ONCE AGAIN THE FESTIVE SEASON HAS COME TO PASS WITH ALL IT'S PRESENTS, PARTIES AND ACCIDENTS. THESE PAST HOLIDAYS HAVE PROVEN NO EXCEPTION. THE LINK VISITED THE OFFICE OF OUR LOCAL RCMP TO GET A SUMMARY OF THE ACCIDENTS WHICH HAPPENED OVER THE CHRISTMAS - NEW YEAR'S HOLIDAYS.

LABRADOR CITY HAS BEEN THE SCENE OF 19 ACCIDENTS WHICH TOTALED \$10,800.00 IN PERSONAL PROPERTY DAMAGE. THERE HAVE BEEN COUNTLESS OTHER ACCIDENTS WHERE THE PROPERTY DAMAGE HAS BEEN UNDER \$200.00 OR THE ACCIDENT HAS NOT BEEN REPORTED TO THE POLICE. TWO CHARGES OF IMPAIRED DRIVING AND TWO CHARGES OF LEAVING THE SCENE OF AN ACCIDENT HAVE ALSO BEEN LAID.

THERE HAVE BEEN THREE COMMON MOTOR VEHICLE OFFENCES ON WHICH CHARGES HAVE BEEN LAID: BACKING WHEN UNSAFE TO DO SO; FOLLOWING TOO CLOSE; AND APPROACHING AN INTERSECTION AT UNSAFE SPEED.

MOST OF THESE ACCIDENTS CAN BE AVOIDED BY MAKING SURE THAT ALL THE WINDOWS ARE CLEAR OF SNOW AND ICE AND BY PRACTICING SAFE AND DEFENSIVE DRIVING AT ALL TIMES.

ALTHOUGH OUR DRIVING CONDITIONS ARE EXTREME, THERE IS STILL NO REASON FOR THE HIGH PERCENTAGE OF ACCIDENTS WHICH DO OCCUR. LET'S ALL TRY IN 1972 TO SHOW A LITTLE MORE CAUTION, A LITTLE MORE COURTESY AND HOPEFULLY NEXT YEAR CHRISTMAS WILL BE JUST THAT LITTLE MORE MERRIER.

Suggested Scripture Reading:  
Hebrews 13: 1-14

Set your affection on things above. Colossians 3:2.

Someone asked a Scotchman: "Are you on your way to heaven?" He replied: "Why man, I live there." What he meant was, he was only a pilgrim here. Heaven was his home. Over the door of his shop, which was on the ground floor, the words are written: "Residence above." We too, should work below, but live above. "Here we have no continuing city, but we seek one to come" Hebrew 13:14. "Our citizenship is in heaven; from whence also we look for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" (Phil. 3:20).

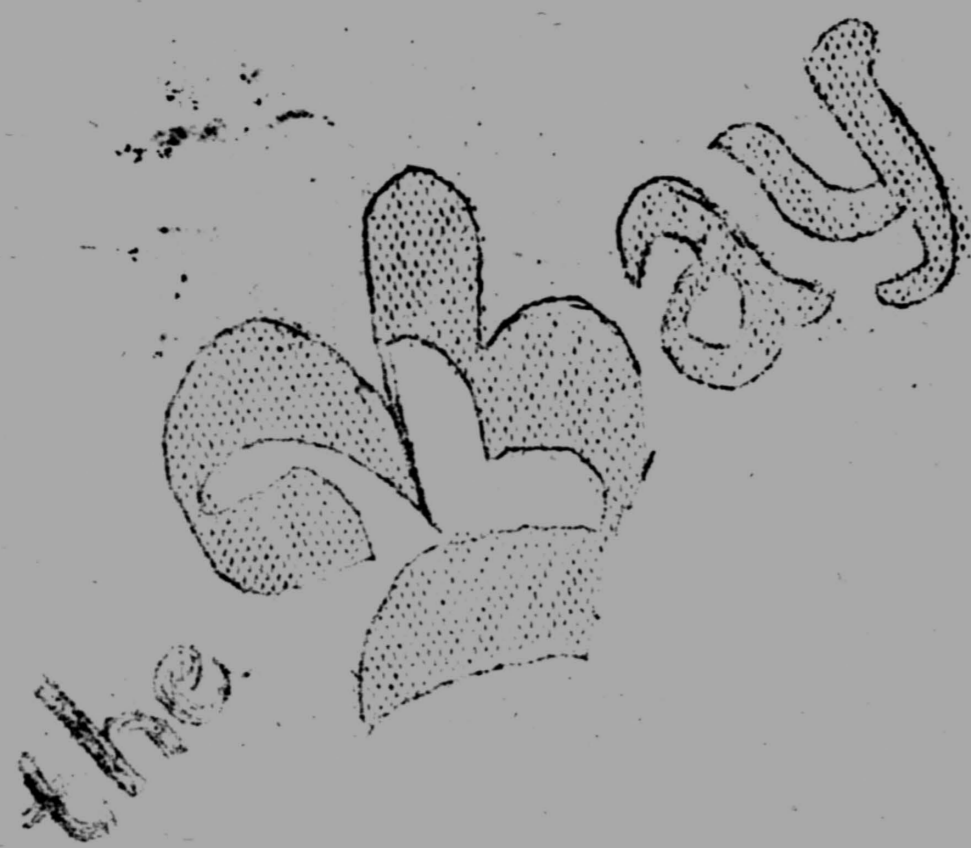

PRESS RELEASE FROM EV KEARLEY,  
PROGRESSIVE CONSERVATIVE REGIONAL VICE-PRESIDENT  
FOR LABRADOR

The recent announcement made by the Minister of Labrador Affairs Melvin Woodward, that the provincial Government is negotiating a cost sharing program with the Federal Government for a trans-Labrador Highway, sounds suspiciously like a replay of the same statement made by Premier Smallwood some years ago. That statement was also made shortly before an impending Provincial Election, and was calculated to give the people of Labrador the impression that a start on the highway was just around the corner, but couldn't quite make it for election day.

Since Premier Smallwood's earlier announcement, virtually nothing has been done by the Provincial Government to improve the road situation in Labrador. There has also been little evidence of any Federal Government studies or surveys for a road system for this region. We wonder how current are the "negotiations" between the two Governments, of which Mr. Woodward speaks, and how many trips to Ottawa has he and the preceding Minister made in pursuing these negotiations.

It is unlikely that the present Provincial Government could afford to participate in a Trans Labrador Highway program, even to the limited extent suggested in the scheme outlined by Mr. Woodward. The Liberal Government of this Province has always been able to find millions to finance its wildest schemes, but very little to devote to improving the lot of the people of Labrador. This is witnessed by the failure of the present Liberal Government to keep open even the vital road link from Goose Bay to Churchill Falls this winter, although this was promised by Premier Smallwood shortly before the recent Provincial Election.

A regional highways policy for Labrador, with a large amount of Federal Government assistance, is very essential to the development of Labrador, and to the well-being of the people living here. We suggest to Mr. Woodward, however, that this goal will not likely be achieved by an announcement before every Provincial Election, and complete inaction and indifference for the remainder of the time.

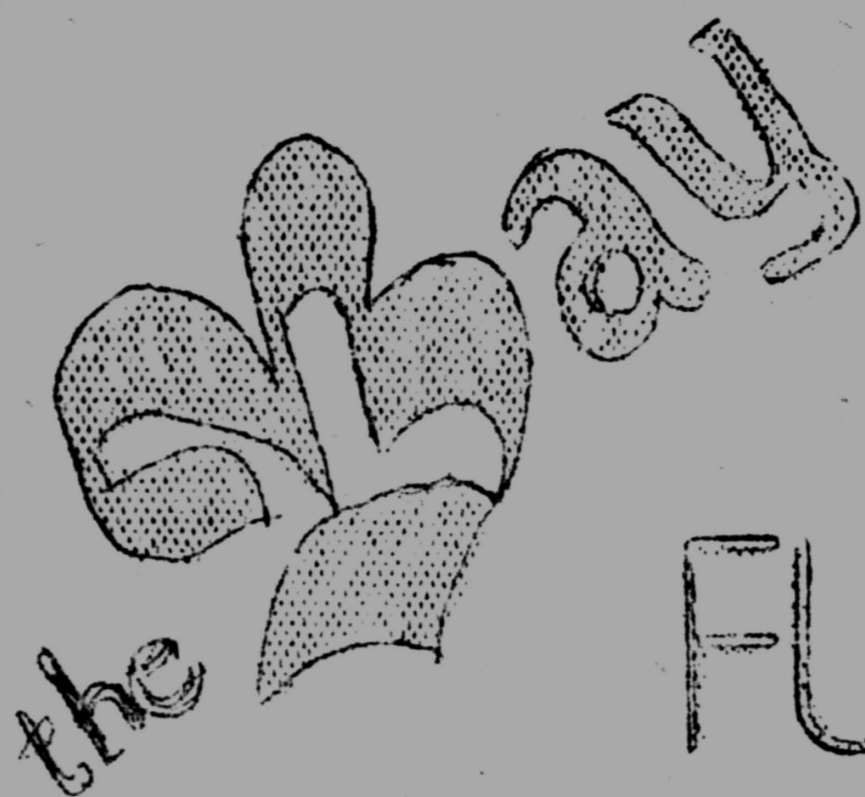
