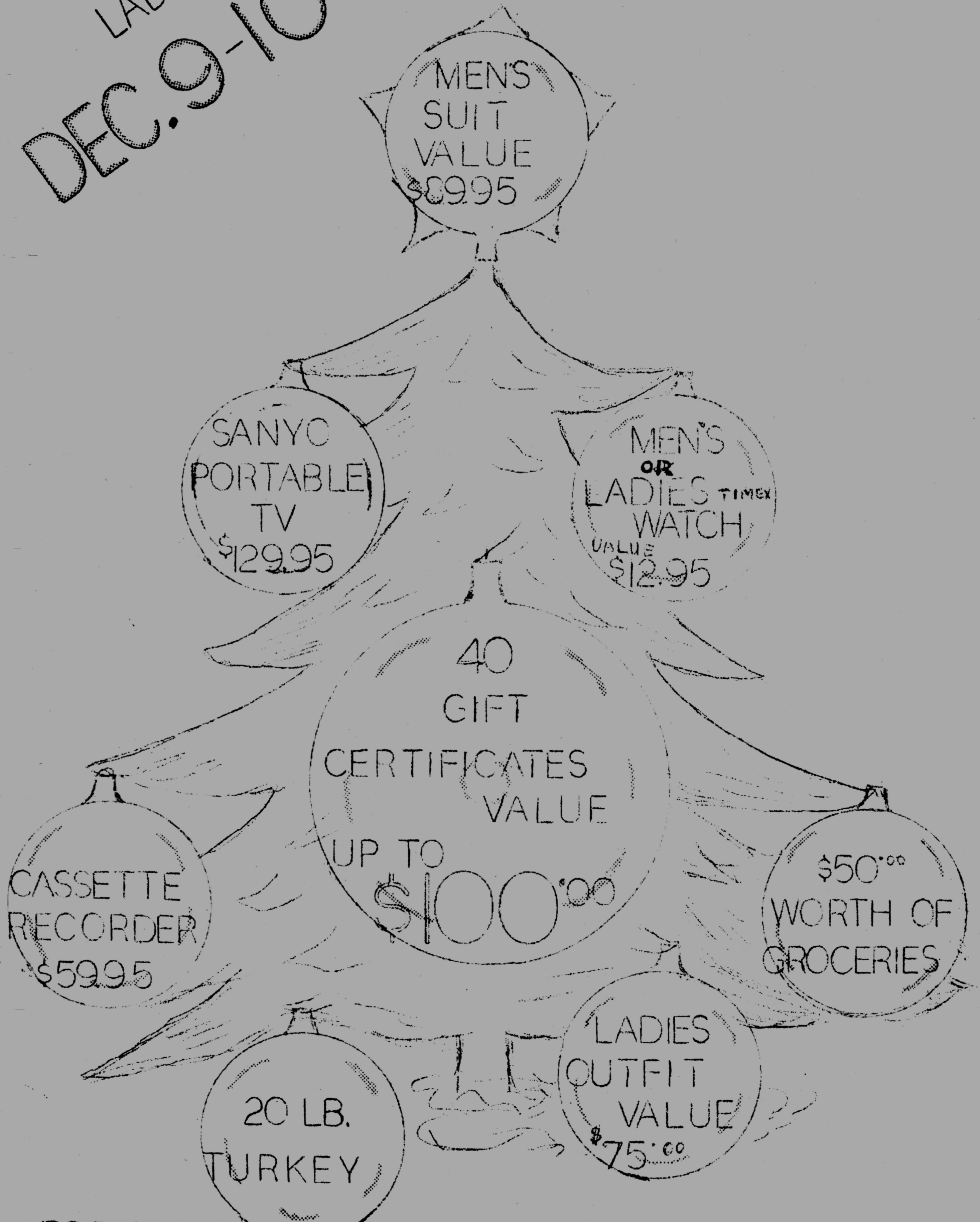

NEWS RELEASE.....

Ambrose Peddle, Conservative Member of Parliament for Grand Falls White Bay-Labrador, has endorsed the brief of the Grand Falls Chamber of Commerce proposing a regional college for Grand Falls.

In a statement from his Ottawa Office, Peddle says the Chamber's brief very effectively argues the merits for the establishment of one of the first such colleges in Grand Falls.

"I think the case for the regional colleges has been well documented," Peddle said, "and most clear-thinking Newfoundlanders will agree that regional colleges would be a tremendous advancement to our educational system.

Most important, I believe, is the fact that they will make post-secondary education available to many students who are now prevented from bettering themselves because of limited funds."

The M.P. added that the campus problem at Memorial is growing more acute each year, and may reach the critical stage even before 1975-76, as warned by the Royal Commission on Education.

Peddle said he agreed completely with the Chamber's assertion that regional colleges be located scientifically rather than politically. "And, as the brief very excellently points out, Grand Falls is a logical site for a regional college."

Grand Falls, centrally located, would cater to the needs of thousands of students in the immediate and surrounding areas; transportation linking these districts to Grand Falls is extremely good; the secondary education system is considered among the best in the province; and central Newfoundland's economic prospects are good.

Peddle said he was also in full agreement with the proposals made in the brief for the type of college which should be located in Grand Falls, encompassing academic, technical, and special adult courses.

The wharf at Smith's Harbour, Green Bay will be reconstructed this winter as part of the federal government's Special Employment Plan, Conservative M.P. Ambrose Peddle has announced.

Peddle, the Member for Grand Falls-White Bay-Labrador, says the Department of Public Works has advised him that the contract for the work has been awarded to Gid Sacrey Ltd. of St. John's which submitted the low tender of \$35,500.

The highest of four bids on the project was \$44,971.

The existing wharf, says Peddle, is now in a state of disrepair. It will be demolished and replaced by a creosoted timber structure, with a rock and gravel approach.

TEN SUGGESTIONS FOR SCHOOL BUS RIDERS.

Your school bus driver has an important and difficult job. He is responsible for driving you to school and back safely everyday. Will you help by following these suggestions?

1. Leave home in good time to catch your bus without hurrying.
2. Choose the safest walking route to and from the bus stop.
3. Make sure traffic is clear if you must cross the highway.
4. When waiting for the bus, do not stand or play on the road.
5. Board the bus in single file without crowding or pushing.
6. Take your seat promptly, and stay seated until the bus stops.
7. Keep books, lunch boxes, and other items on your lap, not in the aisle where they may trip someone.
8. Keep arms and head inside the bus at all times.
9. Fighting, wrestling or horseplay on the bus is dangerous and distracting to the driver.
10. In addition to following the directions of your driver, and your school bus patrol if you have one, always look both ways before crossing the road.

A MESSAGE TO PARENTS

Educators, school bus drivers and safety organizations all share a concern for the safety of your child during his bus trip to and from school.

Every effort is made to ensure that the bus is in the best of mechanical condition and equipped with adequate safety devices and markings. Drivers are carefully selected and thoroughly trained in the operation of their vehicle and the care of their passengers.

In spite of all this training and control, one factor remains as a potential hazard to your child, and that is the collective passenger behaviour. Parents who have travelled any distance with boisterous children in the family car can quickly appreciate the driver distraction from 40 to 50 children, eager to dissipate their youthful energy.

Instances have been recorded of bus accidents occurring because the driver had turned momentarily to quell an unruly disturbance in the bus - a situation which should never occur.

Therefore, success in providing the safest bus ride for your child also depends on you. Please discuss with your child the information contained above.

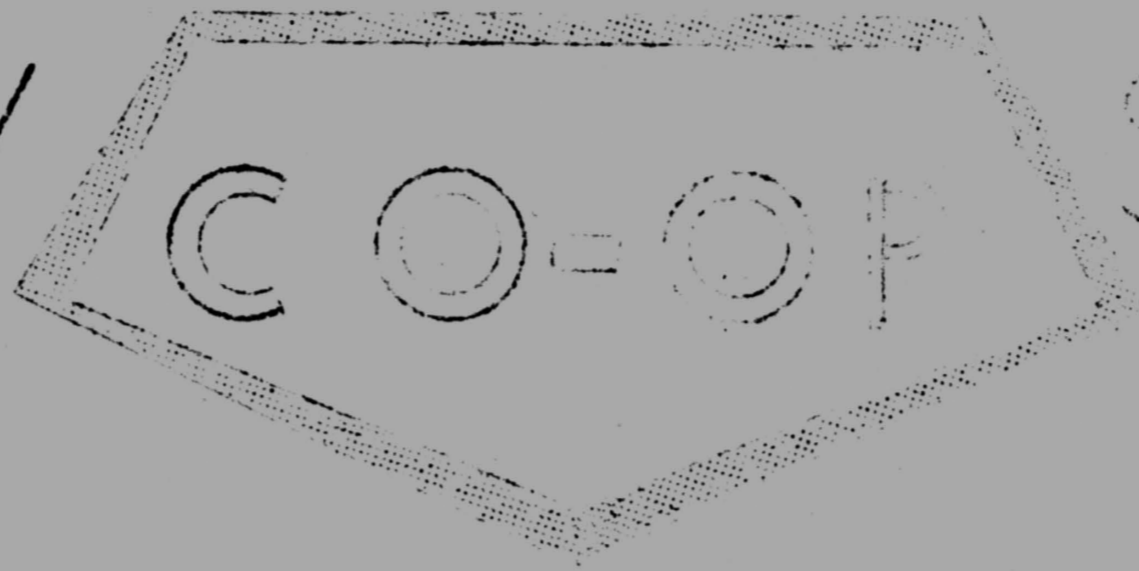

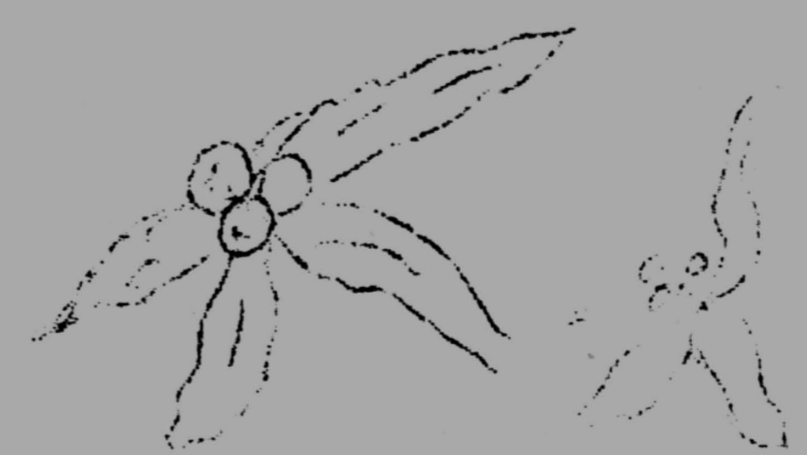


