I welcome this opportunity to speak to you through the "Carol News" and am most thankful to the editor for this invitation to share some thoughts about Lent and Easter with you!

Lent is a very old practice within the Christian Church, because from earliest times a fast was observed before Easter! There are differences of opinion as to the length of this fast, but from the fourth century, a forty day fast appears to have been commonly observed. Some of the reasons for this Lenten fast were:

1. The sorrow of Christians for the loss of their Master.
2. It was a time of preparation for those intending to become members of the Church.
3. Penitents prepared for absolution.
4. Communicants prepared to receive the Holy Communion at Easter.

These are evidences of the need, which the Church saw to set aside a time for it's members "to retire to the wilderness with Jesus, for fasting and communion with God"

Lent with it's characteristics of bodily and spiritual discipline had its beginnings in a time when people's thoughts about the world and the aim and meaning of life were very different from what they are today. We are all very well aware that we live in a world vastly different from what it was, even twenty years ago. However dare we say that we do not have the basic desires, needs and hopes which humans have always had, and seemingly will always have?

Simply because, we are that much busier with all that life demands of us, in this twentieth century, this is all the more reason we should discipline ourselves physically and spiritually. I'm sure no business man would say "My firm is too busy to 'take stock' of its supplies any more". He has to do this to find out where he is and where he is heading in his business.

Each person should do this from time to time. The Church has provided this time for her members by observing the Lenten Season. We 'take stock' of ourselves in the light of what Jesus was and did for us on Calvary. What was difficult for him, cannot be easy for us and we should not expect it to be so. During the next week - Holy Week, Scripture guides us through the Passion stories to the great event of Good Friday. Great and Good because we look forward to "newness of life" on EASTER DAY.

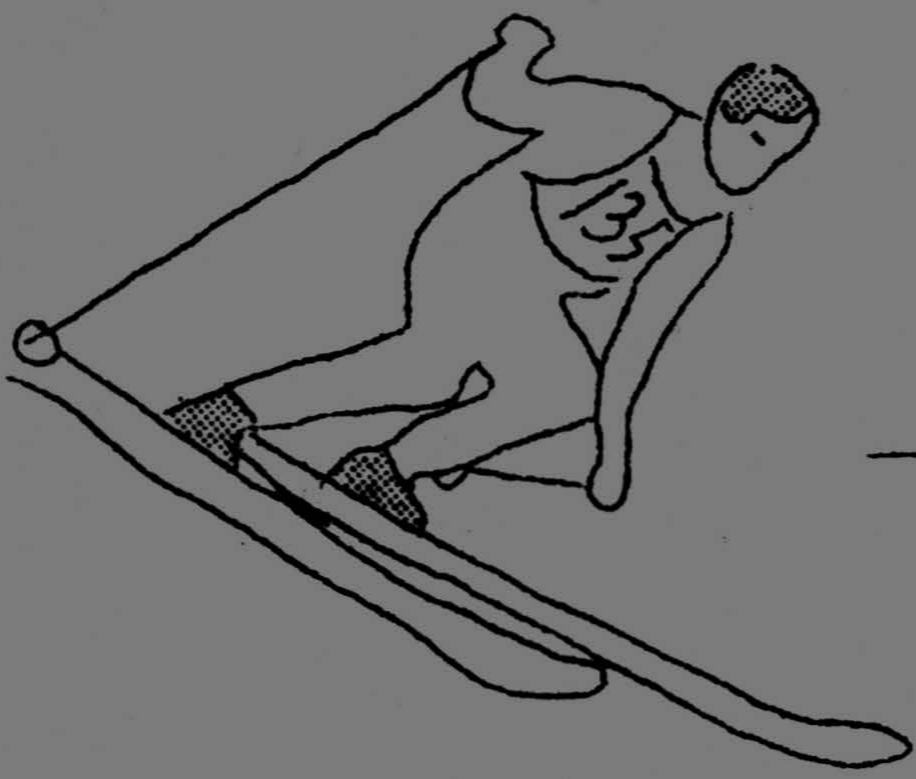

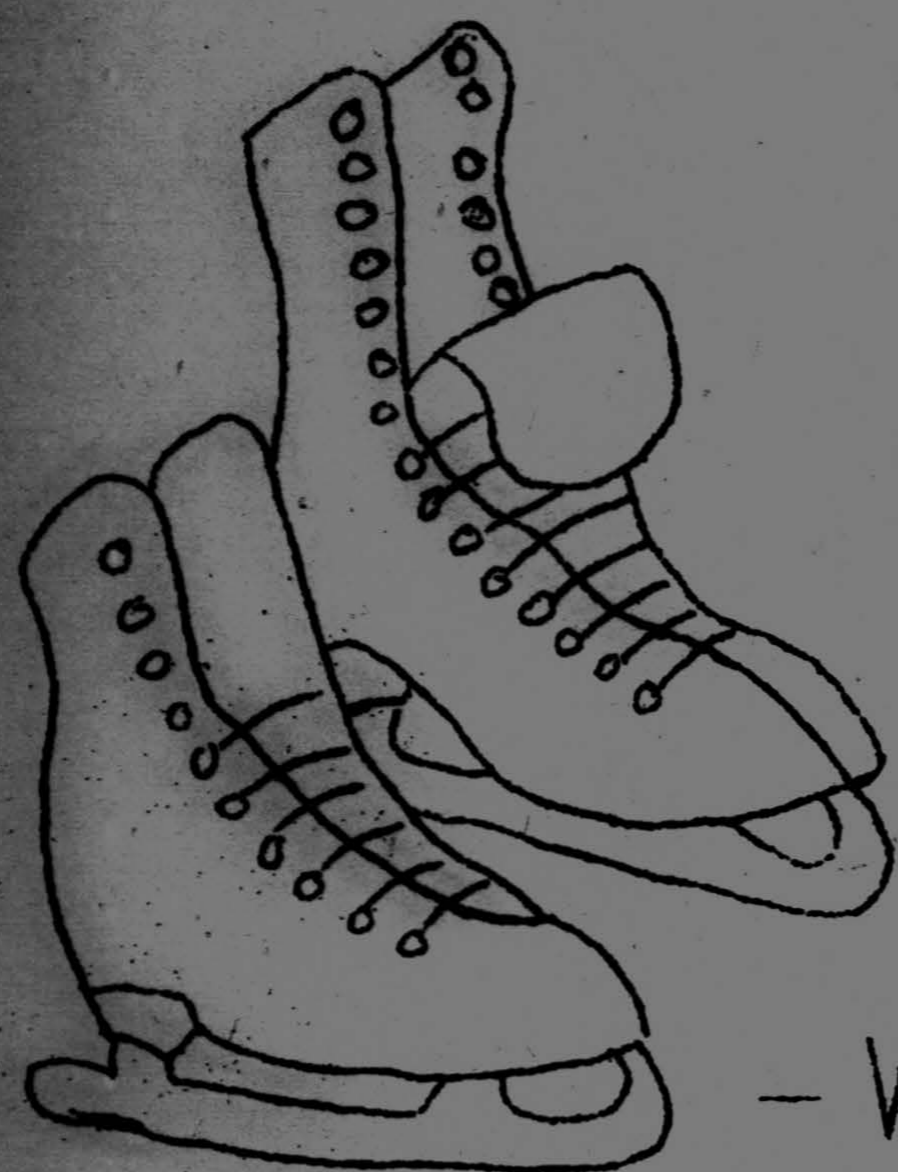
