The 1st. Toastmasters Club at Santa Ana was purely a local activity but the members of that original club took the idea with them when they moved to other cities and countries. The organization has never had a paid organizer, but today there are more than 3,600 clubs in the United States, Canada and 45 other countries throughout the world,

Toastmasters was founded on the premise that you learn by doing. This theory has proved highly successful. Toastmasters is not a school for orators, it is a self-help organization which teaches men to listen analytically, to think constructively, and to speak effectively and concisely. The ability to communicate effectively is one of the most important assets a man can have in today's world. The Toastmasters Organization is helping men to achieve this goal.

DOMINION - EXPO
STUDENTS ESSAY CONTEST

Free trips to Expo 67 in Montreal will be awarded 400 students across Canada in an essay contest being conducted by Expo 67 and Dominion Stores Ltd. Any student in grades eight to twelve inclusive may enter. Essays must be on the topic: "Why I Would Like to Visit Expo 67".

In announcing the contest, Thomas G. McCormack, president of Dominion Stores, said that Expo 67 "will be one of the most exciting events ever to take place in Canada. We think every high school student should have an opportunity to attend."

Winners will receive a week-long trip to Expo 67 with all expenses, including air fare, meals, lodging, subway and bus fares, sight-seeing tours and even spending money paid by Dominion Stores. The trips will take place in July and August, 1967. While in Montreal, the winners will also be introduced to its historic attractions - - Chateau de Ramezay, Notre Dame Cathedral, Bonsecours Market, and others.

One hundred students in each of four sections of Canada - - the Western Provinces, Ontario, Quebec and the Atlantic Provinces - - will win trips in the contest.

The contest is being undertaken by Dominion Stores as a project to celebrate the Centennial of Confederation.

"By introducing young Canadians to its good influences, we hope to help build an even greater Canada in its second hundred years."

Dominion Stores already had plans for a national essay contest when Expo 67 invited the company to combine its program with Expo's natural appeal to young Canadians. The company accepted the invitation and both organizations are co-operating to make it possible

To help students prepare their essays, the company will provide special reference material along with entry blanks at Dominion Stores across Canada. Students who wish to enter, but who do not live near a store, may write to the company, or to one of its special Expo 67 Essay Contest addresses, which are listed below.

Judges of the essays will be qualified educationists.

The contest opens September 12 and ends January 31, 1967. Winners will be given notification well in advance of summer months in which they will travel.

The 400 contest winners will join millions of visitors who are expected at Expo 67 from every nation in the world.

Before them will be unveiled the story of man's progress, his hopes and his future. The theme, "Man and His World", will dominate every exhibit in a score of different fields - science, the fine arts, exploration, agriculture, industry and many others.

But Expo will be fun, too. Visitors will be able to take an inter-national tour without leaving the grounds. They will meet people from around the world and see how they work and play. They can take trips in Chinese junks or Venetian gondolas: or they can visit La Ronde, one of the most imaginative amusement parks ever devised. The winners of the contest will be featured guests at Expo Youth Pavilion and they will meet their counterparts from all over the world.

Canals and waterways will criss-cross and surround Expo. Mass transportation systems will take visitors to and through the 1000 acres of islands and shore that it will cover.

"This should provide young Canadians with the most unique experience of their lives," Mr. McCormack said. "A visit to Expo will make Canada's 100 birthday a milestone they will never forget."

To be eligible, essays are limited to 2,500 words or less, and may be submitted in English or French. They can be typed or handwritten, as long as they are neat and legible.

Accompanying each entry form is a quiz about Expo 67 which students must answer before sending an essay.

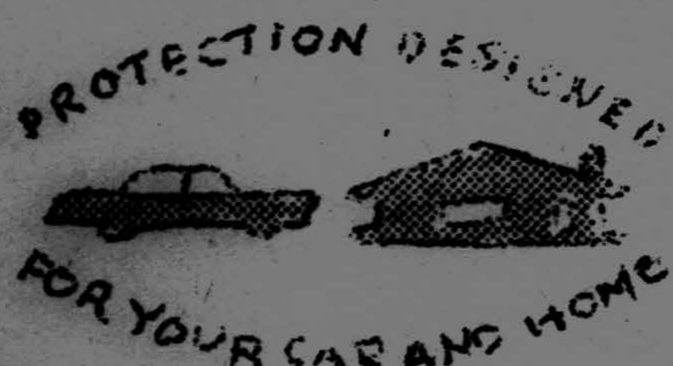
