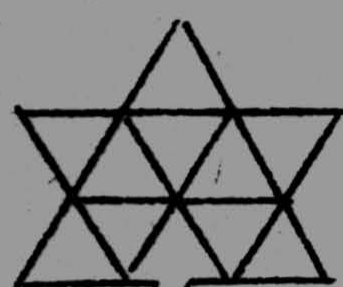

## CENTENNIAL PROJECT GETS UNDERWAY

### FIRST GROUP OF STUDENTS OFF TO EXPO

THE SAD NEWS REACHED US THIS PAST WEEK-END OF THE DEATH OF PASTOR F. G. BURSEY, AGED 63, AS A RESULT OF A CAR ACCIDENT LAST MAY 1ST. PASTOR BURSEY, IS A NATIVE OF EMBREE, NFLD. AND LEAVES TO MOURN HIS WIDOW, 3 SONS AND 1 DAUGHTER. HE WAS ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT OF THE PENTECOSTAL ASSEMBLIES OF NFLD., AS WELL AS HOLDING THE POSITION OF SUPERINTENDENT OF THE CENTRAL DISTRICT OF NFLD., A POST WHICH HE HELD FOR 30 YEARS. HE WAS PASTOR OF DOTWOOD PENTECOSTAL CHURCH FOR 27 YEARS.

HIS BROTHER, PASTOR A. S. BURSEY, GENERAL SUPERINTENDENT OF PENTECOSTAL ASSEMBLIES OF NFLD. WAS HERE IN LABRADOR CITY WITH THE PRAYER CONVENTION, WHICH WAS HELD RECENTLY. THE FUNERAL FOR PASTOR F. G. BURSEY WAS HELD ON SUNDAY, AT THE DOTWOOD PENTECOSTAL CHURCH AND AN ESTIMATED 10,000 PEOPLE WERE IN ATTENDANCE.

## COURT      NEWS

A RESIDENT OF WADUSH WAS CHARGED WITH THE INDECENT ASSAULT OF ANOTHER MAN IN COURT AT THE BEGINNING OF THIS MONTH. HE WAS CONVICTED OF THE CHARGE AND GIVEN A SUSPENDED SENTENCE OF TWO YEARS, ORDERED TO SIGN A BOND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$500.00, TO ABSTAIN FROM ALCOHOL DURING THE PERIOD OF HIS SUSPENDED SENTENCE. HE WAS FURTHER ORDERED TO VISIT BOTH PROBATION OFFICE AND PSYCHIATRIC CLINIC WHEN REQUIRED TO DO SO.

A MAN FROM WADUSH LAKE WAS CHARGED WITH UNLAWFULLY DRIVING A MOTOR VEHICLE IN A MANNER THAT WAS DANGEROUS TO THE PUBLIC, ON THE AIRPORT ROAD AND IN THE WADUSH AREA ON THE 2ND MAY, 1967. HE WAS CONVICTED OF THE CHARGE AND WAS FINED \$200 OR 60 DAYS IMPRISONMENT. HIS DRIVER'S LICENCE WAS SUSPENDED FOR A PERIOD OF 18 MONTHS.

A MAN FROM MAKKOVIK, LABRADOR WAS CHARGED AND CONVICTED IN COURT AT LABRADOR CITY WITH INDECENT ASSAULT ON A FEMALE PERSON. HE WAS CONVICTED OF THE CHARGE AND WAS SENTENCED TO 6 MONTHS IMPRISONMENT.

A MAN FROM LABRADOR CITY WAS CHARGED WITH STEALING A PAIR OF PANTS FROM DOWRING BROS. STORE IN LABRADOR CITY. HE WAS CONVICTED AND WAS GIVEN A SUSPENDED SENTENCE OF TWO YEARS, ORDERED TO SIGN A BOND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$200. TO KEEP THE PEACE AND BE OF GOOD BEHAVIOUR.

A MAN FROM LABRADOR CITY WAS CONVICTED OF THE CHARGE OF TAKING AND USING A MOTOR VEHICLE WITHOUT THE OWNER'S CONSENT. HE WAS SENTENCED TO THREE MONTHS IMPRISONMENT. HE WAS FURTHER CHARGED WITH BEING IN CHARGE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE WHILE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL. HE WAS CONVICTED AND FINED \$100. OR 30 DAYS IMPRISONMENT AND WAS PROHIBITED FROM OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE ON A HIGHWAY IN CANADA FOR A PERIOD OF TWO YEARS

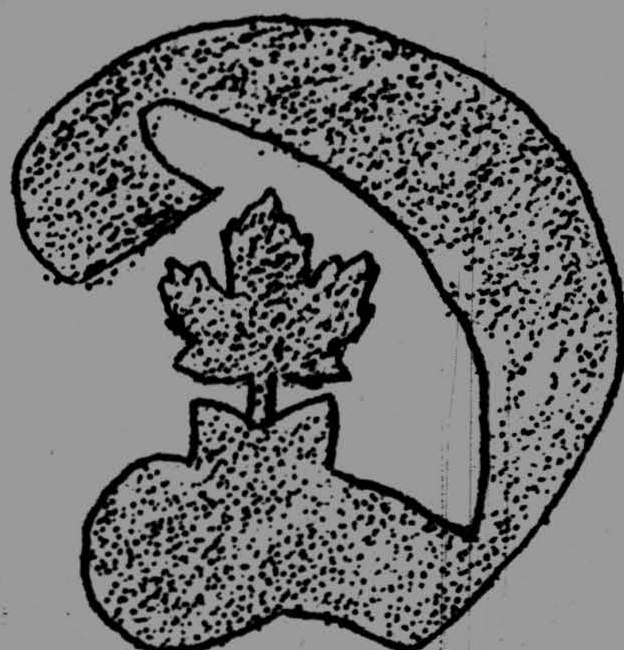
