## DON'T TAKE YOUR HEALTH FORGRANTED

A joint BCG Vaccination programme and mass chest X-ray survey is scheduled for Labrador City & Wabush this fall.

Conducted by the Department of Health in conjunction with the Newfoundland Tuberculosis Association, the programme will begin on Sept. 11th. when two nurses from the Department of Health will begin BCG Tuberculin Testing the school children at Labrador City, and later at Wabush and Twin Falls. Separate clinics will be held for pre-school children and these will be announced later.

Late Sept. or early in Oct. an X-ray team will arrive to X-ray Positive Reactors to the BCG test and will offer FREE chest X-rays to all adults.

BCG is a vaccine which raises the body's resistance to tuberculosis, and it is hoped that parents will see that all their children receive the BCG test and if necessary have them vaccinated, and to have a chest X-ray themselves when the unit arrives.

## FACTS ABOUT THE BCG VACCINATION PROGRAMME AND THE DISEASE IT PROTECTS YOU AGAINST.

Vaccination with BCG protects you child against TB. Infants as well as older children should receive BCG to build up their resistance to the disease. Parents should make sure that ALL their children receive the skin test during the BCG programme.

Tuberculosis is caused by a germ- it is not inherited- the disease is spread from person to person and is easiest to cure when it is found in an early stage and treatment is begun immediately. Years ago people thought TB as a hopeless, hereditary disease but today we know that it is not inherited and that it CAN BE CURED.

Tuberculosis kills more Newfoundlanders than all the other contagious diseases combined but modern community-wide and group X-ray surveys are making valuable contributions to the prevention and control of tuberculosis in this Province. New drugs and advanced surgery techniques have greatly reduced the TB death rate and shortened the treatment period but even so there are many unknown cases of active tuberculosis in this Province. Most of these people look and feel healthy, for TB has no outward symptoms in its early stages and a chest X-ray is the best known method of detecting early symptomless TB.

AN ANNUAL PHYSICAL EXAMINATION, including a chest X-ray, is a good way to prevent TB from getting the 'upper hand' for although ranking among infectious disease as a cause of death, is nevertheless a disease which can be PREVENTED and can be CURED. Tuberculosis attacks people in all walks of life, of all races, all physical types and all economic levels. Becoming more and more a disease of persons in the older age group, it can attack at any age, in Canada middle-aged and older men are the most prone to attack.

The GERM which causes tuberculosis can attack any of the body tissues but its most frequent location is in the lungs with more than eight out of ten cases being pulmonary.

IN THE MASS TB SURVEY OF LABRADOR CITY AND WABUSH EVERY CHILD WILL BE OFFERED THE PROTECTION OF BCG AND EVERY ADULT A CHEST X-RAY. SO PROTECT YOUR FAMILY AGAINST TB, DON'T TAKE YOUR HEALTH OR THE HEALTH OR YOUR FAMILY FORGRANTED.

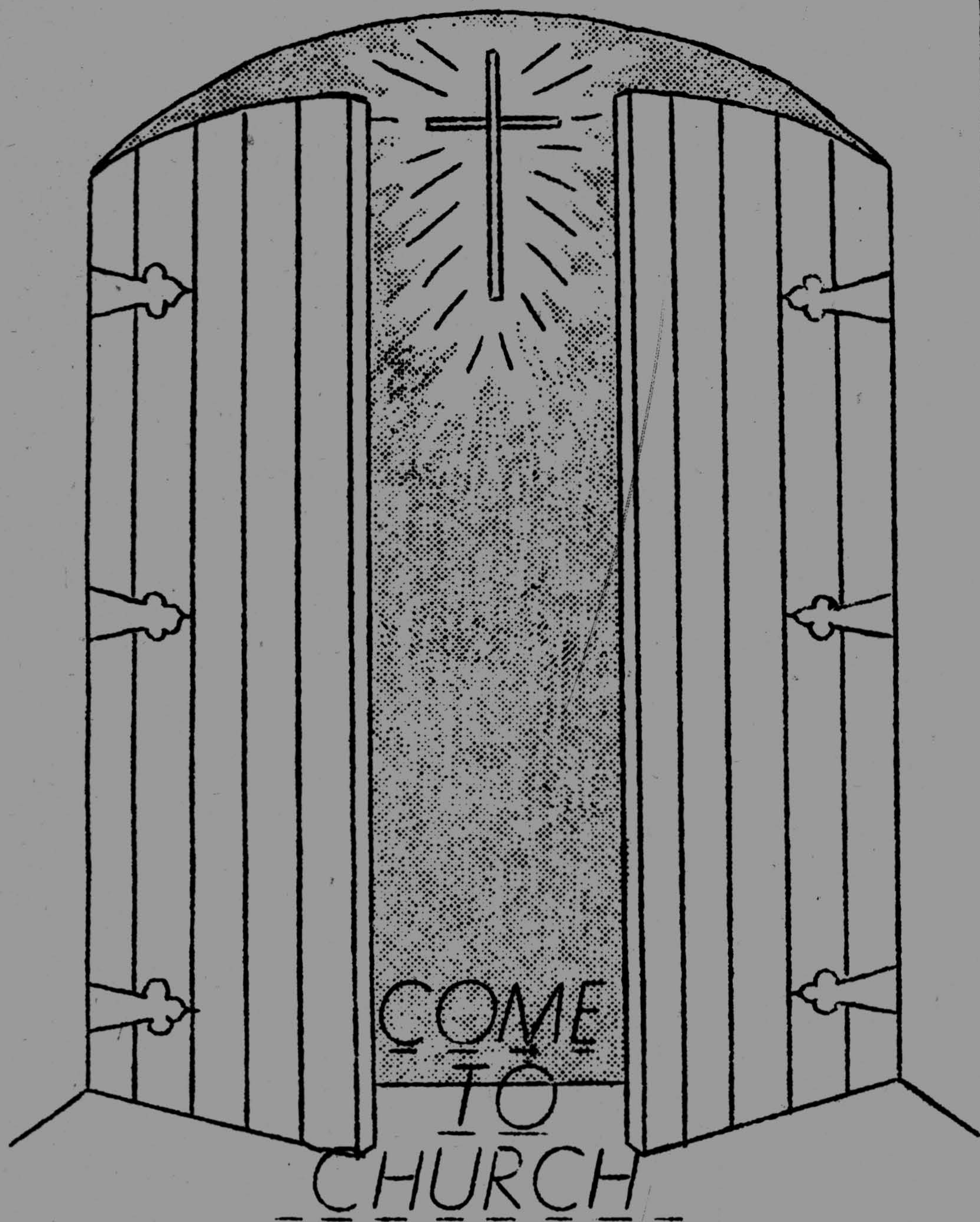

METHOD. (include ham or tongue if poss.)

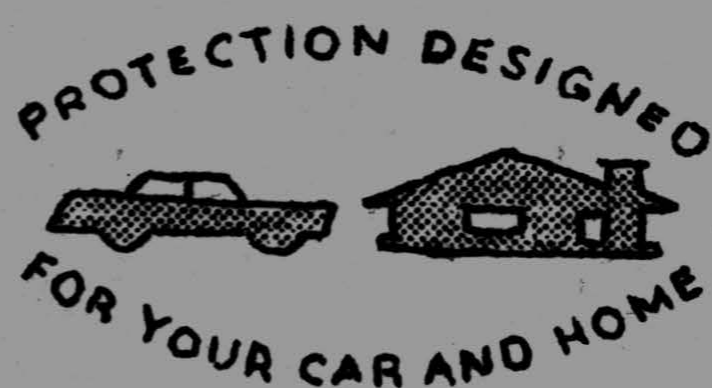
