Very shortly many of our daughters will be getting dressed in their very attractive brown or navy uniforms, in preparation to attend a Brownie or Girl Guide meeting - as another year gets underway! A glimpse into the guiding programme may be appropriate at this time.

The aim of the Girl Guides of Canada - Guides du Canada, is to assist girls in the formation of character, by encouraging them to be responsible citizens of their country and the world. Guiding is open to those of every race, colour and creed; encouraging each girl to carry out her many obligations to her own faith and showing her how her spiritual life can find practical expression.

Guide activities are based on a broad, graduated series of tests for which badges are awarded. Brownies are the youngest members from age 7 - 10; Girl Guides age 10 - 14; Rangers age 14 - 18; Cadets age 16 - 21; members of the Trefoil age 18 - 23 and many adult members. It might be interesting to note that the 1965 census showed 211,500 Guides, 31,000 adult members in Canada alone:- these figures show the tremendous growth.

Here in Labrador City we are mainly concerned with Brownies and Guides. At present there are 3 Brownie packs and 2 Girl Guide Companies. During the summer a number of our girl guide daughters attended camp either at Trinity, Nfld; or at the Wabush Lake site - which afforded them an opportunity to gain practical experience in camping skills. Actually there are many fine aspects. Our daughters are having fun growing into womanhood - well prepared to be self reliant, courteous, and yes optimistic too - as a guide is taught to smile and sing under difficulty.

THE STORY OF 'THE PRAYING HANDS'

Albert and Franz Durer were brothers who lived in Germany 400 years ago and although very poor both wanted to be artists.

One day the younger one, Albert, said to his brother - "I've had an idea - I'll work as a labourer, pay for your training, then when you are finished, you can do the same for me".

Franz however disagreed, for knowing that his brother was by far the better artist, he insisted on Albert studying first.

So it was. For years Albert studied under the finest masters of the day, while Franz toiled to pay the cost.

Years passed and then at last Albert returned to tell his brother that now at last he would be able to go.

Silently Franz held up his hands. No longer the hands of an artist but the hands of a workman so gnarled by years of labour that they could hardly hold a pencil.

Albert stared and without a word put his arms around his brother's shoulders. " Franz, I can repay you in only one way - I shall draw a picture that will speak to men's hearts - a picture of these hands of sacrifice and love."

Today, 400 years later, the picture of the praying hands is, of course, known the world over - immortalised in a brother's tribute.

SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP SOUFFLE OMELETTE

3 EGGS
½ oz BUTTER
3 tbsps. MILK OR WATER

JAM
CASTER SUGAR

METHOD

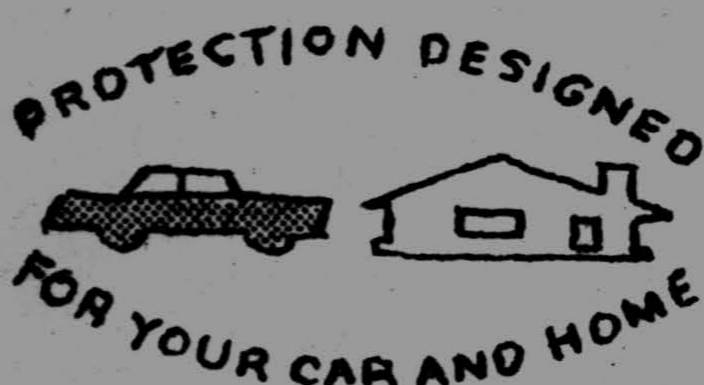
Separate eggs; melt butter in pan and heat without browning, whisk egg whites stiffly, beat yolks until creamy. Add liquid to yolks. Fold egg whites carefully into the yolks, then pour mixture

into prepared pan. Smooth mixture over and cook until golden-brown underneath. Brown top under a hot grill.

Loosen the omelette, pour hot jam on to it and fold over. Sprinkle with sugar before serving. Stewed fruit may replace the jam if desired.

For Apricot Souffle Omelette: Add the grated rind of an orange or tangerine to egg yolks. Spread thick apricot pulp over omelette just before folding it, and sprinkle liberally with sugar.

MEMORIAL UNIVERSITY EXTENSION SERVICE

COURT NEWS

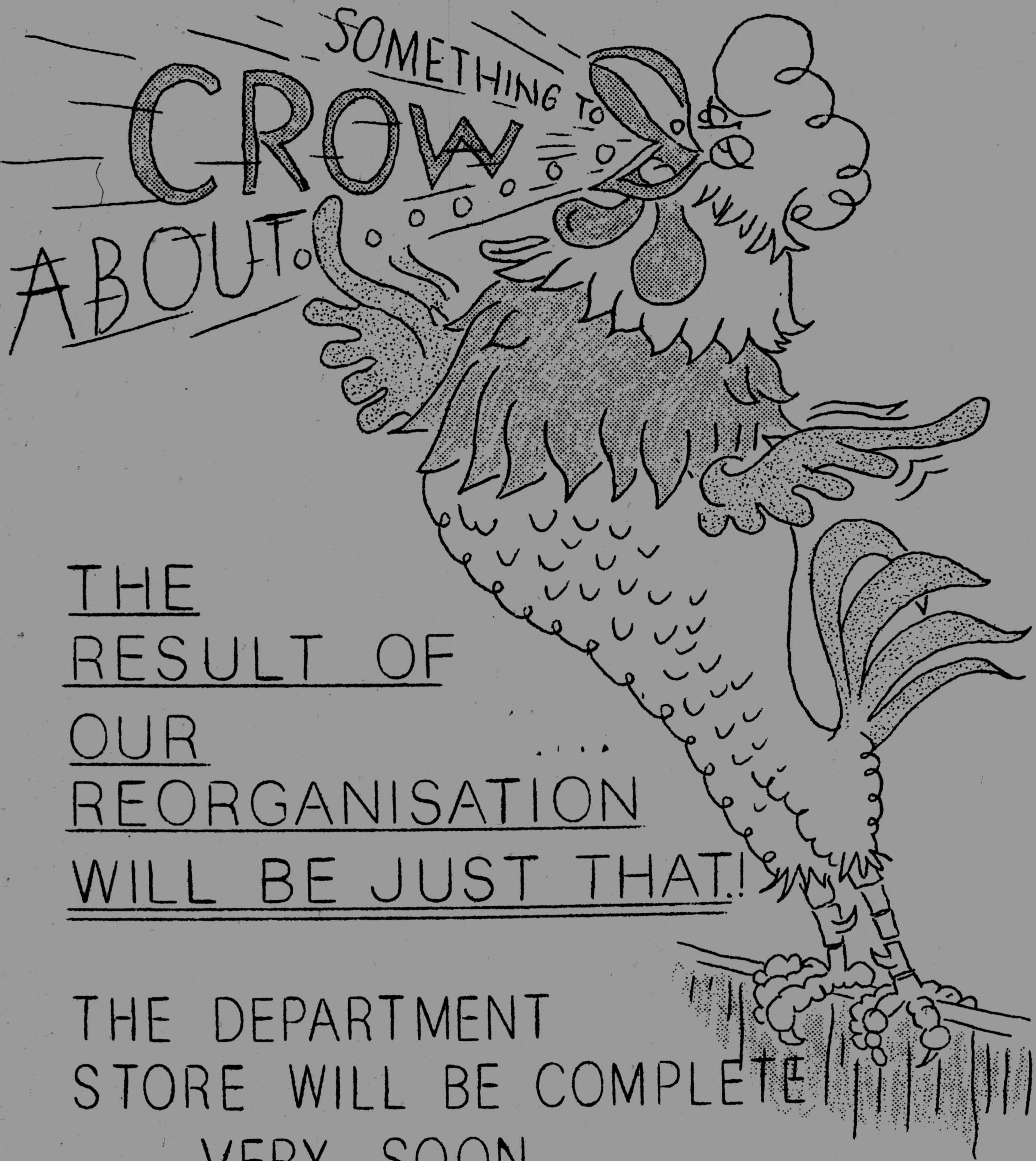

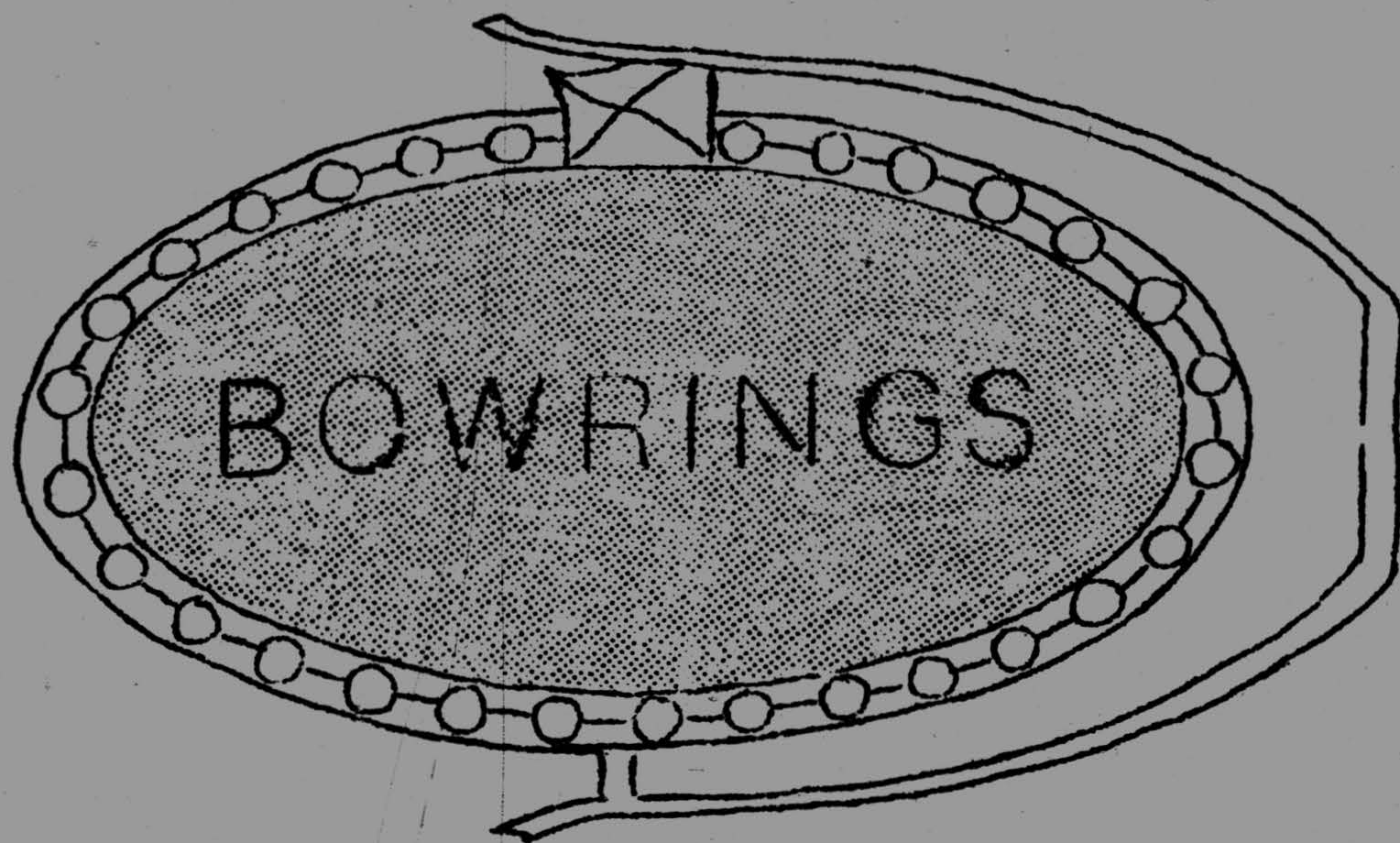
