ALL OF CHRISTMAS.

A friend once said of the religion of John Ruskin, the nineteenth century author and art critic, "Ruskin seems to want all parts of the cathedral except the altar. He apparently appreciated the beauty of the stained glass windows, the lovely music of the choir, even the fellowship of the people, but the altar, the symbol of Christ before whom he should bow in reverence and adoration - that left him cold.

◆ Similarly, many seemingly want everything about Christmas - without Christ. Christmas pageantry is emotionally moving. The usual comment about Christmas music is "I just love carols." Although we sometimes deplore the Christmas crowds, often we find a deep relaxation and cheerful friendship among them. But the real reason for Christmas - Christ - is given far less enthusiastic attention than everything else.

Jesus Christ is the central emphasis of Christmas. To concentrate our efforts on, or have as our priority anything less means that we do not really celebrate Christmas at all. We are celebrating some whim or fancy of mans' own choosing.

There will be many moods evident during this Christmas season. However, there is only one mood which fully fits. It is the mood of adoration. When we can truly adore God for the event of the first Christmas, then we are celebrating - all of Christmas.

Let all mortal flesh keep silence
and with fear and trembling stand;
Ponder nothing earthly-minded, for
with blessing in his hand
Christ our God to us approacheth,
our full homage to demand.

King of kings, yet born of Mary,
as of old on earth he stood,
Lord of lords, in human vesture,
in the Body and the Blood,
He will give to all the faithful
his own Self for heavenly Food.

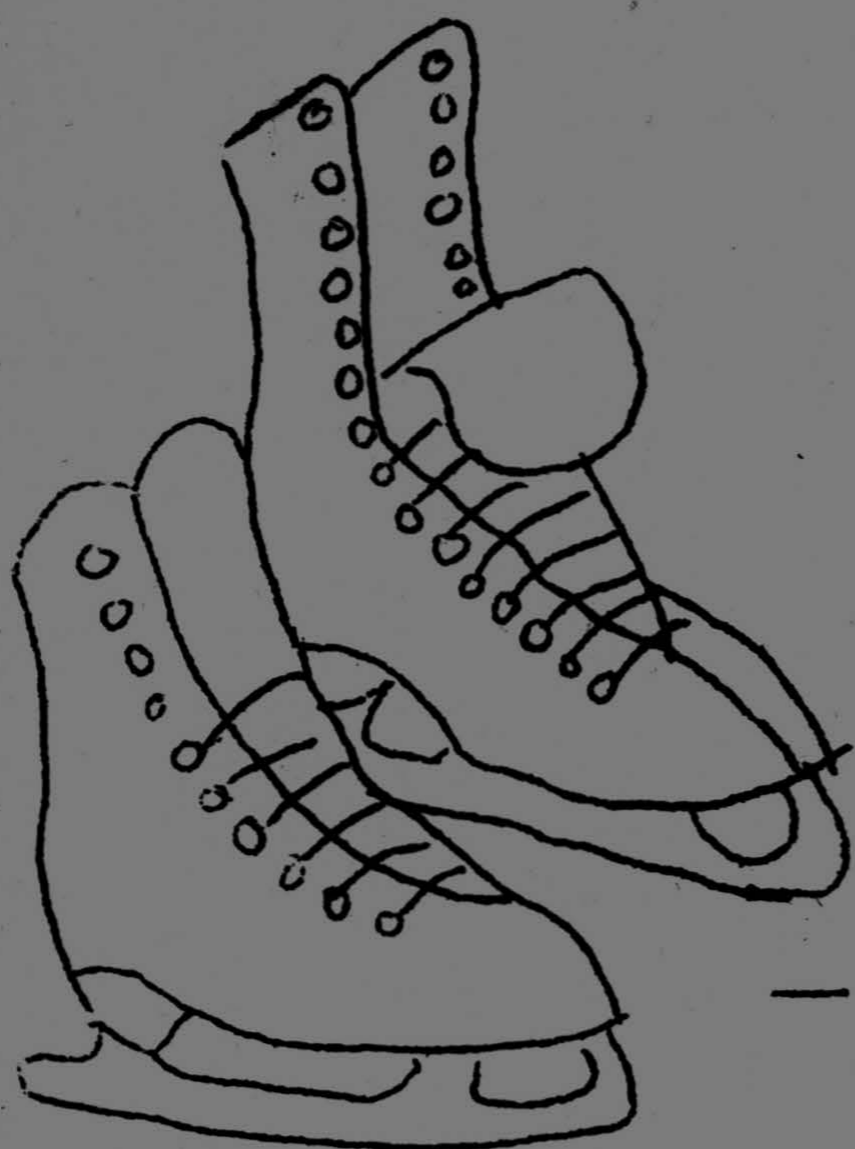

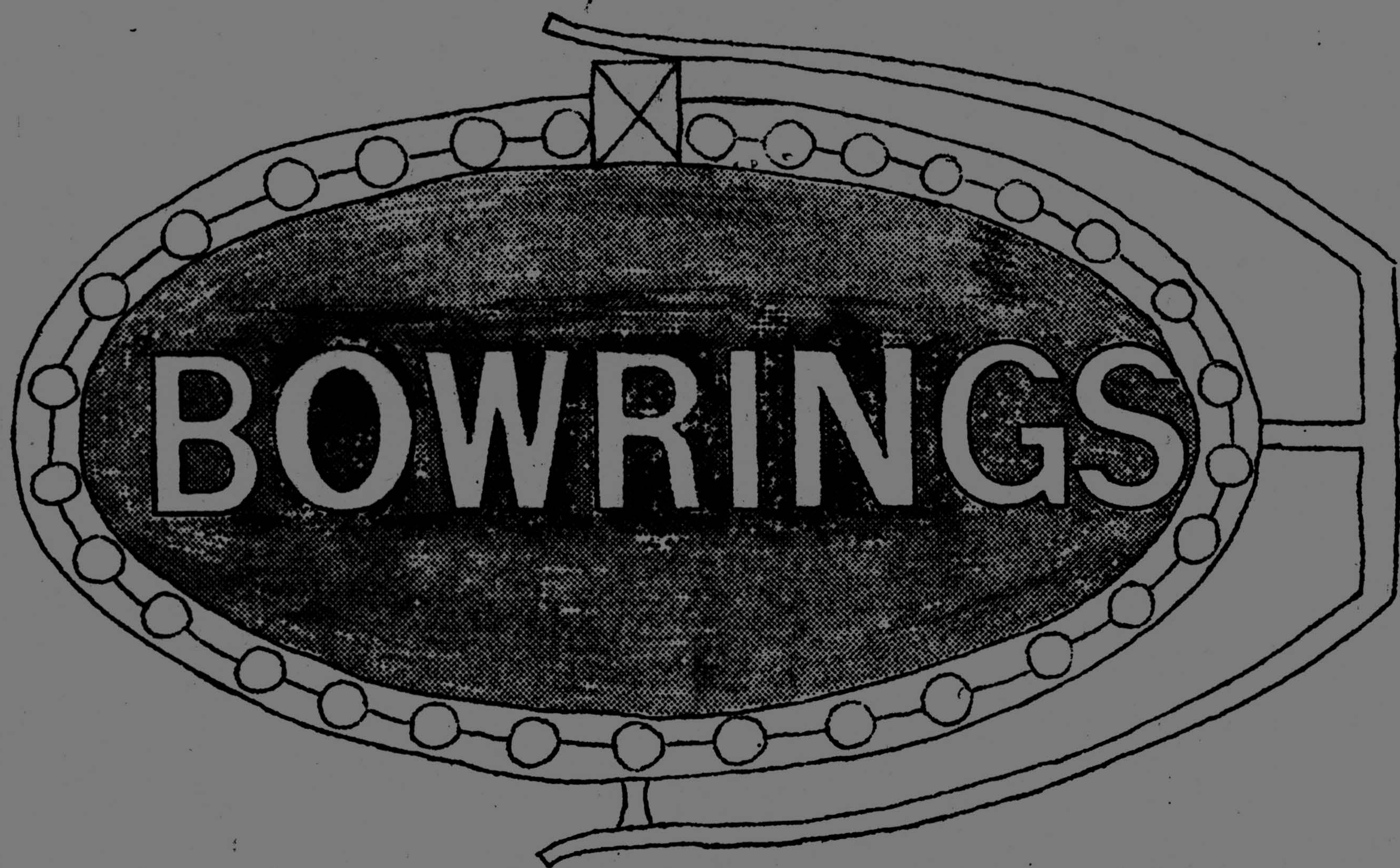
