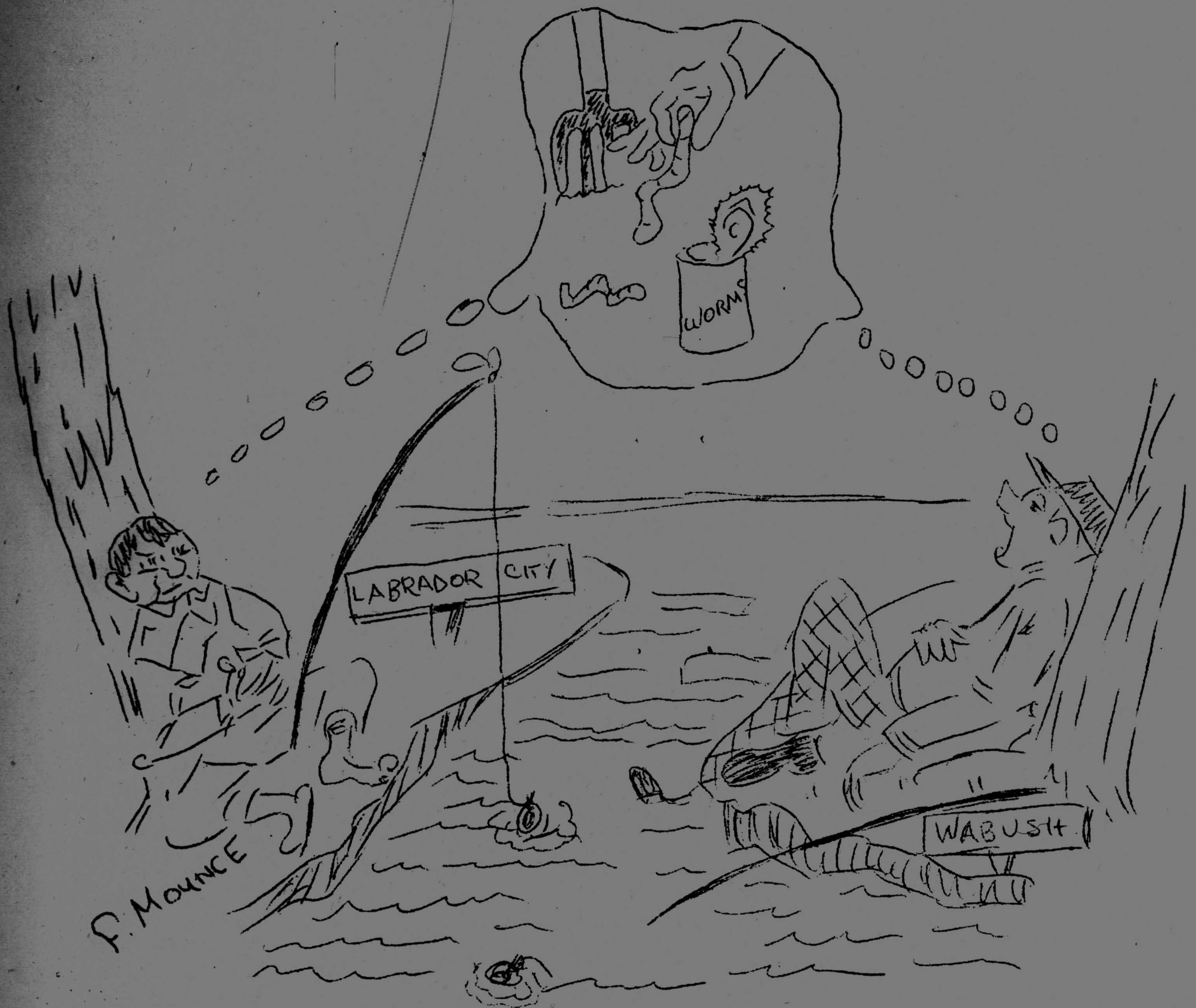

The body of any organization, has four kinds of bones:

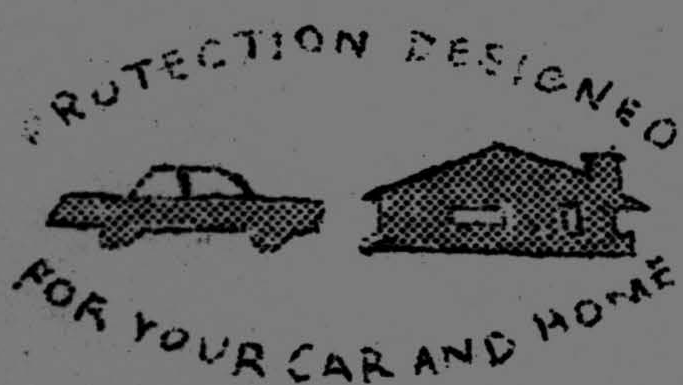
1. There are the wishbones...who spend all their time wishing somebody else would do all the work.
