NOTICE TO SKI DOO OWNERS

A SKI DOO OR SIMILIAR VEHICLE IS A "MOTOR VEHICLE" WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT.

THE REGISTRAR OF MOTOR VEHICLES WILL NOT LICENSE THESE VEHICLES OR ISSUE DRIVERS LICENSES FOR THEIR OPERATIONS. CONSEQUENTLY SUCH VEHICLES ARE NOT TO BE OPERATED ON ANY PUBLIC HIGHWAY, SIDEWALK, PARKING AREA OR OTHER PLACE TO WHICH THE PUBLIC HAS ACCESS FOR THE PASSAGE OF VEHICLES.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION THE INTERPRETATION OF "HIGHWAY" IN THE HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT READS:

"HIGHWAY" MEANS THE ENTIRE WIDTH BETWEEN THE BOUNDARY LINES OF A HIGHWAY, ROAD, STREET, AVENUE, THOROUGHFARE, RIGHT-OF-WAY, PARKWAY, DRIVEWAY, LANE, ALLEY SQUARE, PLACE, BRIDGE, CULVERT, VIADUCT, TRESTLE OR CAUSEWAY, WHETHER IT IS PUBLICLY OWNED AND WHETHER OR NOT IT IS DESIGNED OR INTENDED FOR USE BY THE PUBLIC, IF THE WHOLE OR ANY PART OF IT IS USED BY THE PUBLIC FOR THE PASSAGE OF VEHICLES AND INCLUDES A TRAIL ON A FROZEN LAKE, RIVER OR OTHER BODY OF WATER OR WATERCOURSE WHEN THAT TRAIL IS MAINTAINED OR KEPT OPEN AT THE EXPENSE OF THE PROVINCE OR A MUNICIPALITY. THE MINIMUM PENALTY FOR OPERATING AN UNLICENSED MOTOR VEHICLE ON A HIGHWAY IS \$50.00, AND EITHER THE OPERATOR OR THE OWNER MAY BE CHARGED.

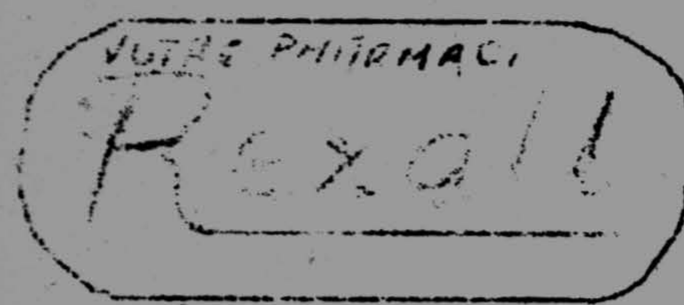

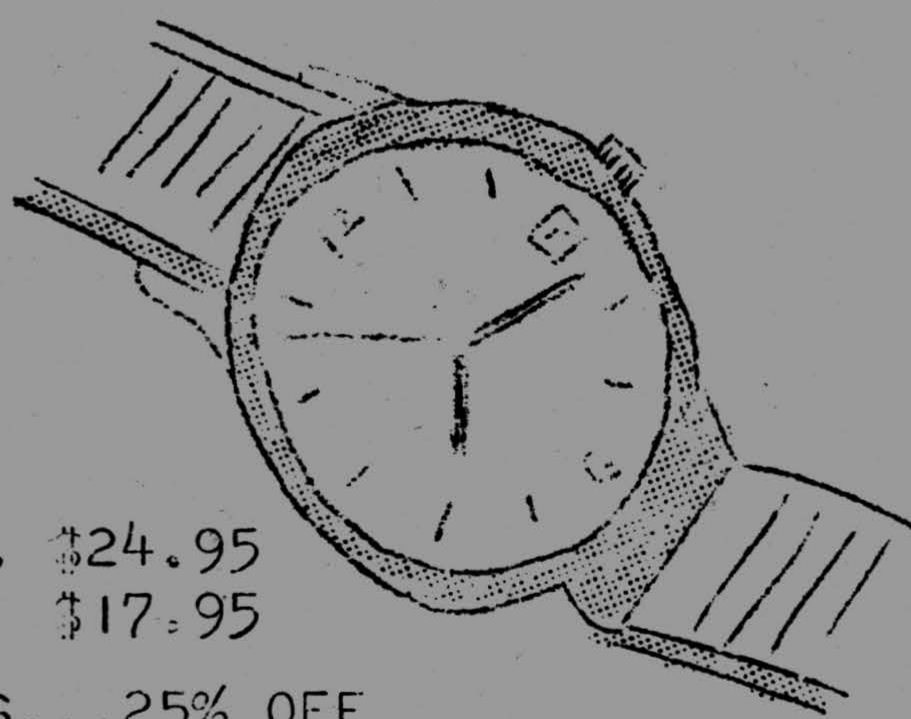

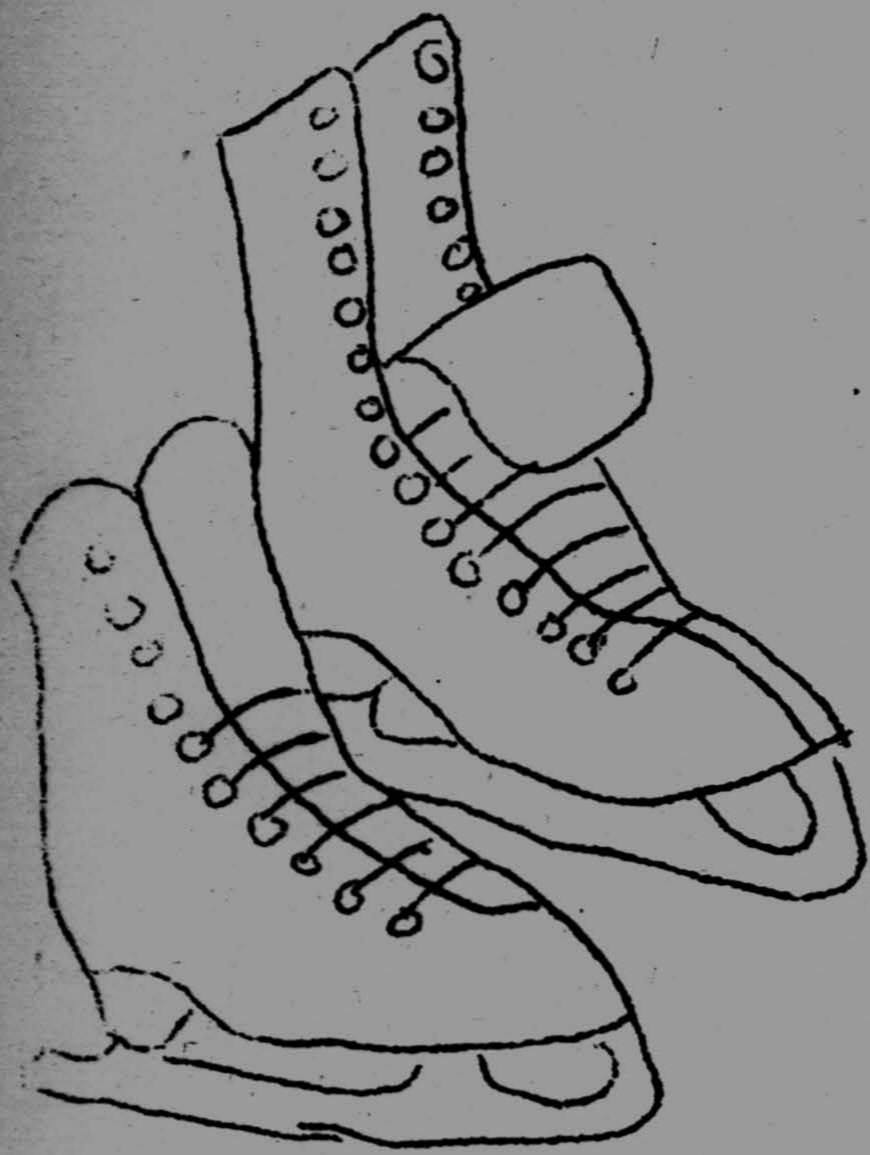
