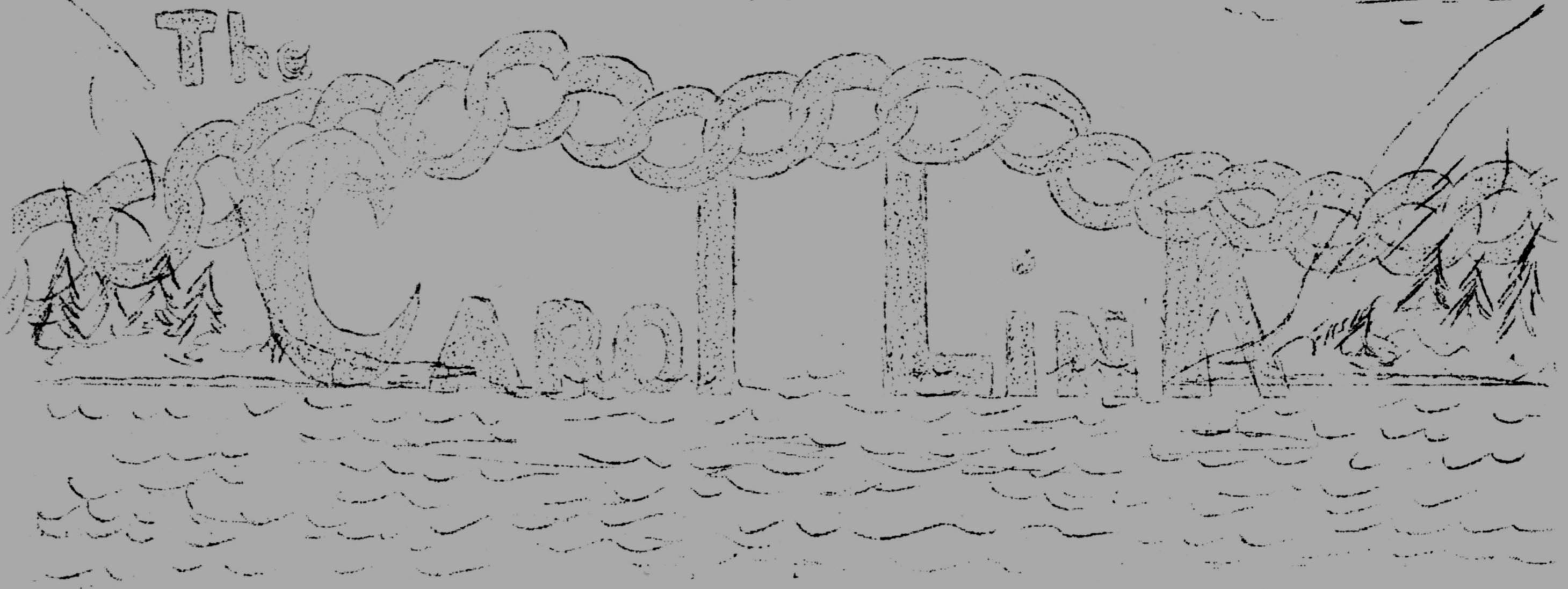

PRESS RELEASE FROM E.V. KEARLEY, PROGRESSIVE CONSERVATIVE REGIONAL VICE-PRESIDENT FOR LABRADOR.

In September of this year, immediately preceding the Provincial Election, Premier Smallwood announced that the road from the Goose Bay-Happy Valley area to Churchill Falls would be completed before Christmas, and would be taken over and kept open by the Provincial Department of Highways throughout this winter. This road would complete an all weather surface route from Lake Melville to the rail-head at Esker, and would provide an alternate to the sea route for shipping freight into the Goose Bay Area, particularly during the winter freeze up period.

In actual fact, the Churchill Falls-Goose Bay road was completed by Churchill Falls Power interests in late Autumn. No attempt has been made however, and none is apparently intended, by the Provincial Government, to keep this road open, or otherwise maintain it. It is obvious that keeping this road open, and making it available to the people of the Goose Bay area, was just another cynical promise made by the Smallwood Government in an attempt to buy votes in the last Election.

This so far unfulfilled promise, however, helped the present Minister of Labrador Affairs, Melvin Woodward, in his election on the Liberal slate in Labrador North. We therefore call upon Mr. Woodward to explain what steps his Government intends to take to maintain this vital road link, and keep it open, through this and succeeding winters, as was recently promised by his Government leader. This road link is far too vital to the well-being of the people of Labrador North to be treated as an election joke, which is all the Smallwood administration obviously intended it to be.

It is now possible to bring bulk freight at competitive rates into the Churchill Falls area, by rail and road, during all seasons of the year. Perhaps Premier Smallwood, as one of his last acts as Government leader, will arrange that this privilege be extended to the Goose Bay-Happy Valley area, as this year's Christmas present to the people there, for their unfailing support in past Provincial elections.

CANADIAN LAWN TENNIS ASSOCIATION

OTTAWA - Richard Legendre of Quebec City and John Turner of London, Ontario, have been named by the Canadian Lawn Tennis Association to represent Canada in the forthcoming Orange Bowl Junior Tennis Championships and the Sunshine Cup International team matches at Miami Beach, Florida, during late December and early January.

Legendre, reigning Canadian Junior Champion, attends Florida State University at Tallahassee, where he plays number three on the varsity tennis team rated number sixteen in the nation by the National Collegiate A.A. as the result of their having won eighteen of twenty-one inter-collegiate contests. Rejean Genois of Quebec City plays number four on the team.

Turner, co-holder of the Canadian Boys 18 Doubles crown with Steve Whitehead of St. Catherines, Ontario, is a student at Cumberland College, Kentucky.

The Orange Bowl Junior Championships will be played on the tennis courts in Flamingo Park, Miami Beach, and will start on Wednesday, December 22. To say that the entry will be strong is to put it mildly as leading players from scores of nations have filed entry. Dale Lewis of the University of Miami will be in charge of play.

The Sunshine Cup Matches, between nations, will be held at Miami Beach Florida, commencing Wednesday, December 29th, and Canada will be represented by the junior team of Legendre and Turner. Teams representing as many as sixty nations have competed in the contests and such strong tennis countries as Australia, England, Spain, France and Mexico have been represented.

The Canadians during the period of their stay in Florida will be entertained in private homes.

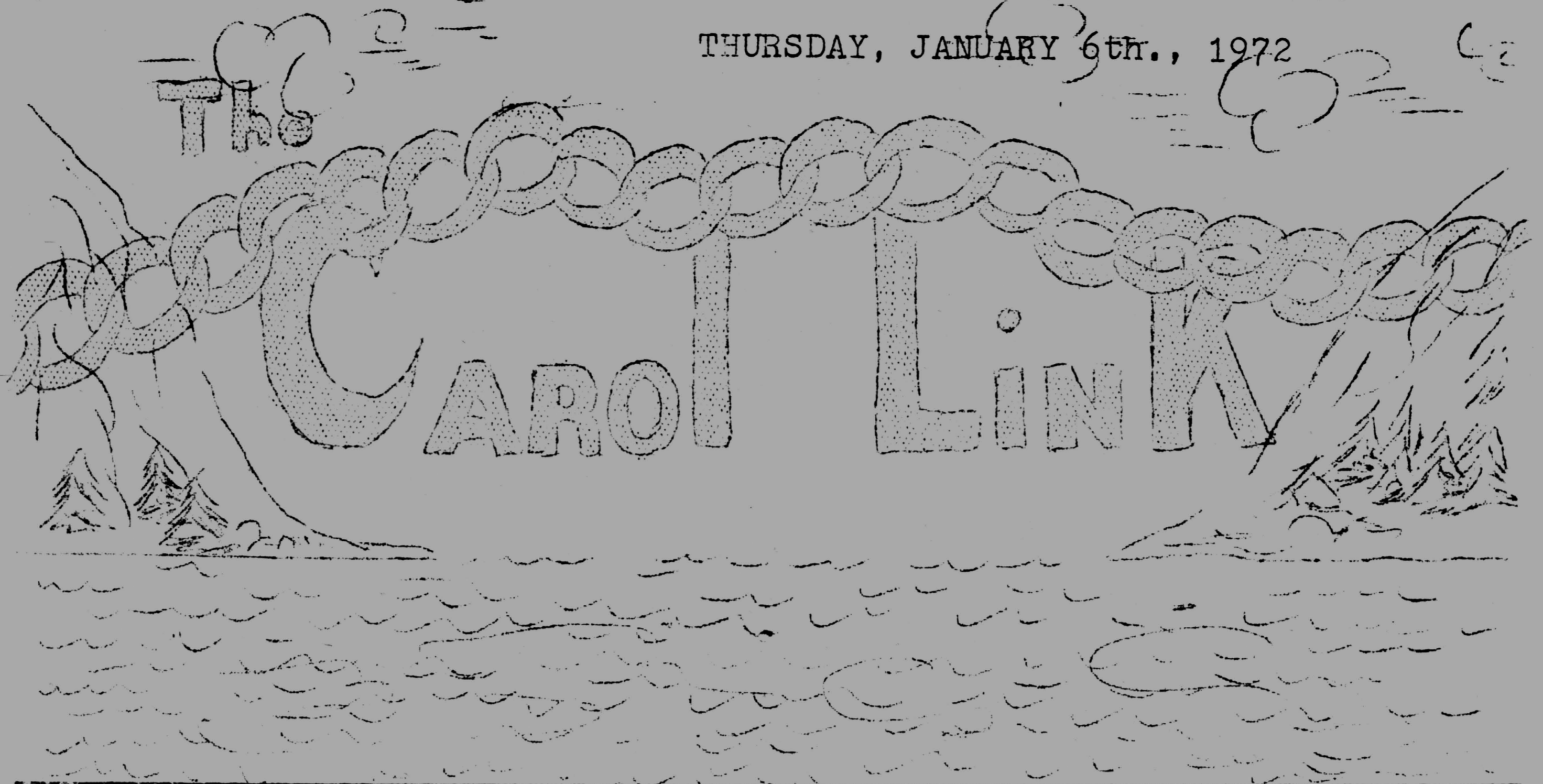

Suggested Scripture Reading: John 14:1-12
 ... I am the way. John 14:6

Jesus said "I am." Again and again He used this expression. "I am" is one of the names for God. When Moses asked the Lord what to answer the children of Israel when they should ask him "Who sent you?" the Lord replied, "Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, 'I am' hath sent me unto you" (Ex. 3:14). God is the eternal One. He did not say to Moses "I was" or "I will be", but "I am." God has no past and no future, but He lives in the eternal present. Jesus asserts that He is God by taking upon Himself this name, "I am." He said, "I am" the Bread of life, the good shepherd, the light of the world, the Door of the sheep, etc.

In John 8:58 He said of Himself, "Before Abraham was, I am." The pharisees knew the meaning of the name and accused Jesus of blasphemy and "Took up stones to cast at Him."
