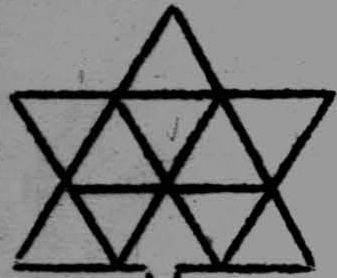

REPORT FROM THE LABRADOR CITY CITIZENS COMMITTEE

EARLY IN APRIL A 4 PAGE LETTER FROM THE CITIZENS COMMITTEE, UNDER THE CHAIRMAN OF MR. BILL HOGAN, WAS DISPATCHED TO THE PREMIER, J. R. SMALLWOOD. COPIES OF THIS LETTER WERE ALSO SENT TO MR. CHARLES R. GRANGER (MINISTER OF LABRADOR AFFAIRS), MR. A. CHATWOOD, (M.P. GRAND FALLS-WHITE BAY-LABRADOR) AND MR. THOMAS BURGESS (M.H.A.). IN THE LETTER 8 MATTERS WERE BROUGHT FORWARD FOR THE CONSIDERATION OF THE PREMIER.

RADIO & TELEVISION - IT WAS POINTED OUT, THAT THE LOCAL RADIO KEPT US ALL WELL INFORMED OF THE SPORTS, ROAD & WEATHER CONDITIONS, POLITICS ETC. PERTAINING TO THE MARITIMES (AND ALMOST EVERY OTHER PROVINCE IN CANADA - EXCEPT NEWFOUNDLAND). WITH TELEVISION, THE COMMITTEE COMPLAINS VIGOROUSLY THAT PROGRAMMES DEALING WITH CIVIC AFFAIRS - FEDERAL AND PROVINCIAL ELECTIONS ARE USELESS, WHEN BROUGHT TO US WEEKS AND WEEKS AFTER THE ELECTION HAS BEEN WON AND LOST.

COST OF LIVING - THE COMMITTEE STATES THAT RESIDENTS OF THIS AREA ARE VICTIMS OF EXPLOITATION AND HAVE ALREADY MADE THEIR PRESENTATION TO THE ROYAL COMMISSION ON FOOD AND DRUGS.

PUBLIC HEALTH - THE MATTER OF UNDER STAFFED HOSPITAL - BEAUTIFUL AND ADEQUATE BUILDING THAT IT MAY BE, WAS BROUGHT UP. ADEQUATE DENTAL SERVICE, PUBLIC HEALTH AND WELFARE SERVICE, AMBULANCE SERVICE, A HOSPITAL CANTEEN, AND FINALLY, FULL AND REGULAR INSPECTION OF PUBLIC EATING PLACES.

ROADS - THE NEED OF A HIGHWAY TO SERVICE OUR AREA, THE PRESENT INTER-CITY ROAD BEING KEPT IN A BETTER STATE OF REPAIR, ALSO THE EXISTING ROADS SUCH AS THE DULEY LAKE ROAD AND THE JAVELIN ROAD COULD BE SERVICED WITH PICNIC GROUNDS AND PARKS.

COMMUNICATION THE LACK OF ADEQUATE TELEGRAPH SERVICE WAS STATED. A TELEGRAM CAN NOT BE SENT OR RECEIVED ON WEEK-ENDS OR AFTER REGULAR OFFICE HOUR.

EDUCATION THE COMMITTEE WOULD LIKE INFORMATION ON THE MATTER OF THIS DISTRICT BEING DECLARED A SCHOOL TAX AREA, AS RECENTLY OBSERVED IN A PUBLIC NOTICE IN THE ST. JOHN'S PAPER.

TAXES WHAT DO WE GET IN RETURN FOR THE HIGH INCOME TAXES PAID IN OUR AREA, THE COMMITTEE ASKS. THEY FLATLY STATE THAT THE ANSWER TO THIS IS NOTHING.

TRANSPORTATION IS E.P.A. THE ONLY AIRLINE IN CANADA THAT DOES NOT OFFER A FAMILY PLAN?

THE LETTER CONCLUDES WITH THE REQUEST THAT A FULL INVESTIGATION BY A ROYAL COMMISSION OR REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DEPT. OF LABRADOR AFFAIRS BE MADE INTO THE PROBLEMS. IT IS FELT, THE COMMITTEE STATES, THAT THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT DOES NOT REALIZE WE EXIST, AND THEREFORE THE PROVINCE OF NFLD. AND LABRADOR SHOULD ASSIST IN THE ENDEAVOURS.

AS OF THIS DATE, REPLIES HAVE REACHED THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMITTEE.

-FROM THE PREMIER - HE PROMISES TO MEET WITH MR. GRANGER, BURGESS AND CHATWOOD TO DISCUSS THE POINTS RAISED AND WILL BE IN TOUCH AGAIN.

-MR. CHATWOOD'S REPLY, THE COMMITTEE FEELS WAS QUITE EVASIVE AND THUS THEY WERE DISAPPOINTED IN THIS ATTITUDE.

-MR. GRANGER'S LETTER, DEALT WITH EACH TOPIC AND STATED HOW IT WAS OR WAS NOT BEING HANDLED. HE WILL MAKE AN EARLY EFFORT TO MEET AND DISCUSS THE PROBLEMS WITH THE COMMITTEE.

-MR. BURGESS WAS IN TOUCH WITH MR. HOGAN BY PHONE, AND PROMISES TO DO WHAT IS POSSIBLE UNDER HIS AUTHORITY.

TO THESE REPLIES THE COMMITTEE HAS IN TURN ANSWERED, AND WILL CONTINUE TO KEEP UP THE CORRESPONDENCE UNTIL ACTION IS TAKEN.

A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

DEAR COMRADES,

NO DOUBT THAT YOU HAVE SEEN IN THIS PAPER EACH WEEK THE PAGE CONTAINING THE NEWS OF OUR BRANCH IN LABRADOR CITY, AND YOU WOULD BE SURPRISED AT THE NUMBER OF COMMENTS I HAVE RECEIVED CONCERNING THIS, SUCH AS, "I DIDN'T KNOW THAT YOUR BRANCH WAS SO ACTIVE", OR, "I HAD NO IDEA YOU WERE DOING SO MUCH FOR THE COMMUNITY". YES, THESE ARE TYPICAL OF THE THINGS PEOPLE ARE SAYING, FOR THE SIMPLE REASON THAT UNTIL RECENTLY VERY FEW KNEW WHAT WAS BEING DONE BY OUR BRANCH, AND THAT GOES FOR SOME OF OUR MEMBERS. I WOULD VENTURE TO BET THAT IF SOME OF OUR MEMBERS WERE ASKED WHAT OUR OBLIGATIONS TO OUR FELLOW MEMBERS AND THE COMMUNITY WERE, THEY WOULD NOT BE ABLE TO TELL YOU - WHICH MEANS THAT A LARGE PERCENTAGE ARE NOT REGULAR ATTENDERS AT OUR MONTHLY MEETINGS, AND THIS IS A GREAT PITY FOR WHEN WE JOINED THE LEGION EACH AND EVERY ONE OF US PLEDGED OURSELVES TO 'EVER STRIVE BY ALL PROPER MEANS TO PROMOTE THE WORK OF THE ORGANIZATION' SO THAT THE DEPENDENTS OF OUR COMRADES WHO LAID DOWN THEIR LIVES OR WHO MAY BE DISABLED WILL NOT BE FORGOTTEN.

IT IS NOT ENOUGH COMRADES THAT WE PAY OUR YEARLY DUES, THIS WOULD NOT GO VERY FAR IN THE MAINTAINANCE OF THIS GREAT ORGANIZATION. NO DOUBT THOSE OF YOU WHO SERVED IN THE WARS REMEMBER HOW IT WAS, AND LIKE MYSELF OFTEN WONDERED, WHY IT WAS THAT I WAS LEFT AND MY BEST FRIEND KILLED. I HAVE DECIDED ON THIS ANSWER - WE WERE LEFT FOR A PURPOSE COMRADES, AND THAT PURPOSE WAS TO SEE THAT THE MOTHERS, WIVES AND CHILDREN OF OUR COMRADES WHO WERE NOT SO FORTUNATE WOULD BE LOOKED AFTER. ARE WE FORGETTING THESE OBLIGATIONS? WHAT HAS HAPPENED? HAS THE PASSING OF THE YEARS DULLED OUR MEMORY? HAS THE SCENE OF THE BATTLEFIELD BEEN OBLITERATED BY OUR OWN PROBLEMS? MAYBE WE HAVE FORGOTTEN THE PROMISES WE MADE TO A DYING COMRADE, IF SO, LET US RENEW THAT PROMISE RIGHT NOW AND MAY WE EVER PRAY.

THIS YEAR WE HAVE ANOTHER OBLIGATION TO MEET, THIS, AS YOU KNOW IS CENTENNIAL YEAR AND THE ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION HAS TAKEN AS OUR CENTENNIAL PROJECT, THE RAISING OF ONE MILLION DOLLARS TO BE SET ASIDE AS A MAINTAINANCE FUND FOR THE LEGION. AS YOU MAY HAVE SEEN IN YOUR MARCH ISSUE OF THE 'LEGIONARY' ONLY \$436,000 HAS SO FAR BEEN RAISED. WE, AT BRANCH #47 HAVE A QUOTA OF APPROXIMATELY \$680.00 - SO FAR WE HAVE NOT BEEN SUCCESSFUL IN RAISING THIS AMOUNT, WHICH AMOUNTS TO ABOUT \$4.00 PER MEMBER, WHICH ISN'T VERY MUCH AND IT WOULD BE A SHAME IF THIS BRANCH WERE UNABLE TO MEET THIS OBLIGATION, AFTER ALL WE ARE LIVING IN A COMMUNITY OF FULL EMPLOYMENT, AND IT DOES SEEM A BIT RIDICULOUS TO THINK THAT WE CANNOT AFFORD \$4.00 NO, I DO NOT THINK THIS IS THE REASON FOR NON PAYMENT, I WOULD RATHER BELIEVE THAT IT IS JUST A MATTER OF FORGETTING OR NOT MAKING THAT 'SPECIAL EFFORT' TO DROP IN AT THE LEGION OR PUTTING YOUR CHEQUE IN THE MAIL TO THE SECRETARY, P.O. BOX. 629, LABRADOR CITY. BY DOING SO, YOU WOULD BE MAKING SURE THAT THE OBLIGATION OF THIS GREAT CENTENNIAL PROJECT IS FULFILLED. LET US STAND UP AND BE COUNTED AS LEGIONNAIRS AND REMEMBER OUR PROMISE -

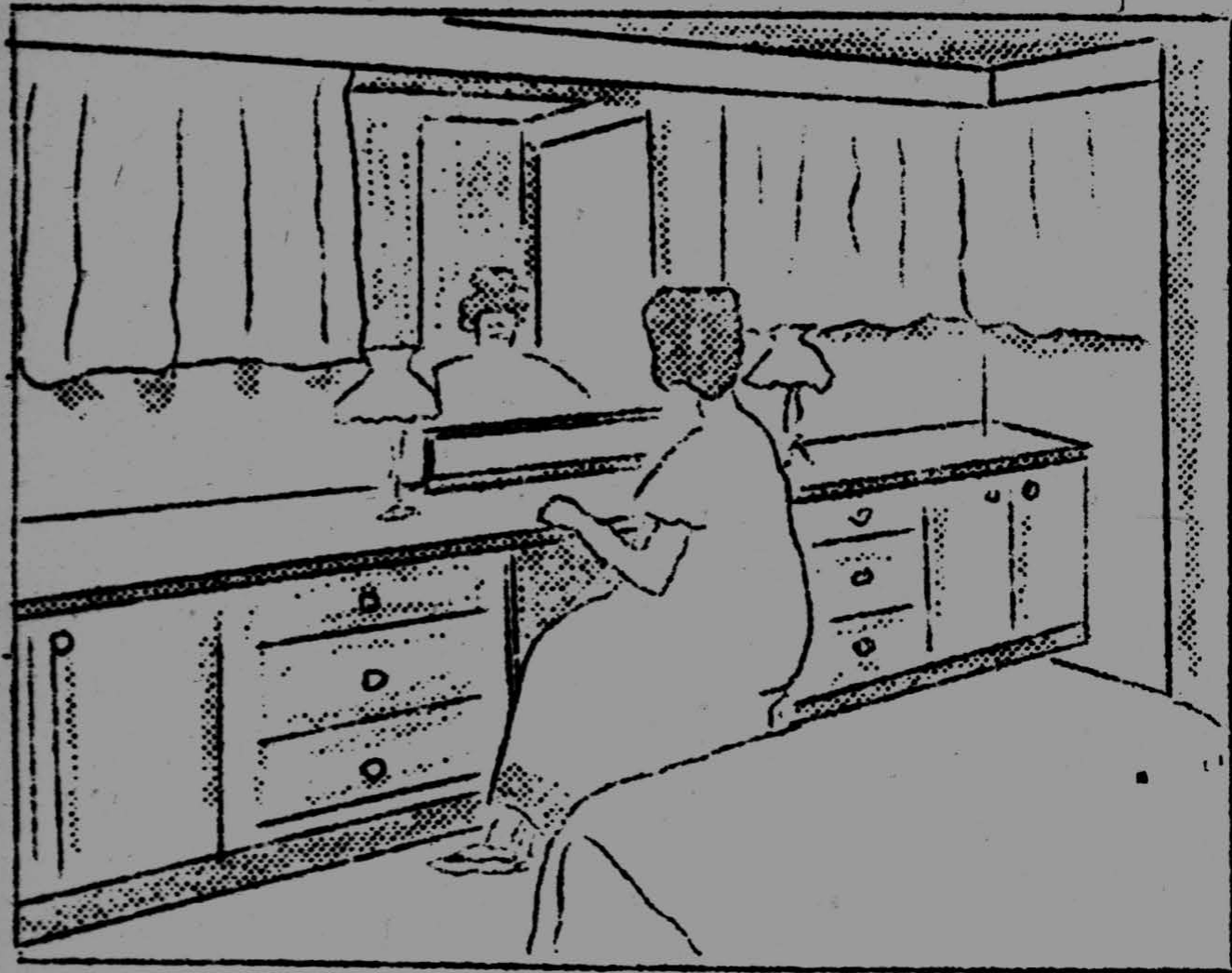
