LAST FEBRUARY 18TH. AN ARTICLE APPEARED IN A WEEKLY PAPER, BY CHARLES LYNCH, ENTITLED "HOW SMUG CAN WE CANADIANS GET? THE QUEEN IS DOING US A FAVOR"

THE FOLLOWING IS A COPY OF A LETTER SENT TO MR. LYNCH, REGARDING HIS ARTICLE, BY A YOUNG UNIVERSITY STUDENT WHOSE HOME IS HERE IN LABRADOR CITY. IT IS EXTREMELY INTERESTING AND GIVES MUCH FOOD FOR THOUGHT.

"DEAR MR. LYNCH,

I WOULD LIKE TO CONGRATULATE YOU ON YOUR MOST INTERESTING ARTICLE CONCERNING THE SHAMEFULLY NEGLECTED SUBJECT OF THE MONARCHY IN CANADA, WHICH APPEARED IN THE FEB. 18TH. EDITION OF THE "THE CANADIAN" IN THE SATURDAY CITIZEN.

I AM CANADIAN BORN AND CANADIAN DRED, I HAVE THE UTMOST RESPECT FOR THOSE WHO STRUGGLE FOR A UNIQUE CANADIAN IDENTITY. HOWEVER, I FEEL THAT CANADA HAS ALREADY PROVEN HERSELF TO BE AN INDEPENDENT COUNTRY WITH MUCH HOPE FOR A VERY GOOD FUTURE AND I SEE NO REASON FOR ATTEMPTS TO ERASE THE PAST. ARE CANADIANS SO ASHAMED OF THEIR SHORT HISTORY THAT THEY MUST GIVE THE IMPRESSION OF SPRINGING FULL GROWN FROM THE NORTHERN DUSH COUNTRY? IF SO, THEY SHOW A SHOCKING LACK OF INDIVIDUALISM. THERE ARE FEW COUNTRIES WHO MAY CLAIM THE SAME RECORD OF GOVERNMENT STABILITY AS BRITAIN AND THE COMMONWEALTH. NATURALLY THERE HAS BEEN TROUBLE - RHODESIA AND SOUTH AFRICA LIKE VIETNAM AND SOUTH AMERICA, STEM PARTIALLY FROM HUMAN NATURE AND ARE MERELY FOLLOWING THE COURSE OF HISTORY.

AS A STUDENT HERE AT CARLETON, I DEPLORE THE SITUATION, BUT WHOLEHEARTEDLY AGREE WITH YOU THAT "OUR YOUNG PEOPLE DO NOT GET THE NATIONAL MESSAGE, MUCH LESS THE ROYAL MESSAGE". THE SAME YOUNG PEOPLE WHO CLAIM WE MUST GET RID OF THE MONARCHY ARE UNABLE TO GIVE ANY JUSTIFICATION FOR THEIR OPINIONS. TOO MANY OTHERS ARE COMPLETELY INDIFFERENT TO ITS FATE

ONE REASON, AS YOU SAY, IS OUR PRESENT SCHOOL SYSTEM, IN WHICH THERE IS NO MENTION OF CANADIAN ROYALTY. CANADIAN CHILDREN GROW UP KNOWING THAT THEY ARE HERE AND A BRITISH QUEEN IS THERE. LOYALTY IS SOMETHING WHICH IS BRED BY ENVIRONMENT, AND WILL NEVER BE OUT OF DATE FOR ITS OWN SAKE, SO WHY IS LOYALTY TOWARDS THE MONARCHY BECOMING OBSOLETE? IT IS NOT SOMETHING WHICH SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO GO IN AND OUT OF STYLE, LIKE HEMLINES AND HIGH BUTTON BOOTS.

I WAS TROUBLED BY THE GALLUP POLL CONCERNING THE QUEEN'S VISIT TO EXPO 67. I DISMISS THE REASONS GIVEN FOR NEGATIVE ATTITUDES AS RIDICULOUS. SHE IS OUR QUEEN, SO WHY SHOULD OUR QUEEN NOT BE ALLOWED TO SHARE PART OF OUR CENTENNIAL CELEBRATIONS?

I ALSO AGREE WITH YOU THAT THE QUEEN IS ESSENTIAL AS A CANADIAN NATIONAL SYMBOL, JUST AS I AGREED A FEW YEARS AGO, THAT CANADA SHOULD HAVE ITS OWN FLAG. THE UNION JACK, THE RED ENSIGN AND THE MAPLE LEAF ALL BELONG TO THE QUEEN, AND UNTIL SUCH TIME AS SHE TRIES TO BLOW UP PARLIAMENT HILL, I FOR ONE WILL CONTINUE TO SAY "GOD SAVE OUR QUEEN"

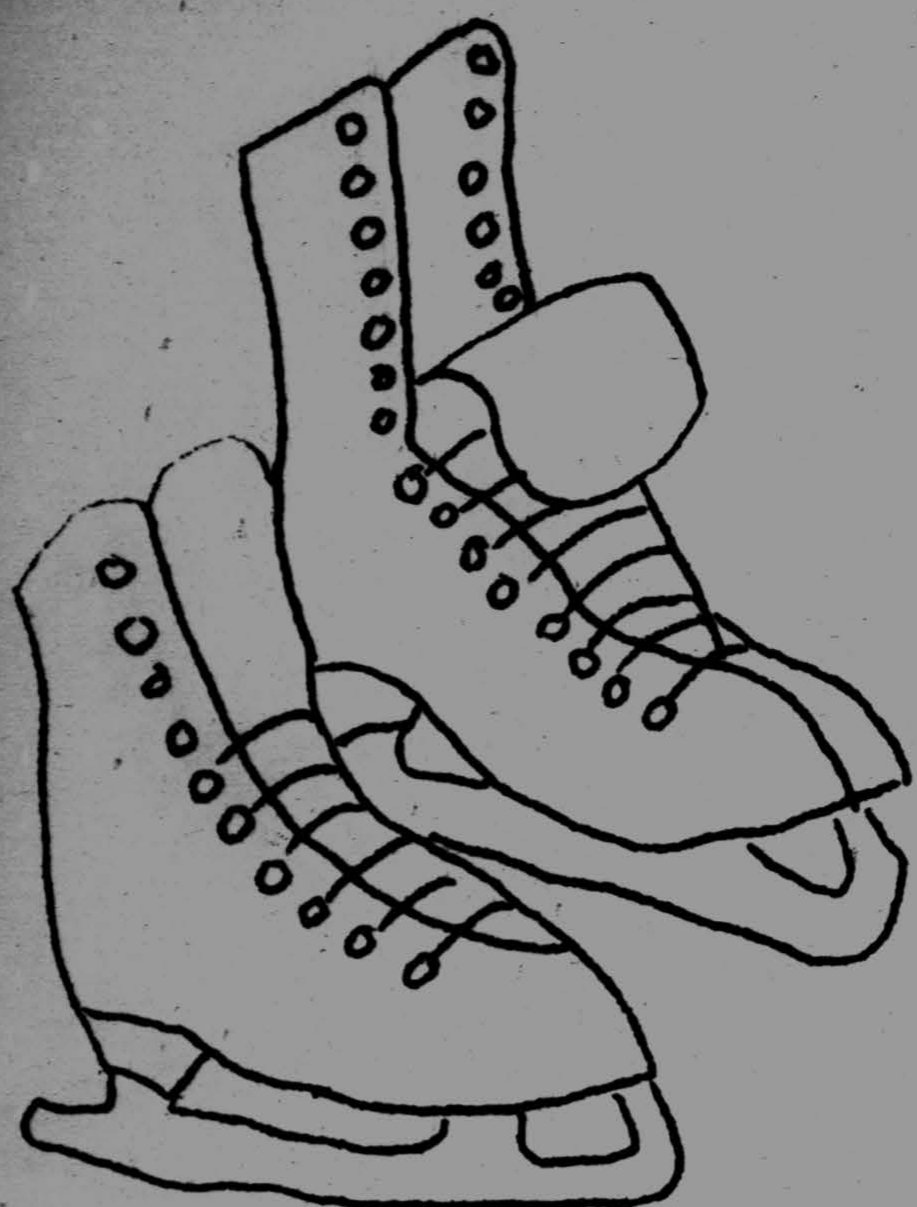

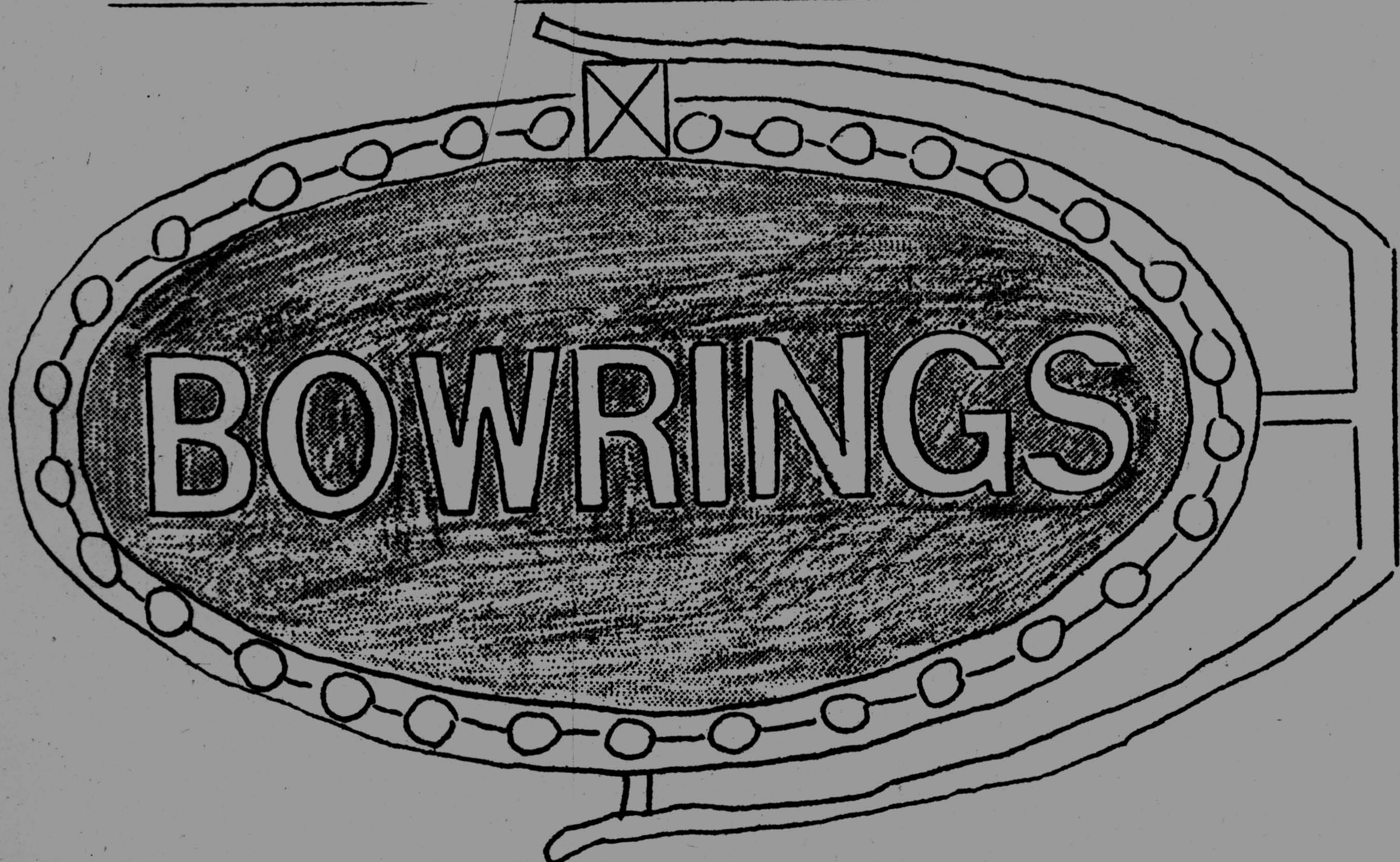
