EDITORIAL

IT SEEMED COINCIDENTAL THIS WEEK-END TO NOTE TWO ITEMS IN THE ST. JOHN'S TELEGRAM - ONE CONCERNING THE NUMBER OF VEHICLES LICENCED IN OUR AREA RECENTLY, THE OTHER ON THE EDITORIAL PAGE ENTITLED DEATH ON THE ROADS. THESE APPEAR AT A TIMELY MOMENT, IN THE MIDST OF WINTER, WHEN ROAD CONDITIONS ARE EXTREMELY HAZARDOUS.

SOME 1600 VEHICLES WERE LICENCED DURING THE PERIOD, FEB. 7TH. TO 11TH., AT LABRADOR CITY AND ANOTHER 400 PEOPLE SENT REQUESTS TO THE ST. JOHN'S MOTOR REGISTRATION OFFICE FOR THEIR LICENCES, AND IT IS ESTIMATED THAT YET ANOTHER 200 CARDS ARE TO BE LICENCED.

BETWEEN THE TWO TOWNS OF LABRADOR CITY AND WABUSH, THERE IS THE HIGHEST RATIO OF VEHICLES PER PERSON, THAN ANY AREA OF ITS SIZE IN NEW-FOUNDLAND. THERE ARE APPROXIMATELY 2200 VEHICLES FOR A POPULATION OF ABOUT 9000. THERE ARE ABOUT 21 MILES OF PAVED ROAD IN LABRADOR WEST.

THIS, THEN, SHOULD FORCIBLY REMIND US THAT CARE AND CAUTION MUST BE PRACTICED AT ALL TIMES. IF IT IS NECESSARY TO CHANGE A TIRE, OR CORRECT MOTOR TROUBLE ON THE ROAD, A SIGNAL OR WARNING DEVICE SHOULD BE VERY EVIDENT TO APPROACHING CARS, SO THAT THEY MAY PROCEED WITH CAUTION. BECAUSE PEDESTRIANS MUST WALK ON THE ROAD DURING WINTER, IT IS IMPERITIVE THAT ONE WEAR SOME KIND OF CLOTHING THAT WILL BE DISTINGUISHABLE DURING PERIODS OF DARKNESS OR POOR VISIBILITY.

OUR CHILDREN MUST BE TAUGHT GOOD SAFETY HABITS, BOTH AT HOME AND IN THE SCHOOLS, THEY MUST LEARN THE DANGERS AS WELL AS THE ADVANTAGES OF THE AUTOMOBILE - THIS WILL TRAIN THEM IN THEIR ROLES OF PEDESTRIANS AS WELL AS POTENTIAL DRIVERS.

THE TELY EDITORIAL POINTS OUT THAT MANY DRIVERS TREAT THEIR VEHICLE WITH SUCH FAMILIARITY THAT IT CAN BE CLASSED AS INDIFFERENCE, EVEN CONTEMPT. WE CAN ALL REMEMBER OUR "LEARNING TO DRIVE" PERIOD, AND WHEN FINALLY GETTING OUR DRIVERS LICENCE, HOW CAREFUL AND THOUGHTFUL WE WERE, WHEN IN CONTROL OF THE NOT TOO FAMILIAR VEHICLE. IT'S A PITY THAT THIS FEELING DOESN'T ALWAYS CONTINUE, EVEN AFTER 10, 20 YEARS OF DRIVING.

NOW, LET US ALL LOOK TO OUR DRIVING HABITS, AND INDEED TO OUR ROLE AS A PEDISTRIAN. OUR TOWN CANNOT AFFORD TO LOSE ONE LIFE AS A RESULT OF AN ACCIDENT - WHO KNOWS IT MAY BE YOU.....

LES FEUX-FOLLETS

Background

The first French colonists from Normandy, Brittany, Poitou, and Perche greatly enriched Canada with their unique folklore. The new settlers imported their legendary goblins, along with their many skills. In Quebec these took the form of Feux-Follets, fabled fireflies who entertained during the long summer evenings. The troupe selected "Les Feux-Follets" as its name when it was formed in 1952.

Originally planned to provide recreational activity, the troupe concentrated more and more on folklore research and education and later, in the interpretation of authentic Canadian dance. Prior to October of 1964, when the company achieved professional status, folklore devotees were attracted from every walk of life in the province. The troupe's first members were recruited from Boy Scout groups in Quebec. They soon were joined by students, manual workers and office employees who shared a common interest in this art form. Within ten years the troupe developed an impressive repertoire drawn from indigenous and neo-Canadian traditions: some one hundred dance routines in addition to three hundred colorful costumes.

The professional ensemble of today comprises sixty-five dancers, singers and musicians - leading exponents of Canada's diverse ethnic heritage.

The verve and enthusiasm of this remarkable company is explained by the youthfulness of its members: the musicians' average age is thirty-five; the singers' twenty-three; the dancers' twenty.

Another factor, is, of course, the colour, the vitality and beauty of the group's basic program "The Canadian Mosaic". This is a two-hour panorama of songs and dances depicting the far-flung Canadian scene from the jigs and reels of Nova Scotian Highlanders and a choreographed Eskimo walrus hunt, to the ceremonial dances of the Plains and West Coast Indians; from the songs and dances of the French Acadians and the dance hall girls of the Klondike gold rush days, to the ethnic culture of Canada's European settlers. All costumes are completely authentic as to period and design. And all the dances are choreographed by Michel Cartier.

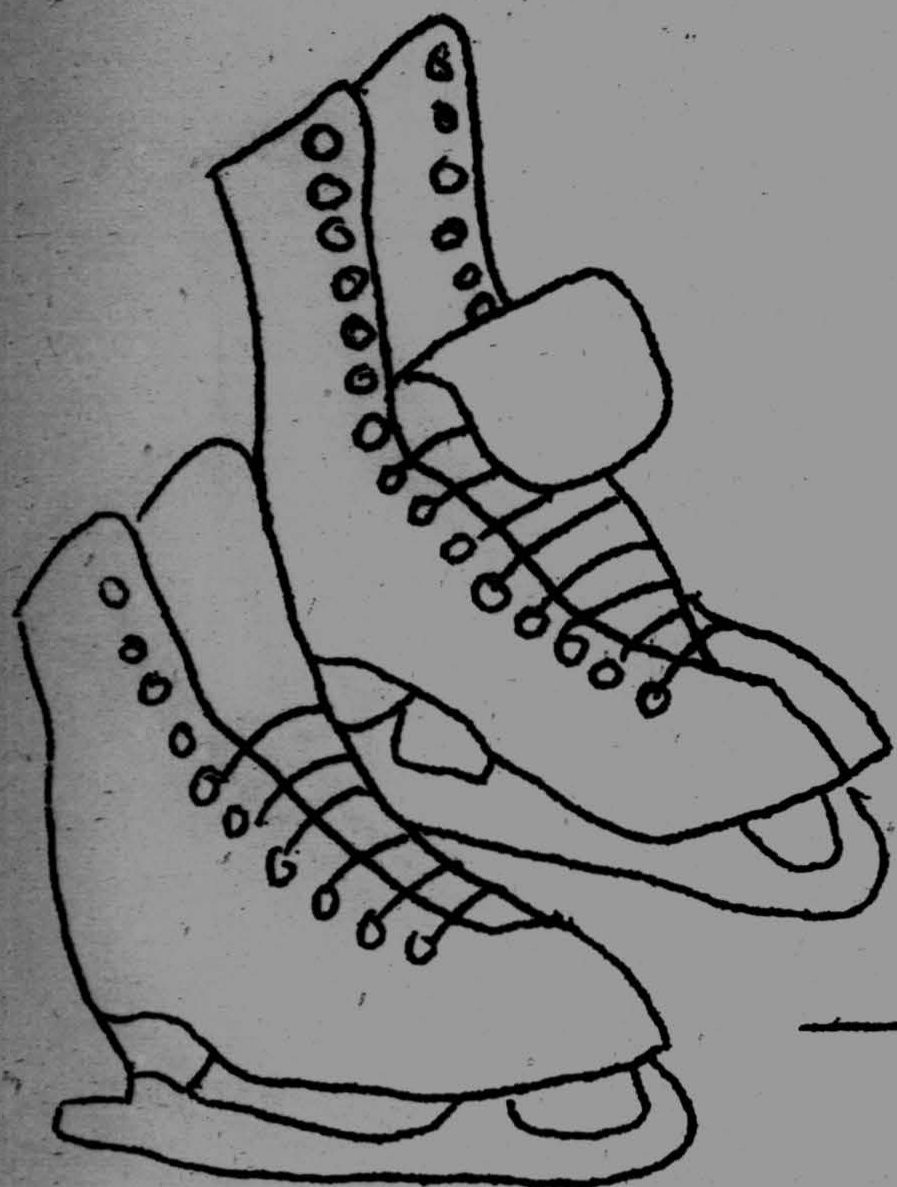

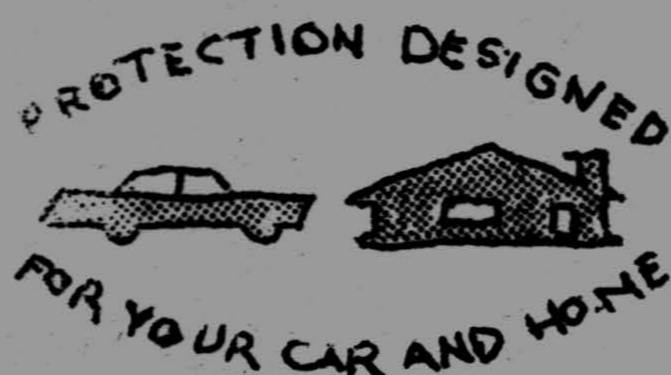
