EDITORIAL

Last week - January 12th., marked the opening of the Fourth Session of the Thirty-third General Assembly of the Province of Newfoundland. Among the many items of interest in the "Speech from the Throne" was one of more or less direct interest to the residents of this area. This was the creation of a new department of Labrador Affairs. This department, the Lieutenant-Governor said, will be charged with the duty of promoting and assisting in every appropriate way the speedy development of Labrador, both as to natural resources and public and social conveniences.

Perhaps the proposed new Public Building will be the start of better things for Labrador and Wabush residents. Those of us who have known the frustration of having to write to St. John's for information on any matter pertaining to Provincial Affairs, will more than welcome the offices and their staff who can handle these problems locally.

The year 1966 should certainly see many improvements. We have seen that 1965 was a year of progress. We saw the opening of the \$5,000,000 hospital, the shopping centre addition, the Curling Club, and the Arena with seating capacity of 1,100 and last but not least, the Television Station.

It is interesting to note that the population in our Town, has grown from 1,000 people in 1961 to about 7,500 at the present time.

Who knows, perhaps in the near future, we can watch with joy, a road being built which will link us to the Outside World, and thus ease the problem of isolation.
