EDITORIAL

A LOCAL T.V. SHOW ?????

For over a year now the people of Labrador City and Wabush have enjoyed the advantages of television broadcasting provided by I.O.C. and the C.B.C. While T.V. has added a great deal of pleasure to living here in a remote section of the country, many people feel that improvements could be made. Some suggestions were made to C.B.C. officials when they visited the area last spring, but these have borne little fruit.

One idea that has not received much attention so far is that of local T.V. broadcasting. In many communities this takes the form of a supper-hour variety show. Such a program, built around local talent, events and news about our two communities, could be extremely interesting and informative, and would help to draw us together better. We have goodly numbers of people with musical and artistic talent who could provide entertainment on this kind of show. Others have a wide variety of hobbies which could be demonstrated. There is also a varied and exciting program of sport in the two towns which should be reported along with the showing of some of the more exciting moments of games and matches. News and weather coverage could also be provided. Interviews with outside visitors as well as local people in the news could be arranged. Clubs and other organizations within the two towns would have a chance to publicize their activities and the events they sponsor, and no doubt the local clergymen could be persuaded to provide a brief devotional period. Perhaps such a program could include educational features as well.

Surely there is enough of the adventuresome spirit in our two towns to produce a couple of hours of such variety each week. Much careful planning will be needed of course, before such a project could get underway, and for this purpose the management of our local T.V. station should begin now by calling together a group of interested people to study the matter and to find out what steps are necessary if it is to become a reality. Your letters to C.J.C.L. or the Carol News would be a very positive sign of your interest in this matter.

MISSIONARY AND OUTREACH

THE CAROL NEWS HAS BEEN ASKED TO PRINT THE FOLLOWING ARTICLE ON MISSIONARY & OUTREACH THERE SEEMS TO BE MUCH INTEREST IN THIS PROJECT IN OUR TOWN AND THIS ARTICLE WILL EXPLAIN IT'S MEANING.

MISSIONARY AND OUTREACH REPRESENTS A PROJECT - THE GENERAL COUNCIL OF THE UNITED CHURCH OF CANADA, STARTED IN 1964. THE FIRST PHASE OF THIS PROJECT WAS RESEARCH AND ASSESSMENT, WHICH INVOLVED 200 PASTORAL CHARGES AND 2000 LAY PEOPLE AND MINISTERS. THE PURPOSE OF THIS NEW BRANCH OF MISSIONARY MAINTENANCE, IS TO DO CONGREGATIONAL WORK IN EACH COMMUNITY, THIS IN SOME CASES WAS THOUGHT TO BE AS NECESSARY AS OVERSEAS RELIEF. THE SECOND STEP WAS TO MAKE THIS A NATIONAL PROJECT, AND IN THE SUMMER AND FALL OF 1965 APPROXIMATELY 75 - 100 MEMBERS IN MOST OF OUR 102 PRESBYTERIES WERE PLANNING FELLOWSHIP AND STUDYING THE CHANGES THAT ARE TAKING PLACE IN THE CONGREGATIONS AND SOCIETY, LOOKING AT THE NEEDS OF INDIVIDUALS AND GROUPS, AND CONSIDERING HOW THE CHURCH CAN HELP THESE NEEDS. THE THIRD AND FINAL PHASE DECIDED UPON IS, THAT EVERY CONGREGATION OR GROUPS, WITHIN THE CONGREGATION SHOULD EXPERIENCE A MISSION, NOT ONLY WITHIN THE WALLS OF THE SANCTUARY, BUT IN THEIR WORDLY EVERY-DAY LIFE. LEADERS IN CONGREGATIONS WILL GAIN INSPIRATION AND TRAINING THROUGH PRESBYTRY PLANNING FELLOWSHIP, AND THE PRESBYTRY HAS PLANNED GOALS SUCH AS THESE;

TO HEAR GOD SPEAKING THROUGH THE WORLD

TO HEAR WHAT GOD IS CALLING THE CHURCH TO DO

TO ENCOURAGE THE FORMATION OF SMALL PERSONAL GROUPS

AID TO DEVELOP LEADERSHIP FOR CHRISTIAN OUTREACH.

IT WAS ALSO DECIDED THAT THIS PROJECT WOULD NOT HAVE A SET PATTERN, BECAUSE EACH COMMUNITY HAS DIFFERENT POSSIBILITIES. IT IS RATHER A GENERAL ATTEMPT FOR THE CHURCH TO USE IT'S INFLUENCE OR POWER TO CREATE A FEELING OF FRIENDSHIP IN AND THROUGH THE COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE. THIS BEING CANADA'S 100 TH BIRTHDAY, MISSIONARY AND OUTREACH HAS SET A GOAL TO CROSS CANADA NO MATTER HOW LARGE OR SMALL THE CHURCH.

OUR CAROL UNITED PROJECT WAS DECIDED IN A CONFERENCE, WHICH OUR MINISTER ATTENDED AT GAGNON IN THE SPRING OF 1966. MISSIONARY AND MAINTENANCE, TO SOME PEOPLES POINT OF VIEW, IS JUST A LOT OF FIGURES IN TERMS OF DOLLARS AND CENTS, SENT TO FAR AWAY PLACES TO HELP THE SICK AND HUNGRY IN BODY AND SOUL. TRUE, THOUSANDS OF STARVING, SICK AND MISERABLE HUMAN BEINGS ARE GIVEN THE SERVICES OF CHURCH, MINISTER, DOCTOR, HOSPITAL SCHOOLS AND OTHER NECESSITIES THAT THEY MIGHT LIVE. MISSIONARY OUTREACH DIFFERS TO THIS EXTENT - THE OUTREACH OF OUR OWN CHURCH INTO OUR OWN COMMUNITY. YOU AND I ARE THE MISSIONARIES, THE SUPPORT WE GIVE IS THE MAINTENANCE "NOT IN DOLLARS AND CENTS" BUT IN WILLING AND FAITHFUL SERVICES. WE ARE MISSIONARIES WHEN WE HAVE THE LOVE OF GOD IN OUR HEARTS, AND CAN REACH OUT TO OUR NEIGHBOUR OR THE CITIZENS AROUND US. WE ARE ON A MISSION FOR CHRIST WHEN WE WELCOME STRANGERS TO OUR CHURCH, OR GIVE ENCOURAGING WORDS TO ANYONE WHO NEEDS THEM.

IN THE BEGINNING OF THIS NEW YEAR, I WOULD ASK, GIVE THE SUPPORT OF YOUR DAILY PRAYERS. PRAY FOR THE FAITH OF OUR YOUNG PEOPLE, OUR BOYS AND GIRLS AND THEIR LEADERS - THE SUNDAY SCHOOLS AND THEIR TEACHERS, THE DAY SCHOOLS, PRAY FOR EACH OTHER AS A CONGREGATION, FOR CHRIST HATH SAID - PRAY WITHOUT CEASING. PRAY, REMEMBERING THE TASK OF YOUR MINISTER, AND IN FAITH WITH GOD'S HELP, GIVE HIM YOUR SUPPORT. PUT YOUR FAITH IN CHRIST, LINK IT WITH ACTION, BY PRAYING THAT THE CHURCH WILL SUCCEED IN IT'S MISSION OF SPREADING PEACE AND UNITY WHEREVER GOD'S WORD IS PREACHED.

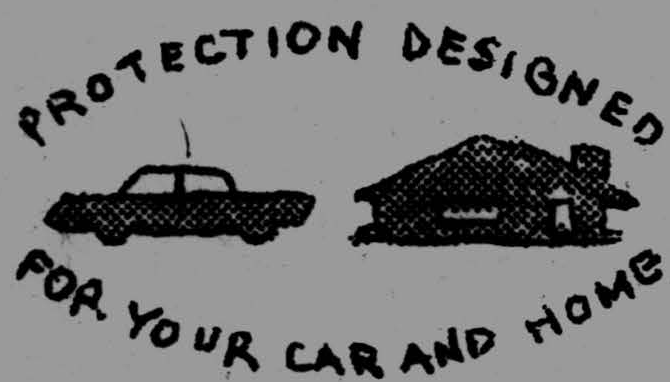

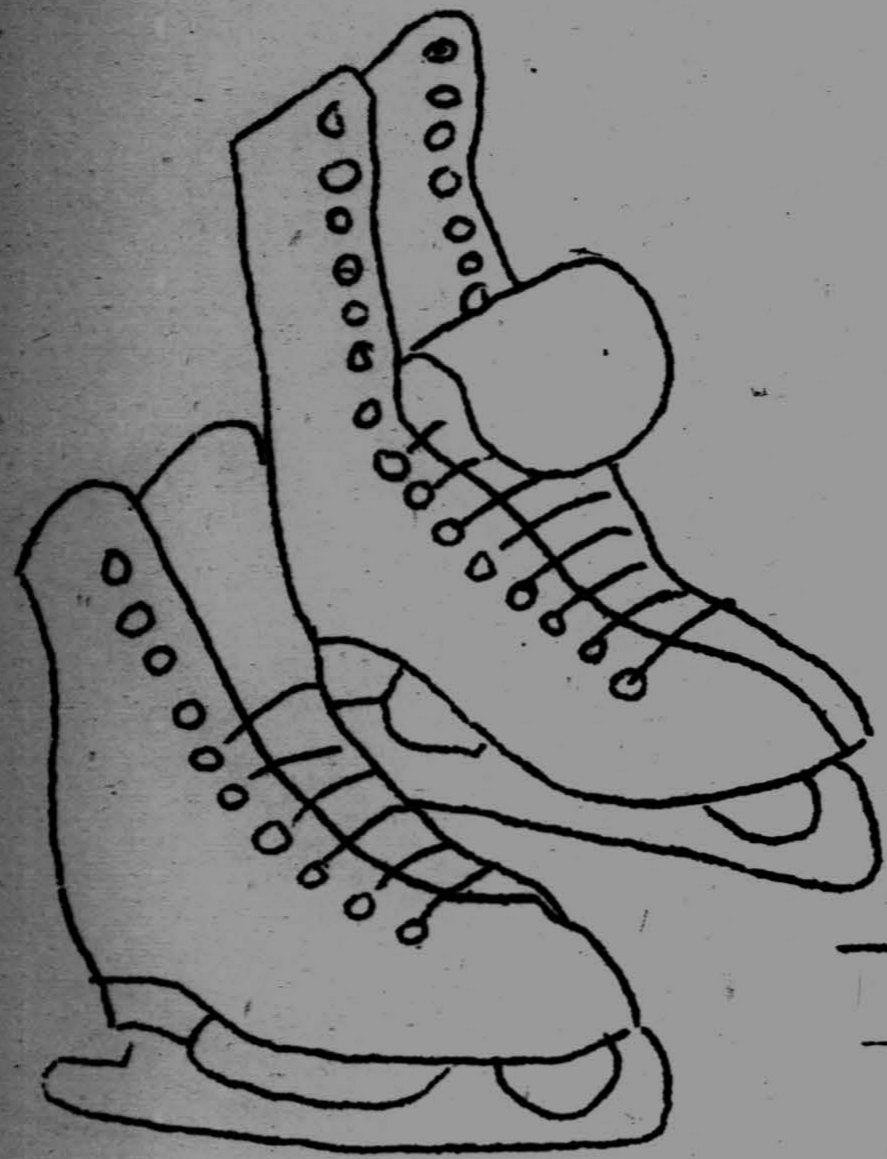

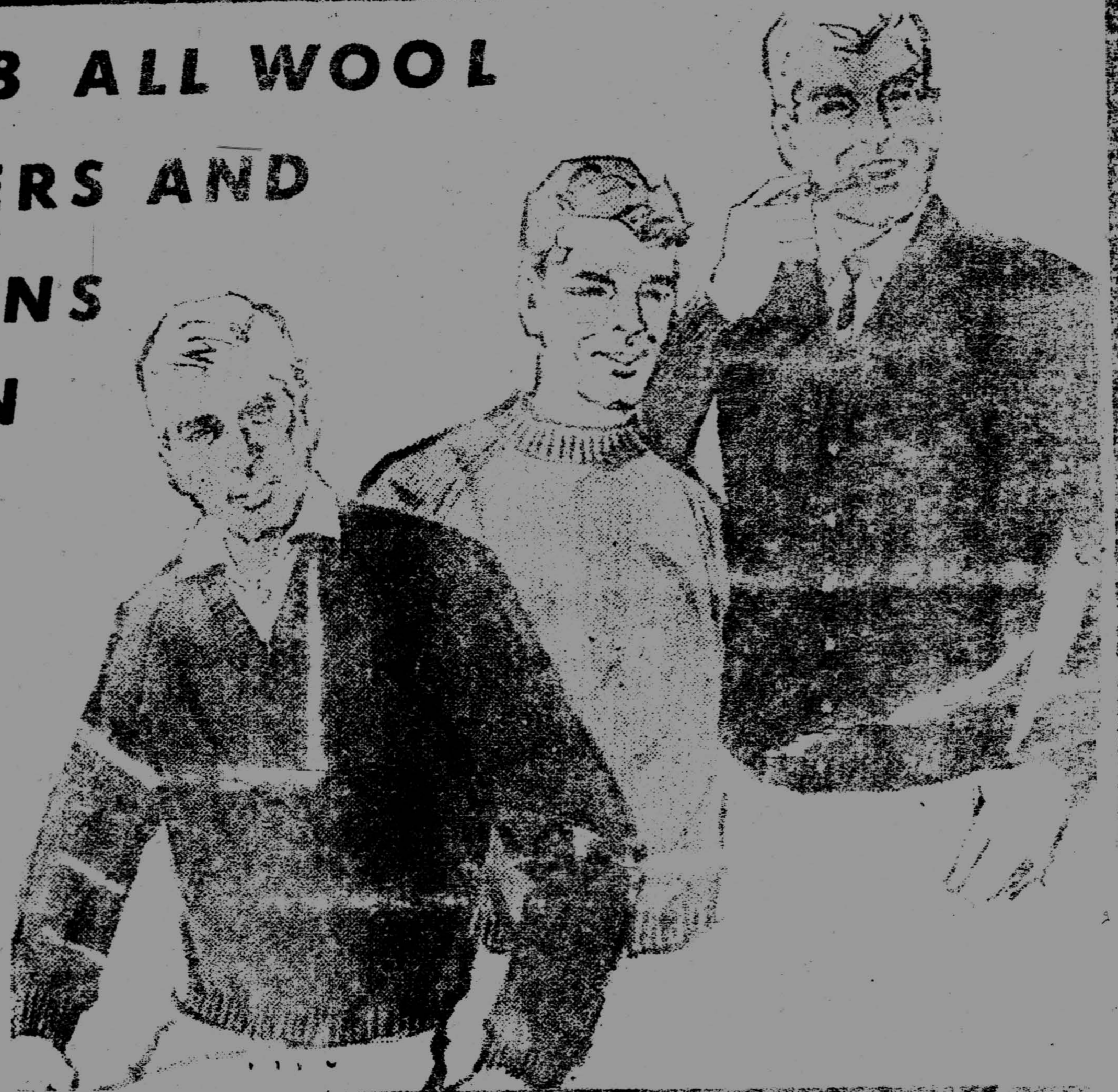
