For our "Editorial this week we thank Mr. Charles S. Devine M.H.A.

The recent announcement concerning a proposed tunnel under the Straits of Belle Isle linking the island of Newfoundland with the mainland of Labrador and construction of a Trans-Labrador highway, made by the Premier of this province is, to say the least, rather far fetched, it's an interesting pipe dream but certainly not practicable in the foreseeable future. Possibly 15-20 years from now, if Labrador continues to develop and the permanent population increases from the present 20-25,000 to 60-75,000 people, such a project would be reasonable.

If the present administration wishes to assist in the development of Labrador in the immediate future, then I would recommend, as a start, that all present concessions in Labrador not under development revert to the Provincial Government.

It is generally agreed that Labrador consists of three rather distinct areas.

- (1) The Southern Labrador coast, which is essentially a fishing and lumbering area.
- (2) Central Labrador (Happy Valley-Lake Melville) which at the moment is almost completely dependent on the military operations at Goose Bay, but which has the last remaining virgin pulpwood forests in North America.
- (3) Western Labrador with the mining communities of Labrador City-Wabush also Twin Falls and the residents along the Q.N.S. & L. rail line.

A comprehensive transportation system has to start on a local basis and I would here propose that in Labrador it begin as follows, in the areas already mentioned.

- (1) SOUTHERN LABRADOR. During the past ten or twelve years about 50 miles of road have been constructed from Blanc Sablon to Red Bay. I advocate construction, but at a more rapid pace, to connect up the larger communities on the coast.

PHASE ONE: To provide a road link to the Bowaters pulpwood operation in the Alexis Bay-Port Hope Simpson Area.

PHASE TWO: To continue on to the Sandwich Bay-Cartwright area.

- (2) CENTRAL LABRADOR. How was the Canadian & U.S. West developed? How was Schefferville, Nfld. or Grand Falls, Nfld. or Labrador City-Wabush developed? BY RAIL. Not by roads going hundreds of miles to nowhere. This in my opinion is the only way the big natural resource of excellent Black Spruce along the Hamilton River Valley and Lake Melville can be developed for the benefit of those residing in Goose Bay-Happy Valley-North West River. The Canadian National Railways, has in recent years, in conjunction with resource development companies, built hundreds of miles of rail lines. If arrangements could be made with C.N.R. I feel sure that several reputable paper companies would be interested in building mills in this area. The logical terminal point would be Seven Islands, Nfld.; which is practically a year round shipping port. Of course the cost would be high but it is the only feasible way to open up Central Labrador.
- (3) WESTERN LABRADOR. It is my understanding the Federal Government will pay all construction costs and 85% of maintenance costs of roads that join established resource areas. I have previously asked the question; "WHY CANNOT QUEBEC AND NFLD. GET TOGETHER WITH THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT WHO WOULD BUILD A ROAD FROM LABRADOR CITY-WABUSH TO GAGNONVILLE? Only this month I found the answer. NEITHER QUEBEC OR NEWFOUNDLAND HAS ASKED OTTAWA TO DO SO. Just imagine WE ARE BEING DEPRIVED OF A 90 MILE MOTORABLE ROAD BECAUSE QUEBEC CITY OR ST. JOHN'S WILL NOT MAKE A FORMAL REQUEST FOR CONSTRUCTION TO THE FEDERAL AUTHORITIES"

The three plans outlined above do, I believe, provide a sound basis for the overall development of Labrador.
