Welcome to the North to Mrs. Elsie B. Osmond who arrived recently from Embree, Nfld., to take up residence with her son in law in Wabush.

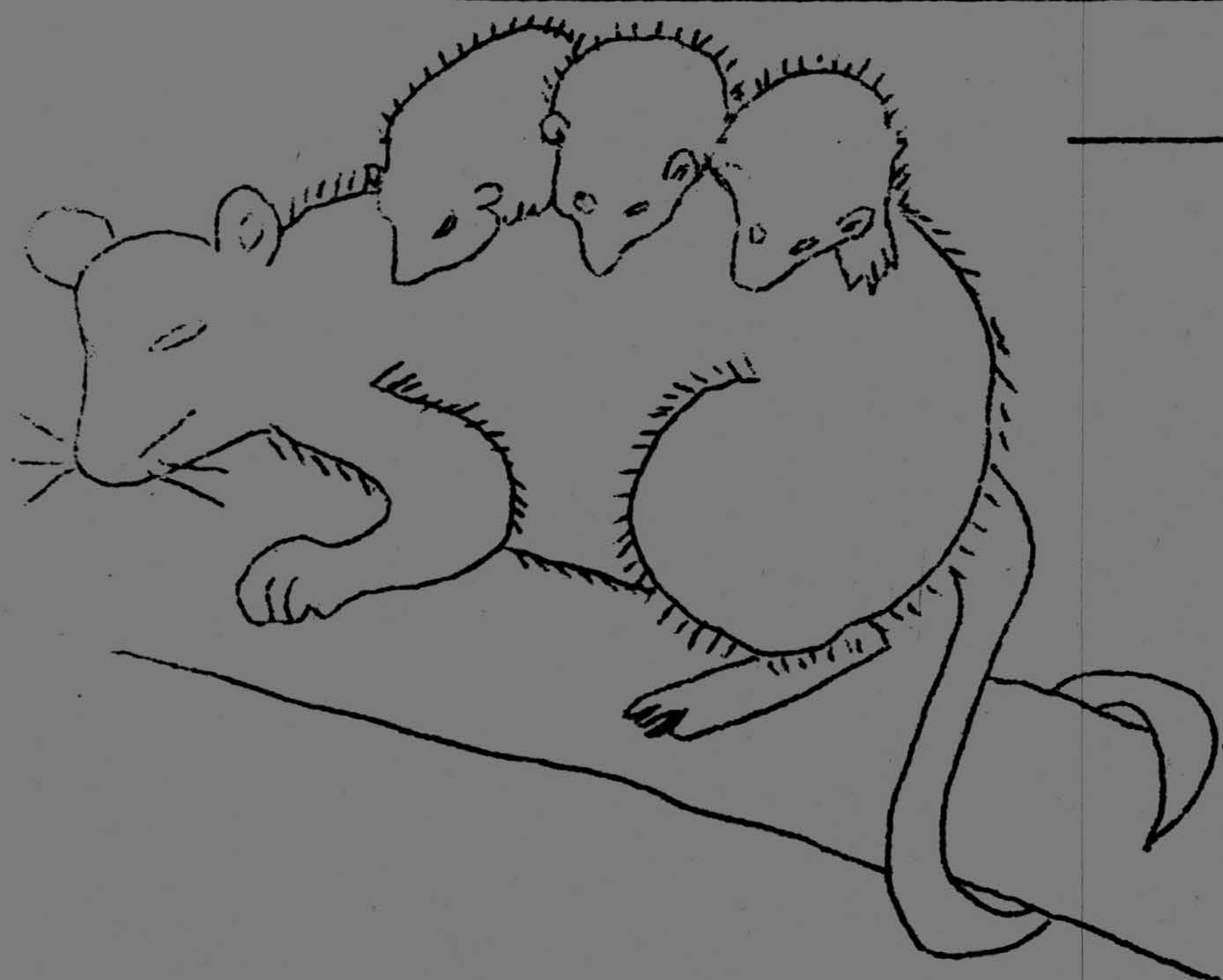
