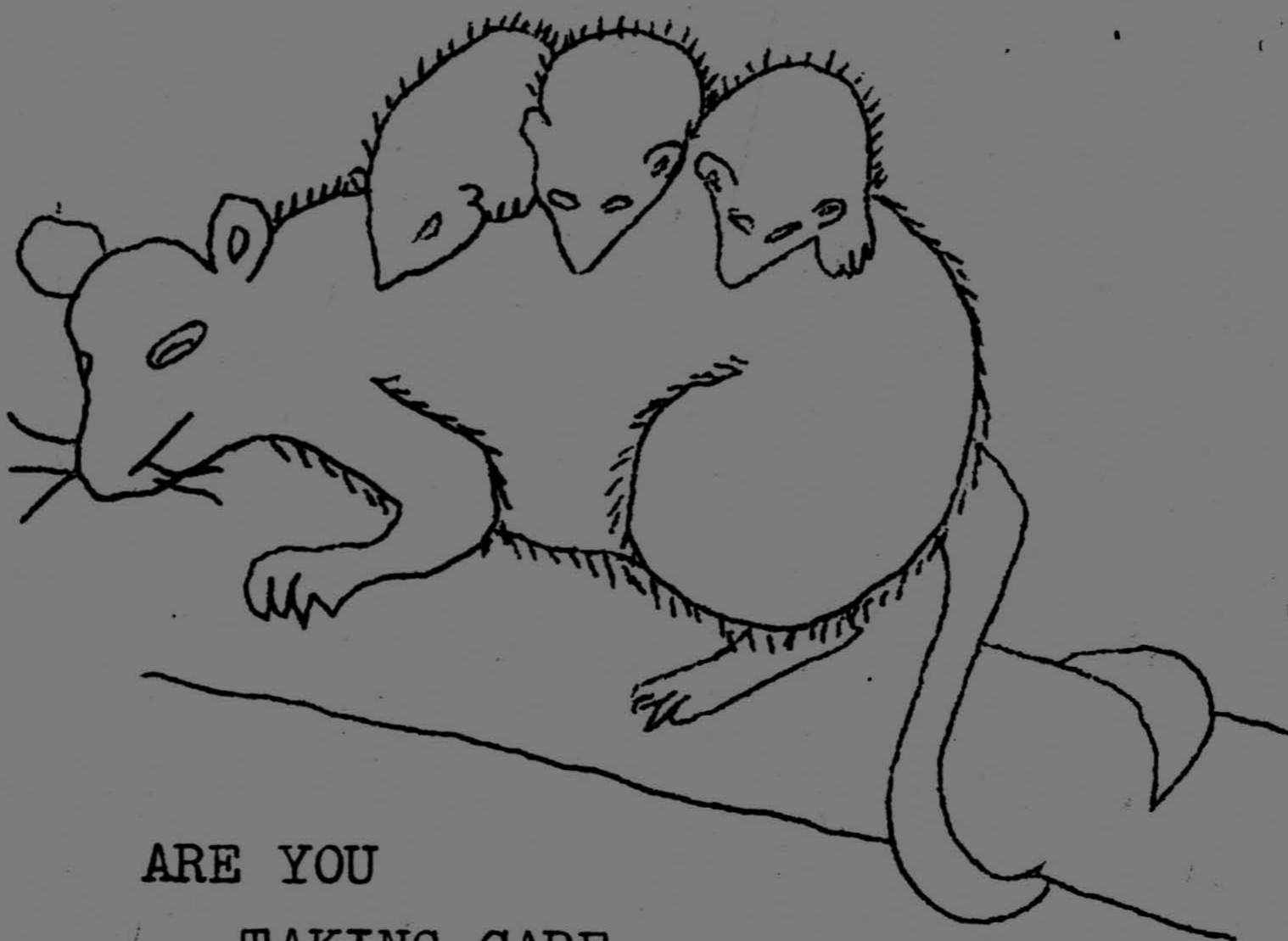

A man from Wabush was convicted of a Breach of the Alcoholic Liquor Act - that of failure to declare Alcoholic Liquor in his possession and was fined \$100. or 30 days.

Another young man from Wabush was convicted for driving while disqualified. This man had a previous record of convictions for this type of offence and was fined \$200. or 3 months imprisonment

A resident of Wabush was charged with failure to remain at the scene of an accident and was fined \$100. or 7 days, and prohibited from operating a motor vehicle on a highway in Canada for 6 months. The same man was convicted for driving without a drivers licence.

Another man was convicted of theft of a Motor Vehicle and was Fined \$100. or 14 days and ordered to pay compensation to owner for damages.

A man from Labrador City was convicted of failure to remain at the scene of an accident, and was fined \$100. or 14 days and ordered to pay compensation to owner, and had his driving privileges revoked for a period of 6 months.

Three young men from Wabush were convicted of theft. The evidence showed that these persons were selling items which was property of their employer - Ayre's Ltd., and pocketing the money. They were all placed on 2 years suspended sentence and ordered to sign Bonds of \$500. each, and to pay compensation to Ayres Ltd

Two young men were convicted of taking a motor vehicle without the consent of owner and were Fined \$100. or 30 days each and ordered to pay compensation to owner G. M. Guest Ltd.

A young man of Quebec, was convicted of vagrancy and was placed on suspended sentence and ordered to sign a Bond of \$100.

A man was charged with causing a disturbance in the Sir Wilfred Grenfell Hotel and was fined \$50. or 30 days. The same man was convicted of being in a Liquor Establishment while under age 21 years and fined an additional \$50. or 30 days for this offence.

Three young men from Labrador City, convicted for removing Alcoholic Liquor from the Ashuanipi Club and were fined \$25. or 14 days each.

A man charged with failure to declare Alcoholic Liquor in his possession was acquitted of the charge.

Two men were convicted for causing a disturbance in the Ashuanipi Lounge during a private party. They were each fined \$100. or 30 days and placed under a \$200. Bond to keep the Peace.

He is a member of the Music faculty of McGill University and a charter member of the National executive of the Canadian Music Educator's Association and a past-president of the Provincial Association of School Music Teachers. Y., and in the fall of 1961 was invited to be the guest conductor of the New York Area All-State High School Band. He spends the early part of each summer conducting and teaching throughout the U.S.A. and Canada. He is a member of the Canadian Festival Adjudicators Association who has adjudicated music festivals on many occasions. As a writer, his published music is performed regularly around the world and in the Spring of 1962, received a grant from the Canada Council for work commissioned by the Montreal Brass Quintet.

Mr. Calvert has been associated with music camps since 1951, and has directed his own camp for the past six years.
