CAPTAIN WILLIAM JACKMAN - A NEWFOUNDLAND HERO

When our hospital was officially opened last year and was named The Captain William Jackman Memorial Hospital, I'm sure many asked, myself included, "who is he?"

Recently I received a copy of the special "Come Home Year" edition of "Old Time Songs and Poetry of Newfoundland" and scanning through the table of contents this title caught my eye, "Captain William Jackman - A Newfoundland Hero. Turning quickly to the listed page, I found a stirring ballad describing the heroic action for which this man is honoured. A note above the ballad says "This is of particular interest just now as it reminds us of the noble deeds of that great Newfoundlander in whose honour the William Jackman Memorial Hospital was opened recently in Labrador City. A further note says that this ballad was sung by John Noftall, so it was written a long time ago.

Captain Jackman was from Renew's a small village not far south of St. John's. He undoubtedly was among the many people who came to the rugged coast of Labrador each year to fish. The ballad tells of his courageous rescue of twenty eight persons from the wrecked vessel "Sea Clipper" near Spotted Islands on the Labrador coast. Captain Jackman swam from the wreck to the land carrying a person ashore each time. This won a medal from Queen Victoria for him but his health was broken as a result of the strenuous task. That was in 1866, and we thank God for his courage and strength one hundred years later when we behold the very fitting memorial erected to him here.

The Ballad is too long to print here (20 verses) but I have chosen a few verses to give you some clearer picture of the event.

The fierce winds blow among the cliffs of rugged Labrador,
The wild waves dash with thunderous sound
 Against the rock-bound shore.
The snow that dimmed the noonday sun
Fell on the muffled form of one
Who, blessed with manhood's strength,
 Defied the raging storm.

Hark, what's that? A cry for help
Borne on the angry breeze,
That rose above the tempest's din,
 Above the raging seas.
It came from o'er the waste of foam,
That chill despairing cry,
That said appeal to heaven addressed
 Of men about to die.

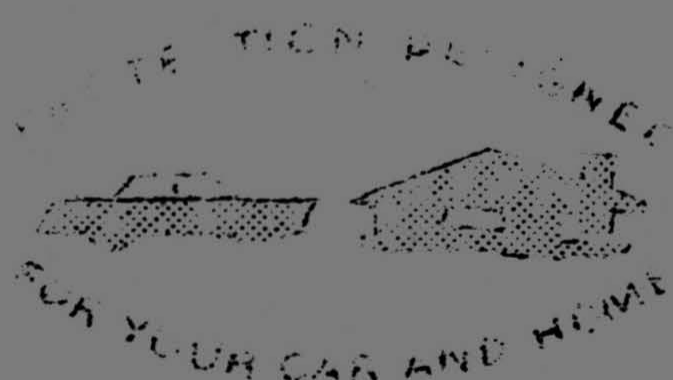

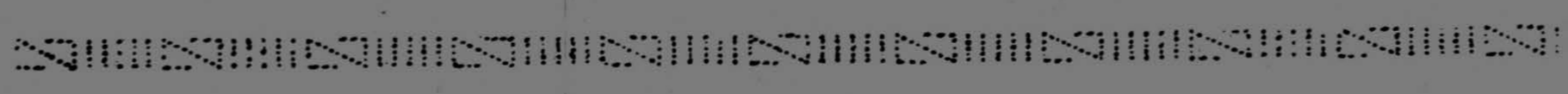

NEWFOUNDLAND FOREST PROTECTION ASSOCIATION

Sixty-two school children in Grades VII, VIII & IX will shortly receive cheques valued at \$25.00 each from the N.F.P.A. as their reward for successfully competing in the Association's Annual School Essay Contest.

A total of \$1,550 was awarded out of a possible \$1,575 in prize money. The Province is divided into a total of 19 zones with one prize in each of the first 18 for Grades VII to IX and three prizes for each of these grades in Zone 19 - St. John's. Almost all grades in the various Zones were well represented by the 461 entries except Grade IX of Zone 16, Humber East, for which there was none.
