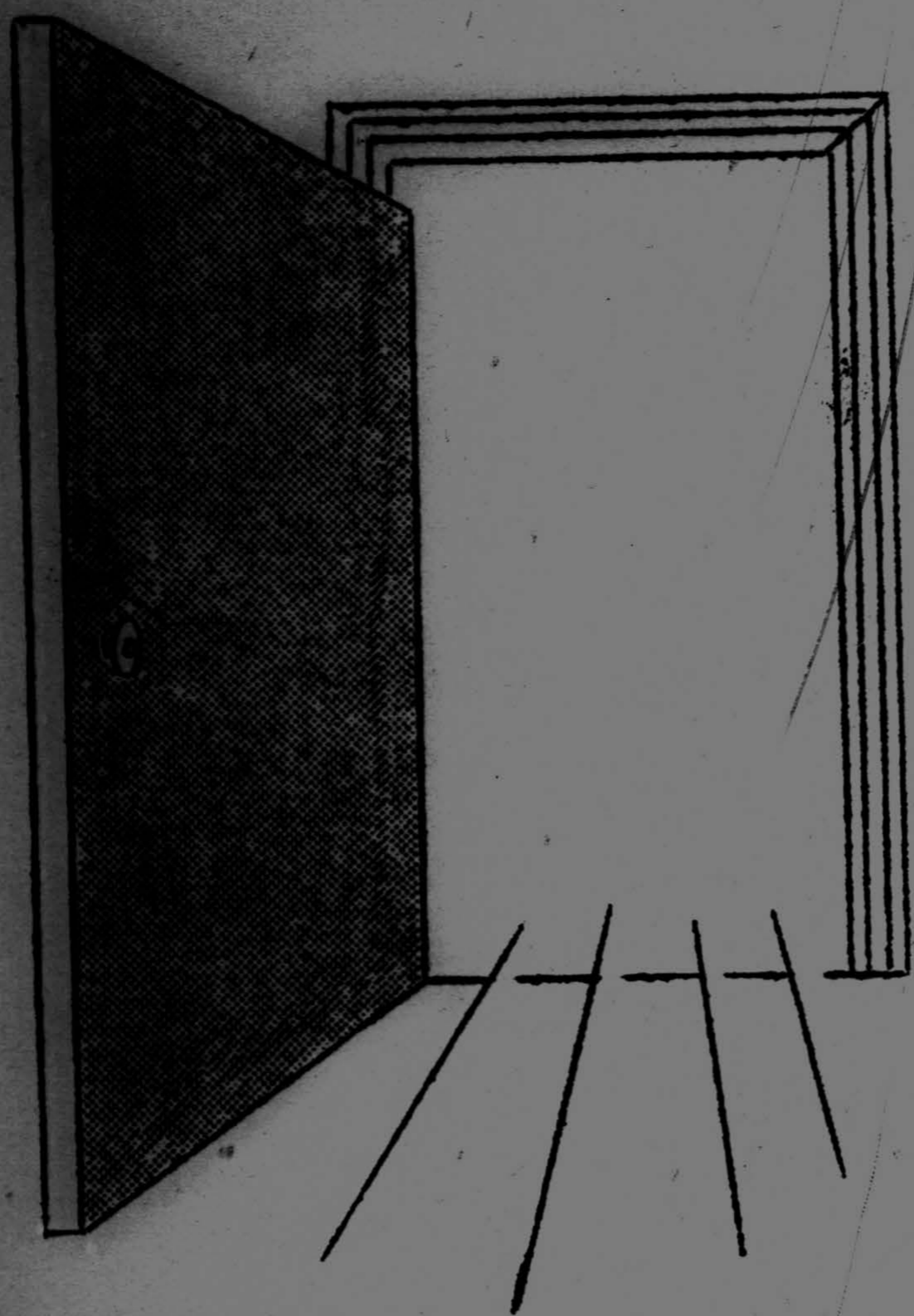

PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS

R E L E A S E

The Honourable Minister of Education wishes to inform the public that the results of the Matriculation, Grade XI Certificate and Business Education examinations written in June 1966 will be mailed today, Wednesday, August 17th, to the several schools attended by candidates. All students will obtain their results from the schools they attended.

Because of the urgency and pressure of work connected with determining scholarships and bursary winners, it will not be possible for candidates to obtain their results from the Public Examinations Division during the next two weeks.

Summaries of the results of Matriculation, Grade XI Certificate and Business Education examinations 1966 have now been prepared.

Matriculation candidates are those who have now met the Academic qualifications for admission to Memorial University. As distinct from the Matriculation Diploma the Grade XI Certificate is in the nature of a school-leaving Certificate and the latter does not admit the holder to University, nor to certain trades and professions.

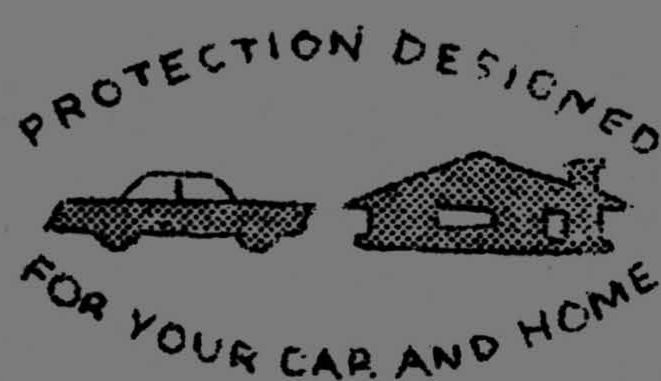

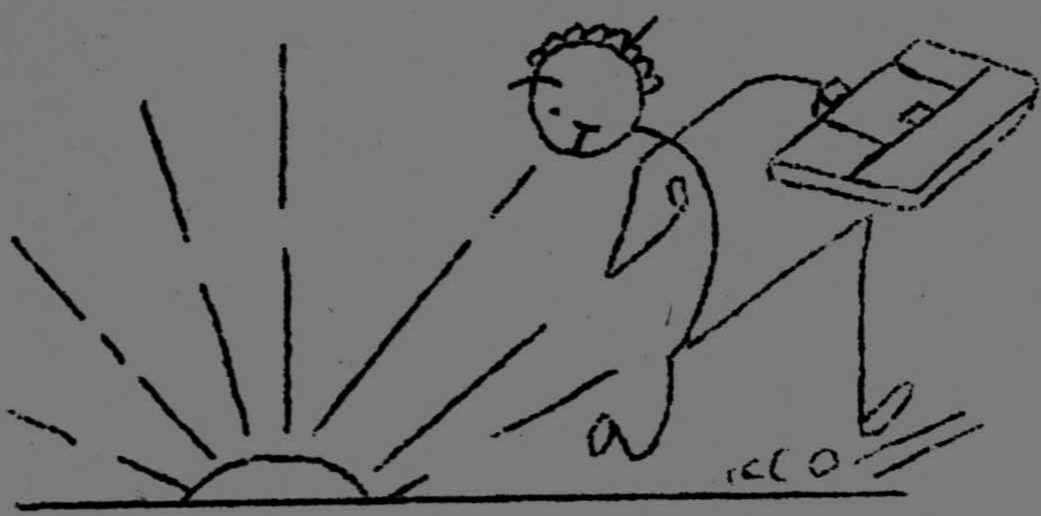
