To-day there is not much we lack to make our town an enjoyable place to live. Our fine new hospital, our three lovely and modern schools, our many shops, our arena, curling club, ski lodge, social clubs and churches. The houses and apartments are still being built, our roads and sidewalks are paved - a far cry from the days of 1960.

However, there is still an important thing many of our families yearn to have. To some it may seem a trivial and unimportant thing, but to others, a real neccessity. The services of a VETERINARIAN.

Whenever a place becomes a community of families, wives and children, so then it will have pets - in the main, dogs and cats. It has been heard many times, the wish for a vet. to treat my sick dog, to give my puppy his needles against distemper and rabies, and last but not in the least, to have my dog or my cat spayed. This is growing to be a real problem. In one social gathering five mothers mentioned the fact that each being a dog owner, they had a total of 27 puppies in their homes. Out of those 27 puppies, perhaps 15 will in turn have 45 puppies - need I go on?

Couldn't Labrador City and Wabush have a visiting Veterinarian come to our area periodically? Perhaps every 3 or 4 months for a week or two at a time. If anyone reading this editorial, has any ideas on how this could be achieved, there would indeed, be many grateful people AND ANIMALS!
