LABRADOR CITY BY-LAWS

For the benefit of all residents the following regulations are enforced in Labrador City:

- Traffic and Parking:
Special limit 20 miles per hour.
Parking as permitted by signs, no overnight parking.
No parking on sidewalks.
- Garbage:
Garbage placed in cans or plastic bags - not paper bags
Garbage cans, when empty, removed from side of street.
Garbage to be placed on side of road only on day of pick up.
- Fences:
Fences are not to be erected without permission.
- Buildings:
Addition to buildings or erection of any type of structure requires permission of council.
- Dogs:
All dogs must be licensed and cannot run loose.
- Anti-Litter:
Includes abandoned or wrecked vehicles.
- Hawkers & Peddlers:
All persons selling from door to door in Labrador City must have a license.
- Signs:
Signs cannot be erected without permission.

The above and some of the main clauses from each regulation, or a complete copy, can be obtained at the Town Hall.

A resident of Wabush was charged with two breaches of the Alcoholic Act. One being in a tavern under the age of 21, and secondly, taking beer out of the tavern. He was fined \$25.00 or 14 days on each charge.

Another resident of Wabush was convicted of being drunk in a Public Place and was fined \$20.00 or 14 days and was enderdicted for a period of 6 months.

A man was charged with Vagrancy and sentenced to 14 days, this being his 2nd offence.

Another man was convicted of impaired driving. He was fined \$75.00 or 7 days, and prohibited from operating a motor vehicle on a Highway in Canada for a period of 6 months.

Another young man was convicted of being in a Tavern while under the required age of 21. He was fined \$20.00 or 14 days.

Two residents were charged with speeding in the Town of Labrador City and each one was fined \$25.00 or 14 days.

A number of Parking offences were dismissed, as these offences occurred in an unfinished area of town, making it extremely difficult for these persons to get their vehicles off the street.

A young man, employed with Bowring Brothers was convicted of theft. As he was only 17 years of age, and being his 1st offence, he was placed on suspended sentence for 2 years and ordered to pay Bowrings compensation and to sign a Bond of \$200. and report to a Probation Officer when required.

A resident of Wabush was convicted of possession of stolen goods and placed on suspended sentence for 2 years. He was ordered to sign a \$200.00 Bond and abstain from alcohol.

The same man was charged with taking a vehicle without the owners consent, and had this case postponed for judgement.

Another young man was charged under the Alcohol Liquor Act, for consuming alcohol on the street. He was fined \$20.00 or 14 days.

Another man was convicted for being in a licensed establishment while under 21 years of age, and as this chap has been before the court on other occasions he was given a stern lecture and fined \$100.00 or 30 days imprisonment.

There were a considerable number of convictions under the Labrador City Dog Regulations - that is for allowing dogs to roam at large uncontrolled. Fines were imposed of \$5.00 or 1 day imprisonment.

Also a large number of Traffic Offences were dealt with, and the usual fines imposed.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE DATE FOR THE CONCERT TWO GO DANCING, HAS BEEN CHANGED TO APRIL 28th.

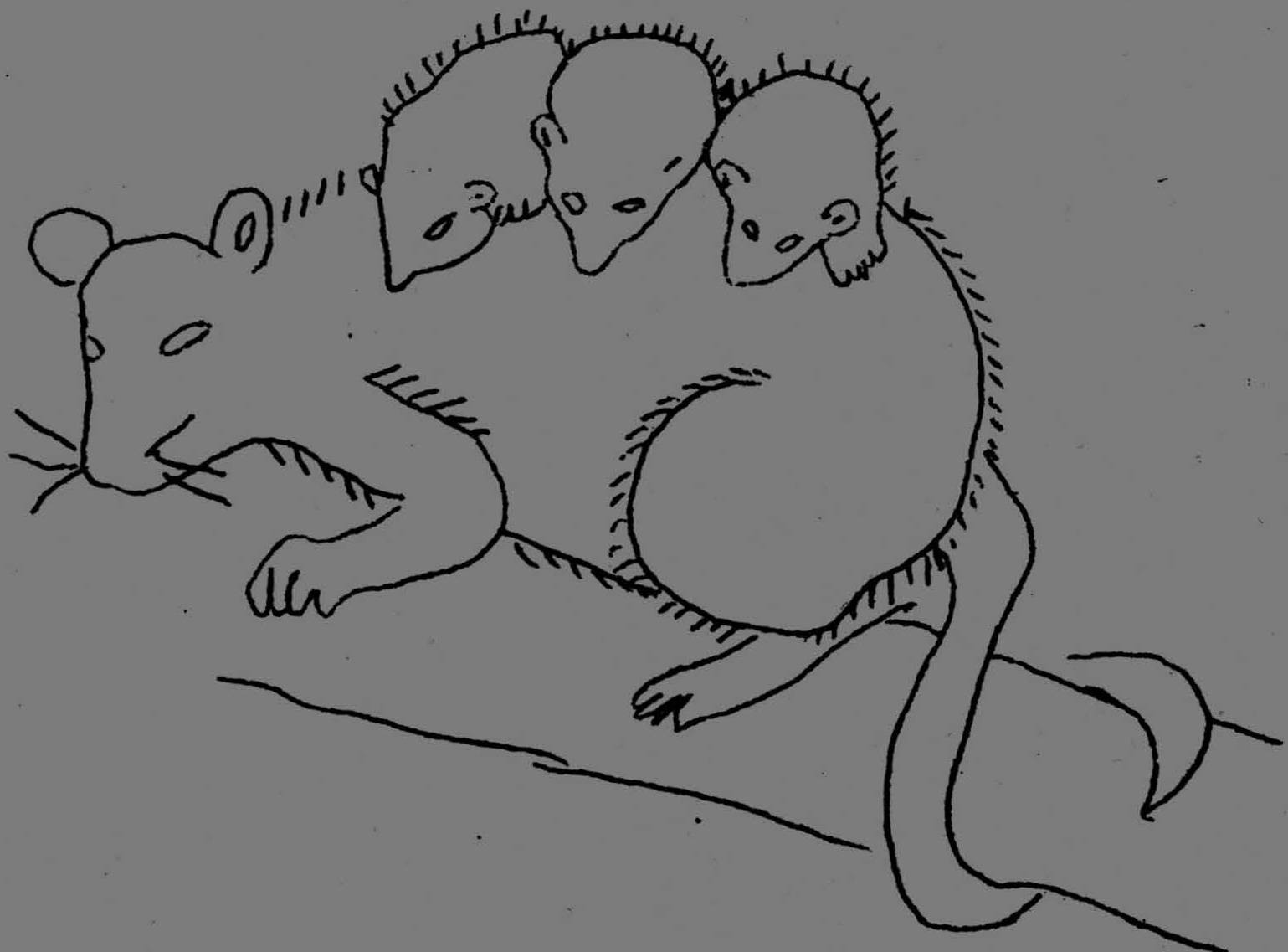

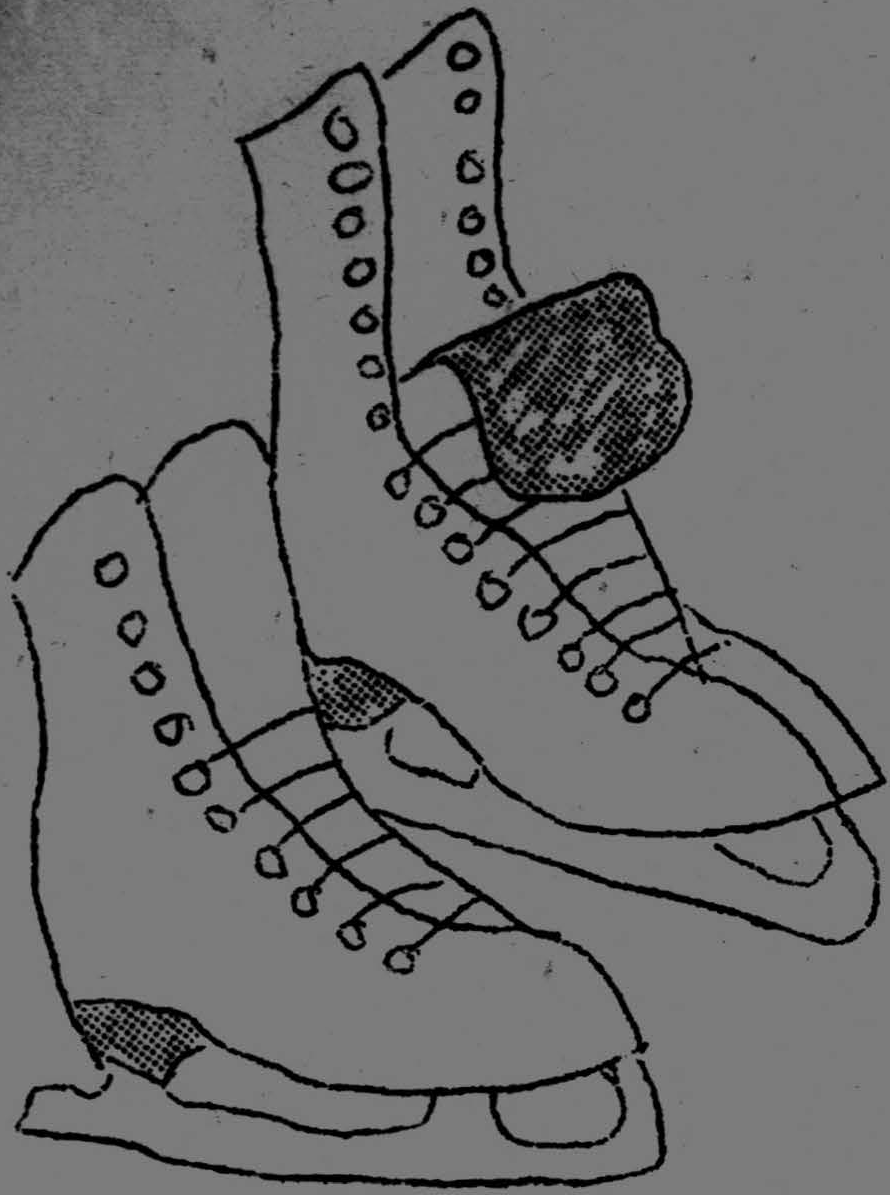
