## FIRST CANADIAN WINTER GAMES

WE CAN, AND SHOULD BE PROUD OF THE GROUP OF PEOPLE WHO RECENTLY REPRESENTED OUR TOWN IN THE FIRST CANADIAN WINTER GAMES, HELD IN QUEBEC CITY. THE LADIES BASKETBALL TEAM, (THE NFLD. CHAMPS) PUT UP A GOOD FIGHT, AND DID VERY WELL, CONSIDERING THEIR MISFORTUNE OF HAVING 2 OR 3 INJURIES. STARTING OUT IN A SECTION, THE GALS PLAYED ONTARIO, UN. OF NEW BRUNSWICK AND MANITOBA. LOSING ALL THREE GAMES THEY DROPPED TO B SECTION AND PLAYED 5 GAMES, WINNING 3 OF THEM, - AGAINST YUKON, NORTH WEST TERRITORIES AND P.E.I. AND LOSING TO UN. OF NEW BRUNSWICK, AND NOVA SCOTIA. REPORTS HAVE IT THAT THE GIRLS ENJOYED THEIR VISIT TO THE GAMES IMMENSELY AND WERE TREMENDOUSLY INTERESTED IN WATCHING AS MANY OF THE OTHER SPORTS EVENTS AS POSSIBLE.

THE TEAM CHOSEN FROM SMOKEY MOUNTAIN SKI CLUB, JOINED THE ONE FROM MARBLE MOUNTAIN SKI CLUB IN CORNER BROOK TO REPRESENT THE PROVINCE OF NFLD. IN THE SPORT OF SKIING. THIS MARKED THE FIRST TIME NFLD. HAS PARTICIPATED IN COMPETITION SKIING IN CANADA.

THE LABRADOR CITY TEAM LEFT HERE TO JOIN THE REST OF THE TEAM IN QUEBEC FOR A WEEK OF PRACTICE. THE TEAM MEMBERS WERE - MANFRED MUENZEL, -SLALOM AND GIANT SLALOM. JOHN KRATS, CROSS COUNTRY & SLALOM, JACQUES "COCO" ROY - SLALOM, DAVID DUNKIN - SLALOM, CAROL SHEPPARD, SLALOM AND GIANT SLALOM, JIM WINTERS - GIANT SLALOM. TWO JUNIORS JOINED THE TEAM TO GAIN EXPERIENCE OF PARTICIPATING IN SUCH AN EVENT - BOB ARCHER AND MIKE MERCURIADIS. WHILE IN QUEBEC, THE TEAM WAS BILLITED WITH AND MET SKIERS FROM THE ENTIRE COUNTRY. THE FIRST EVENT WAS A CROSS COUNTRY, WHICH WAS RUN ON A 15 KILOMETER COURSE IN THE TAIL END OF A BLIZZARD THAT PARALIZED QUEBEC CITY. JOHN KRATS OF LABRADOR CITY RAN THE 10 MILES IN A TIME OF 68' 46" TO FINISH NINTH IN A FIELD OF FIFTY-FIVE. THE COMPETITION IN THE CROSS COUNTRY FIELD INCLUDED MEMBERS ON THE CANADIAN NATIONAL SKI TEAM AND NORTH AMERICAN PAST AND PRESENT CHAMPIONS.

ON FRIDAY AFTERNOON THE GIANT SLALOM WAS RUN IN A MILE AND A QUARTER COURSE WITH 60 GATES. MANFRED MUENZEL WAS THE FIRST LABRADORITE TO RUN, HE HAD A LOVELY RUN BUT WAS DISQUALIFIED. THE SECOND SKIER WAS JIM WINTER WHO FELL ON THE FIFTY-FIRST GATE. THE LAST MEN'S EVENT, WAS THE SLALOM WHICH COMPRISED TWO RUNS BY EACH SKIER ON TWO DIFFERENT COURSES. "COCO" ROY HAD AN EXCELLENT RUN ON THE FIRST COURSE, BUT MISSED A GATE ON THE SECOND AND WAS DISQUALIFIED. THE YOUNGEST MEMBER OF THE SLALOM TEAM, DAVID DUNKIN HAD A NICE FIRST RUN AND COMBINED WITH A SMOOTH SECOND RUN, FOR AN OVERALL FINISH OF 24TH. IN A FIELD OF SEVENTY-EIGHT.

THE ONLY ENTRY IN THE LADIES EVENT, CAROL SHEPPARD WAS PLAGUED BY BAD LUCK IN THE FORM OF FAULTY BINDINGS IN BOTH GIANT SLALOM AND SLALOM. HER BINDINGS BROKE OPEN FOR NO APPARENT REASON - THIS WAS HEART BREAKING AS SHE HAD GOOD RUNS IN BOTH EVENTS UNTIL SIDETRACKED BY LOSING SKIS.

THE TEAM FELT THAT THE EXPERIENCE GAINED BY PARTICIPATING IN SUCH A NATIONAL EVENT IS INVALUABLE AND THEY HOPE TO BE ABLE TO USE IT AND PASS IT ON TO FUTURE SKIERS WHO WILL BE IN THE SECOND WINTER GAMES, WHICH WILL TAKE PLACE FOUR YEARS FROM NOW .....

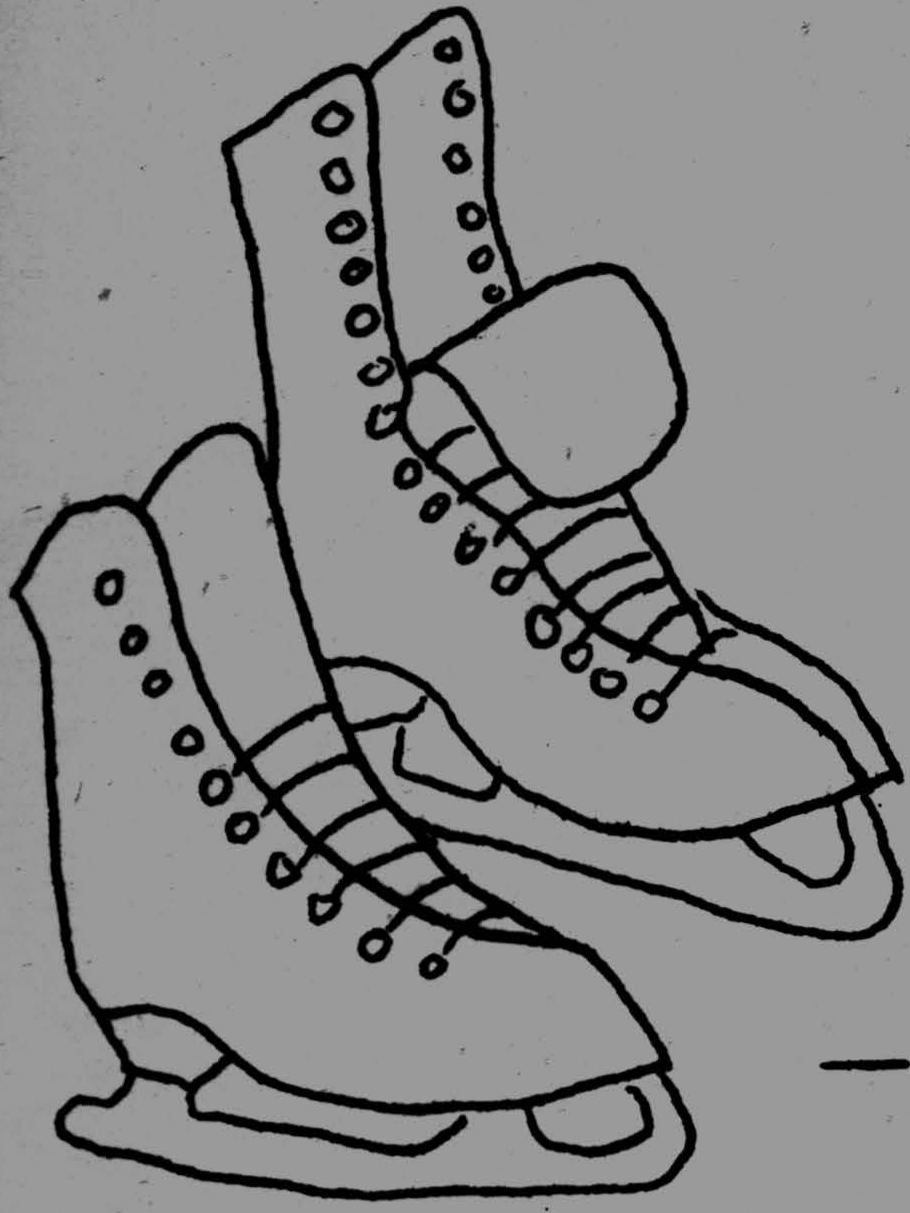
