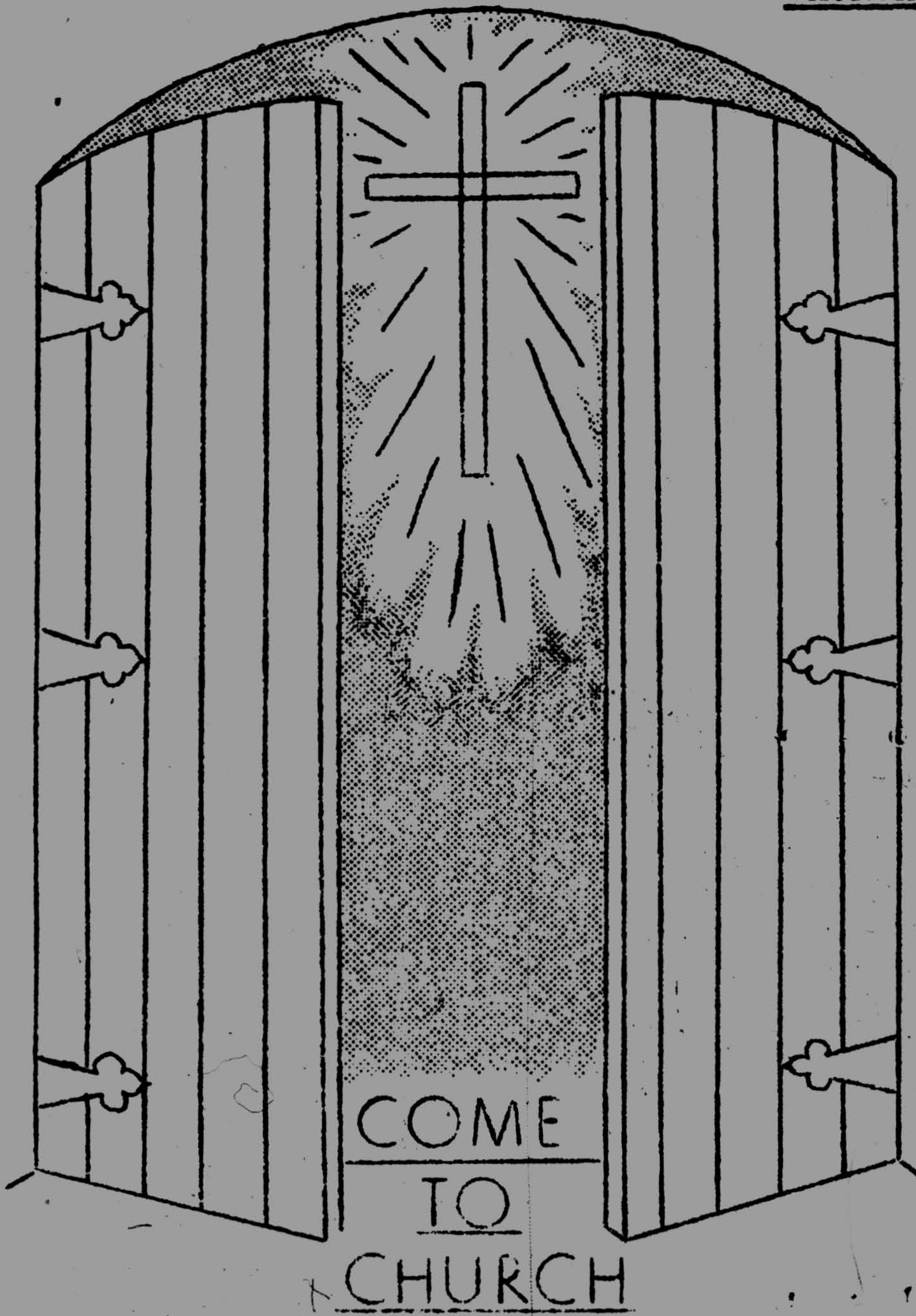

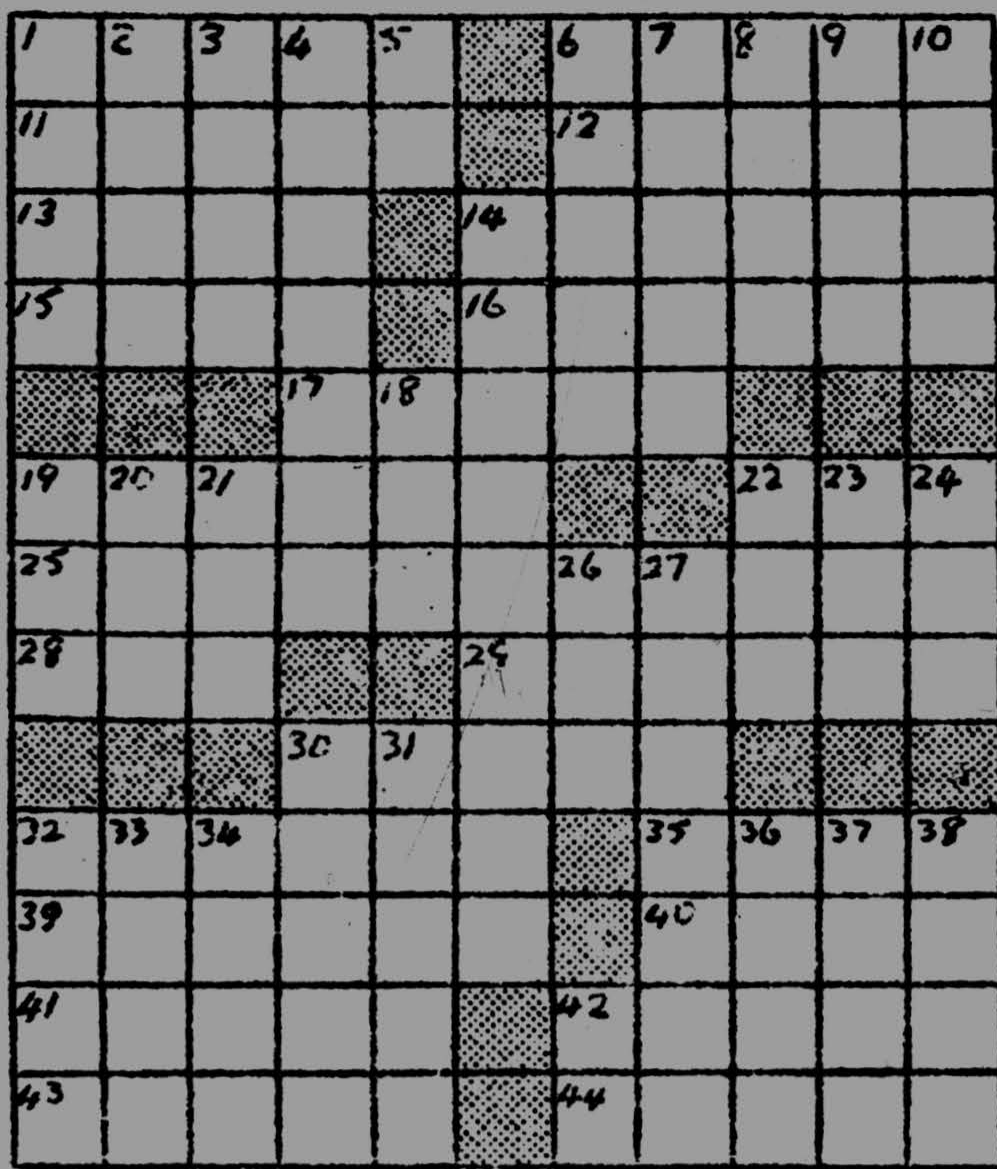
What shall we take through the Gateways of the Year ?

X-WORD PUZZLE



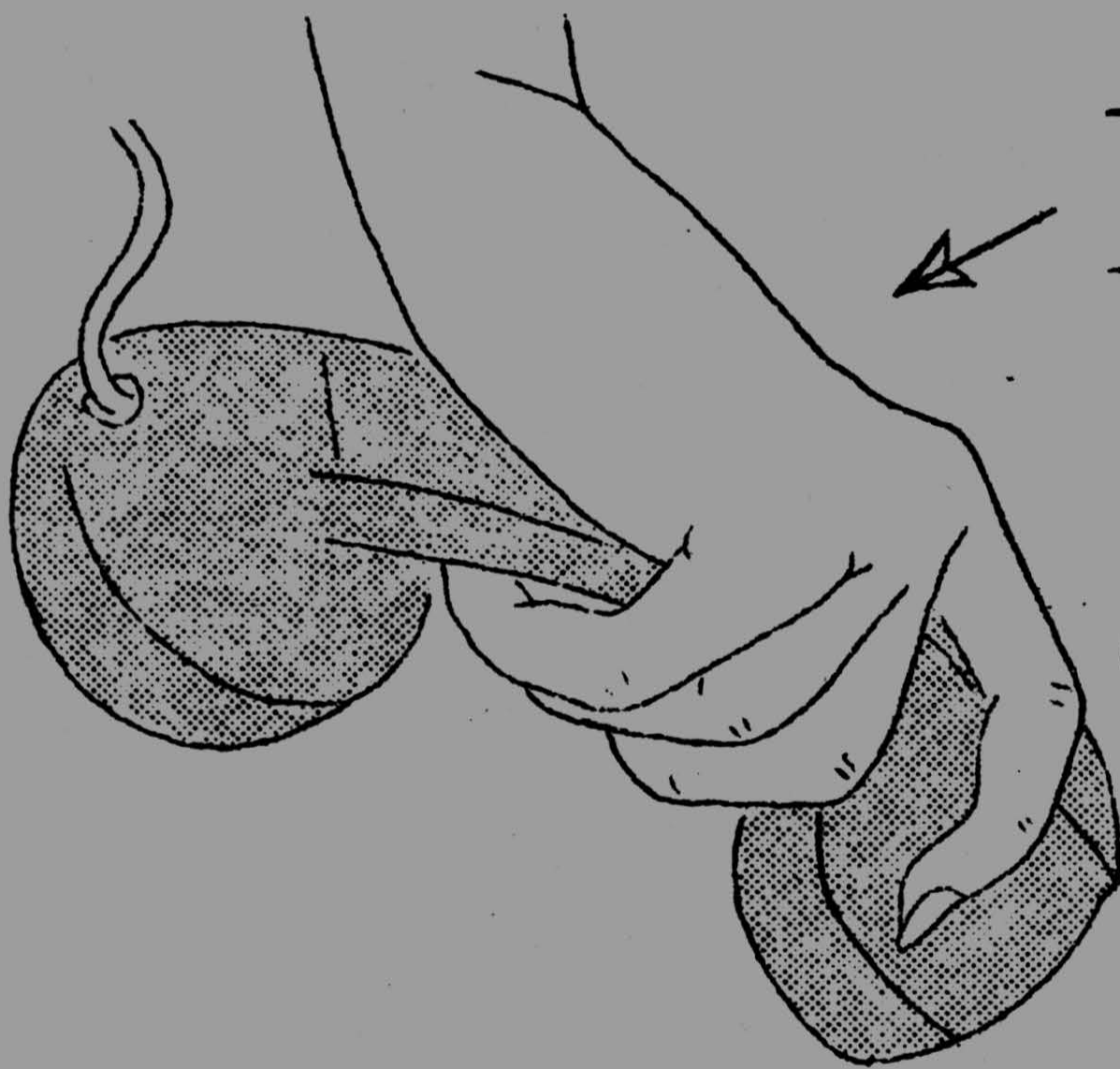
