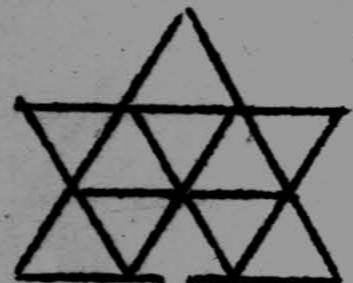

## CANADIAN CANCER CAMPAIGN

APRIL HAS BEEN DESIGNATED CANADIAN CANCER MONTH. IN THE AREA LABRADOR CITY - WABUSH, APRIL 27TH., IS THE DATE OF THE SPECIAL FINANCIAL DRIVE. IN THE PAST THE PUBLIC HAS BEEN VERY CONSCIOUS OF THE GREAT WORK WHICH IS DONE BY THE CANADIAN CANCER SOCIETY, AND THROUGH THE EFFORTS OF THE SOCIETY THROUGH ITS EDUCATIONAL POLICIES MANY LIVES HAVE BEEN SAVED. RECENTLY THE LOCAL UNIT HAS BEEN REVITALIZED WITH THE ELECTION OF A NEW SLATE OF OFFICERS. MR. JOSEPH CONDON OF THE TRAINING DEPARTMENT OF IRON ORE COMPANY OF CANADA WAS ELECTED PRESIDENT, AND HE, WITH HIS OTHER OFFICERS HAVE DONE A FINE JOB OF BRINGING THE CANCER MESSAGE BEFORE THE PUBLIC. MR. JAMES MCINTOSH WAS ELECTED CAMPAIGN CHAIRMAN FOR THIS YEAR, AND HE HAS BEEN VERY BUSY OF LATE AS THE DEADLINE DRAWS NEAR TO MAKE SURE THAT ALL PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTUAL SOLICITATION OF FUNDS HAVE BEEN MADE. FILMS, PAMPHLETS, POSTERS, ETC. ARE ALWAYS AVAILABLE THROUGH THE EDUCATIONAL CHAIRMAN, MR. P. G. CONGDON, M.A. PRINCIPAL OF NOTRE DAME ACADEMY.

A GREAT DEAL HAS BEEN DONE, BUT MUCH MORE CAN BE DONE WITH THE CO-OPERATION OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC. MOST PEOPLE MISTAKENLY THINK THAT THEY MUST HAVE MEDICAL EXPERIENCE TO ASSIST IN THE DRIVE TO STAMP OUT CANCER. SUCH, OF COURSE, IS NOT THE CASE. IF THE GENERAL PUBLIC CAN BY MADE AWARE OF THE DANGER SIGNALS OF CANCER, AND CAN BE INDUCED TO FIGHT CANCER WITH A CHECK AND A CHECK-UP (THE LATTER IS BY FAR THE MOST IMPORTANT), THAN CANCER CAN EFFECTIVELY BE CONTROLLED. KNOW THE FACTS TO HELP GET THE MESSAGE ACROSS, MONEY IS NEEDED, BUT OF FAR GREATER IMPORTANCE IS THE GENERAL CO-OPERATION OF THE PUBLIC IN FIRST OF ALL BEING INFORMED, AND THEN, OF COURSE TO FOLLOW WITH THE NECESSARY MEDICAL CHECK UP.

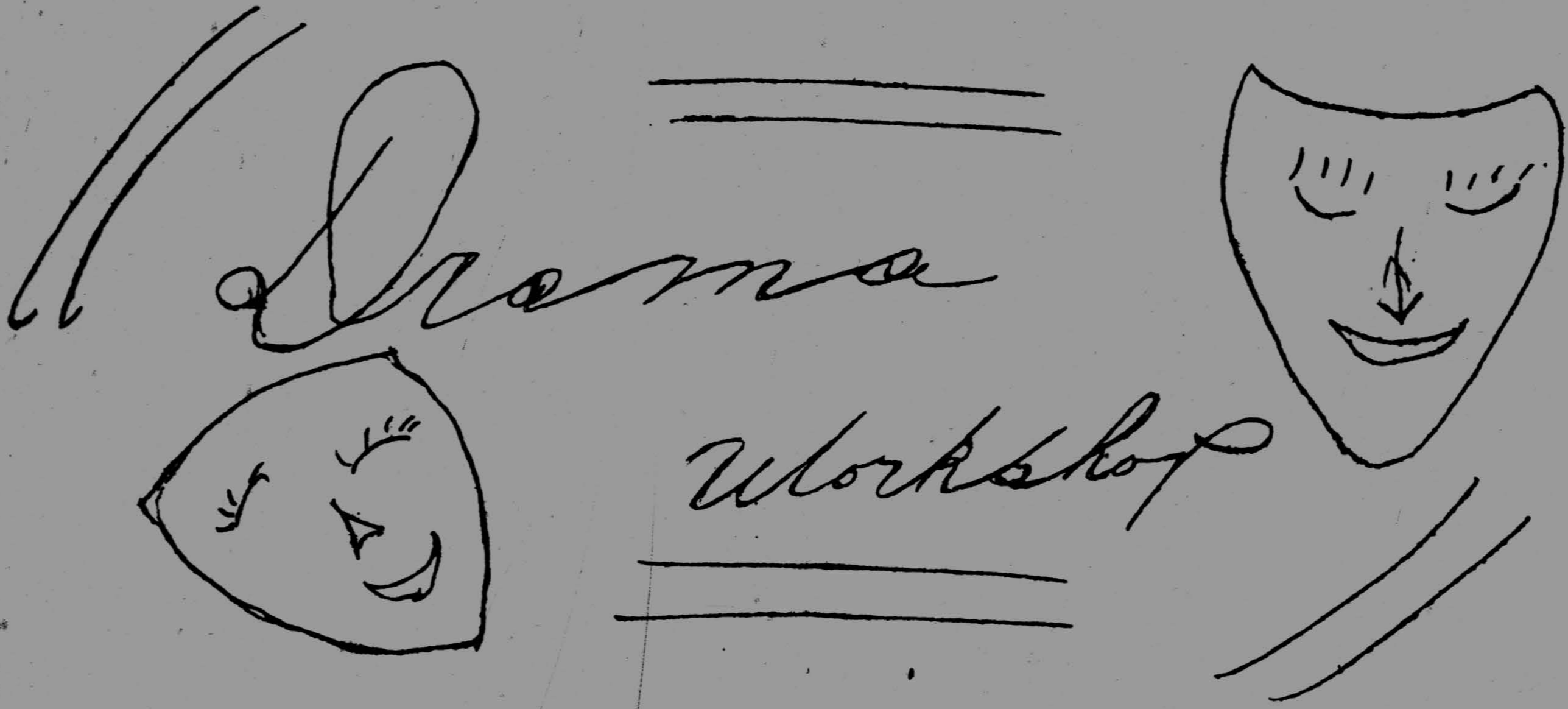
## SEVEN DAYS.

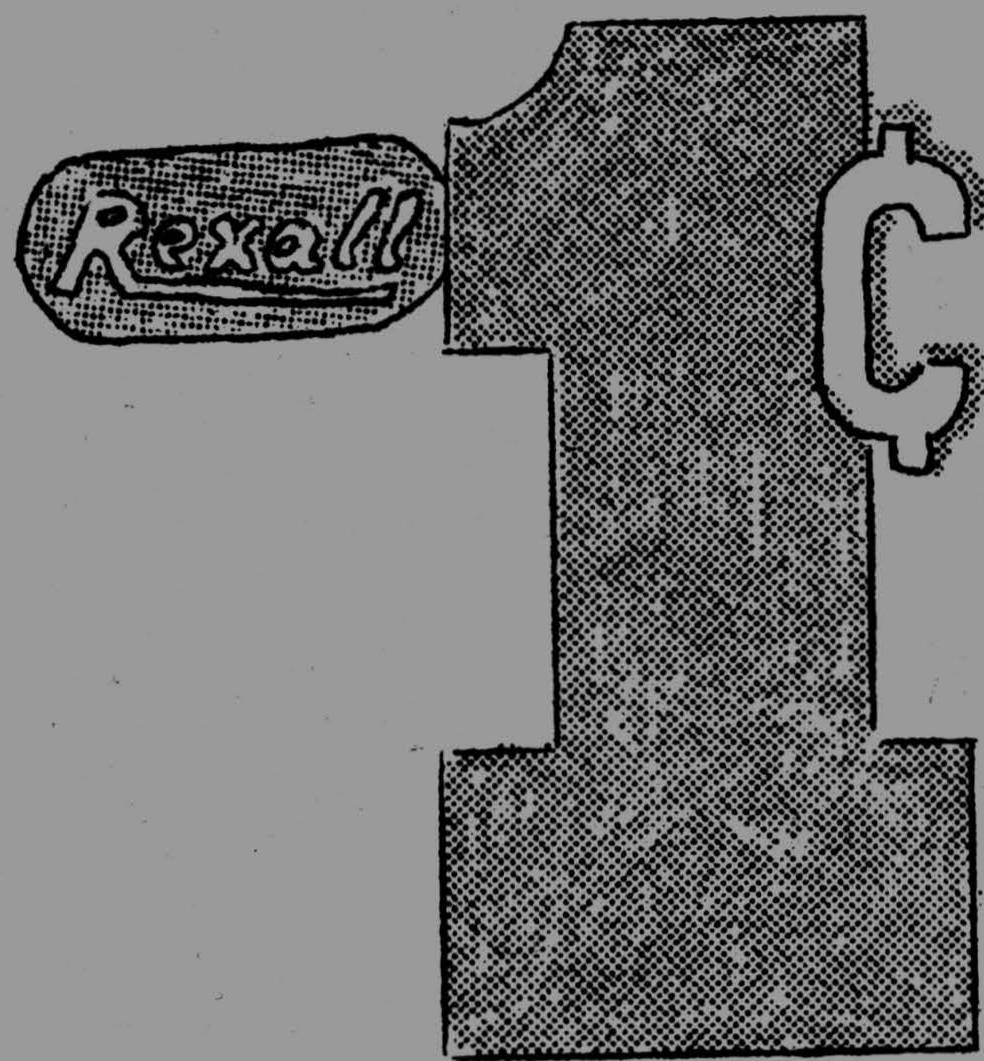

COURT NEWS

A MAN FROM WABUSH WAS CHARGED WITH IMPAIRED DRIVING ON THE 9TH. OF APRIL, IN LABRADOR CITY. HE WAS CONVICTED OF THE CHARGE AND FINED \$100.00 OR 14 DAYS IMPRISONMENT. HIS DRIVER'S LICENCE WAS SUSPENDED FOR 6 MONTHS. HE WAS FURTHER CHARGED WITH BEING INVOLVED IN AN ACCIDENT THAT SAME NIGHT IN LABRADOR CITY AND FAILING TO STOP AND GIVE HIS NAME AND ADDRESS IN ORDER TO ESCAPE LIABILITY. HE WAS CONVICTED OF THIS CHARGE AND WAS FINED \$150.00 OR 30 DAYS IMPRISONMENT AND HIS LICENCE WAS SUSPENDED FOR A FURTHER 6 MONTHS. HE WAS ORDERED TO PAY COMPENSATION TO THE OWNER OF THE DAMAGED VEHICLE.

A MAN FROM WABUSH, WHO APPEARED BEFORE THE MAGISTRATE IN JANUARY CHARGED WITH STEALING A NECK TIE FROM AYRE'S LTD., WABUSH, WAS ORDERED TO SIGN A BOND TO APPEAR IN THREE MONTHS TIME FOR JUDGEMENT. HE APPEARED AT THE APPOINTED TIME AND THE MAGISTRATE DISMISSED THE CHARGE AGAINST HIM.

A MAN FROM WABUSH WAS CHARGED WITH ASSAULT BY HITTING ANOTHER MAN IN THE FACE WITH HIS FIST, IN THE TAVERN OF THE SIR WILFRED GRENFELL HOTEL IN WABUSH. THE DEFENDANT WAS REPRESENTED BY A LAWYER, MR. ALFRED PIKE FROM ST. JOHN'S. AFTER HEARING MANY WITNESSES BOTH FOR THE DEFENDANT AND THE COMPLAINANT, THE CASE WAS DISMISSED.

A RESIDENT OF LABRADOR CITY LIVING IN ONE OF THE BUNK HOUSES WAS CHARGED WITH STEALING SOME OF THE CONTENTS OF HIS ROOM, THE PROPERTY OF THE IRON ORE COMPANY OF CANADA. HE WAS CONVICTED OF THE CHARGE AND WAS FINED \$75.00 OR 30 DAYS IMPRISONMENT

A YOUNG MAN FROM LABRADOR CITY WAS CHARGED WITH UNLAWFULLY HAVING IN HIS POSSESSION, DISHWARE AND SILVERWARE, THE PROPERTY OF CRAWLEY AND MCCrackEN OF LABRADOR CITY. HE WAS CONVICTED OF THE CHARGE AND WAS FINED \$50. OR 1 MONTH IMPRISONMENT. HE WAS FURTHER CHARGED WITH UNLAWFULLY HAVING IN HIS POSSESSION SHEETS AND PILLOWCASES, THE PROPERTY OF THE IRON ORE COMPANY OF CANADA. HE WAS FINED A FURTHER \$50 OR 1 MONTH IMPRISONMENT.

THE USUAL NUMBER OF TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS WERE HEARD AND DEALT WITH ACCORDINGLY.

CONCERT BAND

COMING TO LABRADOR CITY ARENA ON MAY 10TH. - WATCH FOR FURTHER DETAILS

AS PART OF ITS PARTICIPATION IN THE CELEBRATION OF CENTENNIAL YEAR, THE ROYAL CANADIAN MOUNTED POLICE, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF THE NORTHWEST TERRITORIES, WILL BE PRESENTING THE FORCE'S CONCERT BAND AT VARIOUS NORTHERN POINTS DURING THE MONTH OF MAY.

THE HISTORY OF THE 50 PIECE CONCERT BAND IS ALMOST AS OLD AS THE FORCE ITSELF. THE FIRST MUSICAL AGGREGATION WAS SET UP BY A VOLUNTARY GROUP IN 1876 AT SWAN RIVER, MANITOBA AND THE INSTRUMENTS FOR IT WERE HAULED IN BY DDG TEAM FROM WINNIPEG. DURING THE WINTER OF 1901 ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER Z.T. WOOD PERSONALLY ORGANIZED A BAND AT DAWSON CITY IN THE YUKON. HOWEVER DUE TO THE TRANSFER OF MEMBERS FROM THE YUKON AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE GOLD RUSH, THIS MUSICAL AGGREGATION WAS DISBANDED.

NOTHING MORE IS HEARD OF A FORCE BAND UNTIL 1938 WHEN COMMISSIONER S. T. WOOD, SON OF THE FOUNDER OF THE DAWSON BAND, AUTHORIZED THE FIRST OFFICIAL RCMP BAND. IT WAS INAUGURATED IN NOV. OF THAT YEAR AND COMPRISED MEMBERS FROM ALL ACROSS CANADA, AS IT STILL DOES. OVER THE YEARS THIS 45 MEMBER UNIT HAS PERFORMED IN BOTH LARGE CITIES AND SMALL HAMLETS THROUGHOUT CANADA AND ON MANY OCCASIONS HAS VISITED CITIES IN THE UNITED STATES.

POSSIBLY THE EARLIEST CDN. POLICE DANCE ORCHESTRA WAS FORMED SPONTANEOUSLY AT SWAN RIVER, MANITOBA IN 1876 WHEN THE FIRST ROYAL CANADIAN MOUNTED POLICE BAND WAS ORGANIZED THERE. IT IS RECORDED THAT A POLICE DANCE ORCHESTRA DID PARTICIPATE IN ONE OF THE MOST GLITTERING OCCASIONS OF THAT ERA IN OCT. 1889, WITH THE VISIT OF GOVERNOR GENERAL STANLEY OF PRESTON, LATER THE EARL OF DARBY, AND LADY STANLEY TO THE TERRITORIES. THE MUSICIANS, ALL MEMBERS OF THE REGINA RCMP BAND WERE BROUGHT TO CALGARY FOR THE OCCASION AND A GRAND BALL WAS HELD IN THE FASHIONABLE CPR HOTEL. DURING THE 2ND WORLD WAR THE DANCE ORCHESTRA PLAYED AT MANY ARMED SERVICE DANCES AND ENTERTAINED THE TROOPS. THE PRESENT RCMP DANCE BAND IS UNDER THE DIRECTION OF CST. D. PENNELL.

THE NORTHERN TOUR WILL CONSIST OF APPEARANCES IN FORT SMITH, YELLOW-KNIFE, WHITEHORSE, INUVIK, CAMBRIDGE BAY, FROBISHER BAY, GOOSE BAY AND LABRADOR CITY. THIS WILL BE THE FIRST OF MANY TOURS FOR THE BAND DURING CENTENNIAL YEAR. ON JUNE 1ST TOGETHER WITH THE MISICAL RIDE, THE BAND WILL TOUR ALL OF CANADA WITH THE EXCEPTION OF BRITISH COLUMBIA, CLIMAXING WITH A TWO WEEK RUN AT EXPO IN MONTREAL.

THE CONCERTS WILL CONSIST OF A BRILLIANT FANFARE OF TRUMPETS, TRADITIONAL MARCH TUNES, INSTRUMENTAL AND VOCAL SOLOISTS, SONGS BY THE CHORUS AND COMPOSITIONS ESPECIALLY WRITTEN FOR CENTENNIAL YEAR.
