There were and are, outside newspapers available for world news. So with little knowledge of just what we were getting into, Helen Blackie and yours truly, Marion Smith started the Carol News. With nothing but two well used portable typewriters, some nerve (and two sceptical husbands) we dove into the newspaper business.

There was some wonderful help and encouragement from Mr. E. P. Murphy, and Mr. David Bowring, in the form of the loan of some necessary equipment, besides becoming advertisers. The use of Father Roussel's duplicator is certainly never to be forgotten, and we two gals developed some strong muscles, carrying the bundles of paper to and from the Rectory.

The support of the merchants and businesses who advertised through the Carol News, eventually made it possible to buy equipment of our own. By this time our husbands had ceased being sceptical and were quite involved in getting the paper out each week.

The partnership was broken when the Blackies left Labrador City, after a wonderful four months of working together.

There have been many contributors of editorials, poetry and cartoons. To these people go many thanks. As the Carol News goes into its 2nd. year, it hopes with the continued support and reception, it has had, to provide the community with even better coverage of what is going on. It is of interest to note that the circulation has grown to over 700 copies each week, and appears to be increasing steadily. Copies go to South America, England, U.S.A., and some far off corners of Canada. There are several members of both Provincial and Federal governments who are on the subscribers list. The National Library of Canada, was interested enough to list the Carol News in their June issue of their book "Canadiana", which is distributed throughout Canada and abroad.

As the first and foremost idea of the paper is to provide a service to the community; co-operation is needed from all organizations. Your Club, Church and Group notices are welcomed, the publicity is there for the asking, a simple matter of picking up the phone. The readers who welcome the news each week, can in turn, help to provide it!

NOTICE FROM THE CANADA POST OFFICE

BOXHOLDERS PLEASE MAKE SURE MAIL ADDRESSED TO YOU BEARS BOX NUMBER

You probably never considered a Post Office Box Number as a necessary part of the address, but it is so important that its omission seriously hinders the work of the Post Office, delays the sorting and may result in your mail being misdelivered.

On a recent inspection, it was found that on a very large percentage of mail, apparently intended for delivery through the Boxes, the Box Number was omitted - a most essential detail.

When you realize that there are many hundred boxes, each with a separate number to which mail has to be sorted quickly and accurately, you will easily understand the reason why the Box Number should always be included in the address.

All mail matter should bear one of two addresses, either it is intended for delivery through the General Delivery or through a Post Office Box. If, however, in the latter case the Box Number is omitted, delay and difficulty is occasioned in effecting the delivery.

To avoid this will you please do your part by making it a regular practice to show the Post Office Box Number as an integral part of the address on all letters written by you and ask your correspondents to use the Post Office Box Number when replying to you. When filling out new subscription and renewal forms for newspapers and magazines, always include the Post Office Box Number as a part of the address. This will greatly help the staff of your Post Office to give you the efficient and speedy service to which you are entitled and which it is their desire and aim to achieve.
