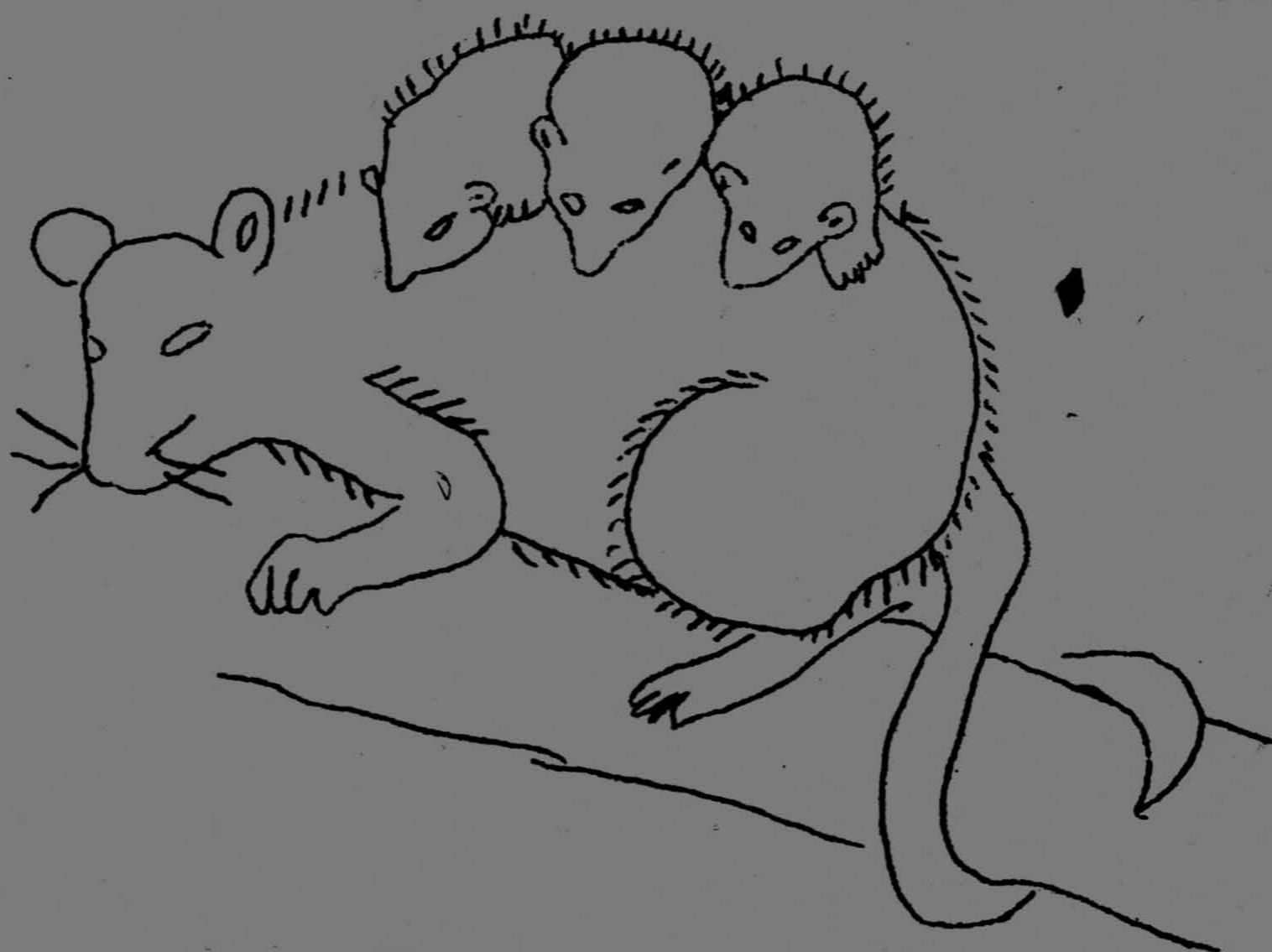
Nice to see little Lori Yates walking out with Mommy after her stay in Montreal Hospital.

A young man resident of Labrador City, was convicted of causing a disturbance at the Teen Club and placed on suspended sentence for 1 year and ordered to sign a bond of \$100.00

Another young man was convicted of a similar offence and given similar sentence.

The Magistrate has expressed deep concern over the conduct of persons frequenting the Teen Club. Evidence has shown that drunkenness is altogether too frequent for this type of establishment and he has ordered an investigation into the operation of the organization.

A Resident of Labrador City was convicted of theft and given suspended sentence for 2 years and ordered to sign a bond of \$500.00

A large number of traffic offences were disposed of, and the usual fines were imposed.

An employee of Bowings was convicted of theft, and fined \$150.00 or 3 months imprisonment. In this instant, evidence showed that a fair amount of theft has been going on.

Two residents of Wabush were convicted of causing a disturbance in the Sir Wilfred Grenville Hotel and were fined \$50.00 or 30 days.

Another man was convicted of the same offence, but appearing at the E. P.A. terminal. In this case the mans conduct was atrocious and he was fined \$160.00 or 60 days.

Another Wabush man was convicted of seven charges of forgery and fined \$50.00 or 30 days on each charge for a total of \$350.00 or seven months.

A number of prosecutions under the Local Dog Regulations were heard and fines of \$5.00 imposed.

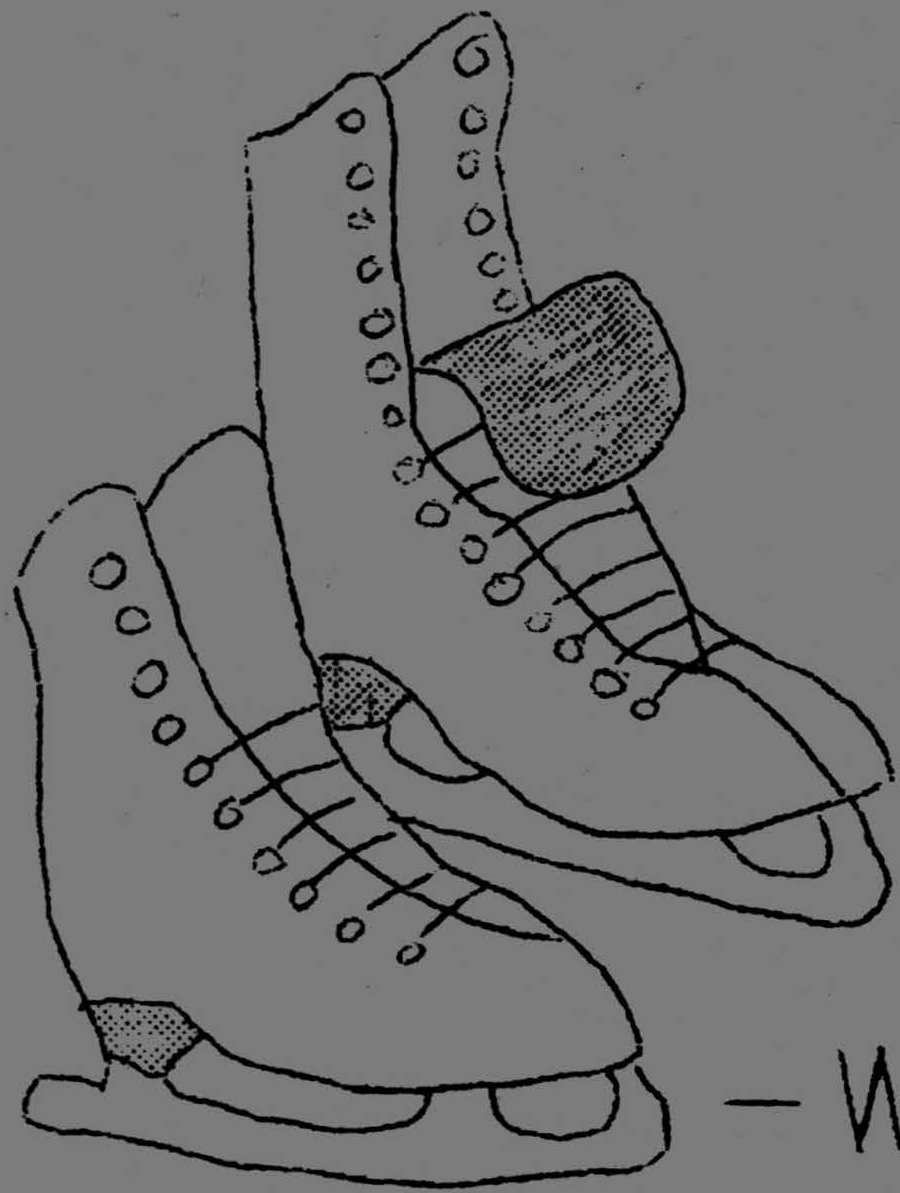

This will be an exciting doubleheader. Local hockey fans are aware of the excellent hockey being played in both Schefferville and on the East coast of Labrador. Labrador City Collegiate will be out to preserve their record of never having been beaten by a High School Team.

On Saturday, April 16th, a four team Hockey Tournament will be held with Northwest River High School, Smallwood Collegiate, Labrador City Collegiate, and the "TEACHERS" taking part! This will be a double knockout tournament which will see three games being played in the morning session 8.00 - 11.30, and three, possibly four, in the afternoon session from 1.30 - 5.30.
