CHILDREN ELECTROCUTED

The above caption made the headlines in a newspaper quite recently in a neighbouring town. To be quite frank just 2 weeks ago. This could happen in any town, our town is no exception.

"Two small boys were playing with a guy wire which was hanging from a transmission pole. The wire caught an insulator and touched a 44,000 volt high tension wire. One boy was electrocuted and the other seriously burned. While the seriously burned boy was being taken to hospital, The Electric Co. employees were utilized to free the guy wire in order to remove the body of the victim." In all probability an unidentified truck had ripped the wire from its base in the ground, and neglected to inform the proper authorities.

How would you feel if you were that truck driver or worse still, if the victims were your boys ???.

Incidents such as this need not happen, but they can and will happen unless all safety minded people in Labrador City:

- (1) Warn children to keep away from transmission lines.
- (2) Report all loose and hanging wires to the IOC Electrical crews at 944-8323
- (3) Operators of equipment including automobiles, construction and snow removal equipment, report IMMEDIATELY any and all damaged guy wires, over head wires etc.

You and I have a definite responsibility to take whatever steps are necessary to prevent an occurrence such as this, from happening in our town. Let's be assured it won't happen by doing our part in eliminating unsafe conditions such as these.

COURT NEWS

A resident of Labrador City was convicted of impaired driving and fined \$150.00 or 14 days and prohibited from operating a vehicle for a period of 12 months. The same man was convicted of failing to remain at the scene of an accident and hit and run, and was fined \$75.00 or 14 days on each and prohibited from operating a vehicle for 12 months in each case.

Another man was charged with dangerous driving and the charge was dismissed.

A resident was charged with impaired driving, had the case completed and judgement was reserved.

A young man from Wabush was charged with indecent assault. The Magistrate remanded him to the Hospital for Mental and Nervous Diseases, for physical examination.

A man from Wabush was convicted of causing a disturbance in the restaurant and fined \$100.00 or 30 days imprisonment and made to sign a \$200.00 Bond to keep the peace and abstain from alcoholic beverages for a period of 1 year.

A man from Wabush was convicted of assault and placed on suspended sentence for 1 year and made to sign a Bond of \$100.00.

A large number of offences under the Highway Traffic Act, and the Alcoholic Liquor Act have been dealt with and appropriate penalties imposed.
