This is one time in the year when residents can throw off the businessman's look and instead carry a relaxed expression both at home and on the job. Dress for the carnival is strictly casual with fun and laughter being the order of the day.

We have come a long way in Labrador City since that first carnival. The number of families and homes have increased 500%. Facilities for carnival use have sprung up three-fold, and most important we have found ourselves as a real community. There is a solidarity in Labrador City at present that never existed before. Residents are becoming more permanent, thus they are looking for outlets to burn up excess energy and use their leisure time. Once a year, for two weeks the Winter Carnival provides this outlet.

Last year the Carol Merchants Association took over the organizing and running of the carnival and for a first effort did a tremendous job. The average person knows very little about the time and work that goes into a carnival of this magnitude. When one considers it is on a voluntary basis with the individuals receiving nothing more than the personal satisfaction derived from a job well done, then the association deserves a lot of credit from you and I, as it is for our benefit they do it.

No matter how well a Winter Carnival is planned and organized, it can only be successful if the residents participate whenever and wherever possible.

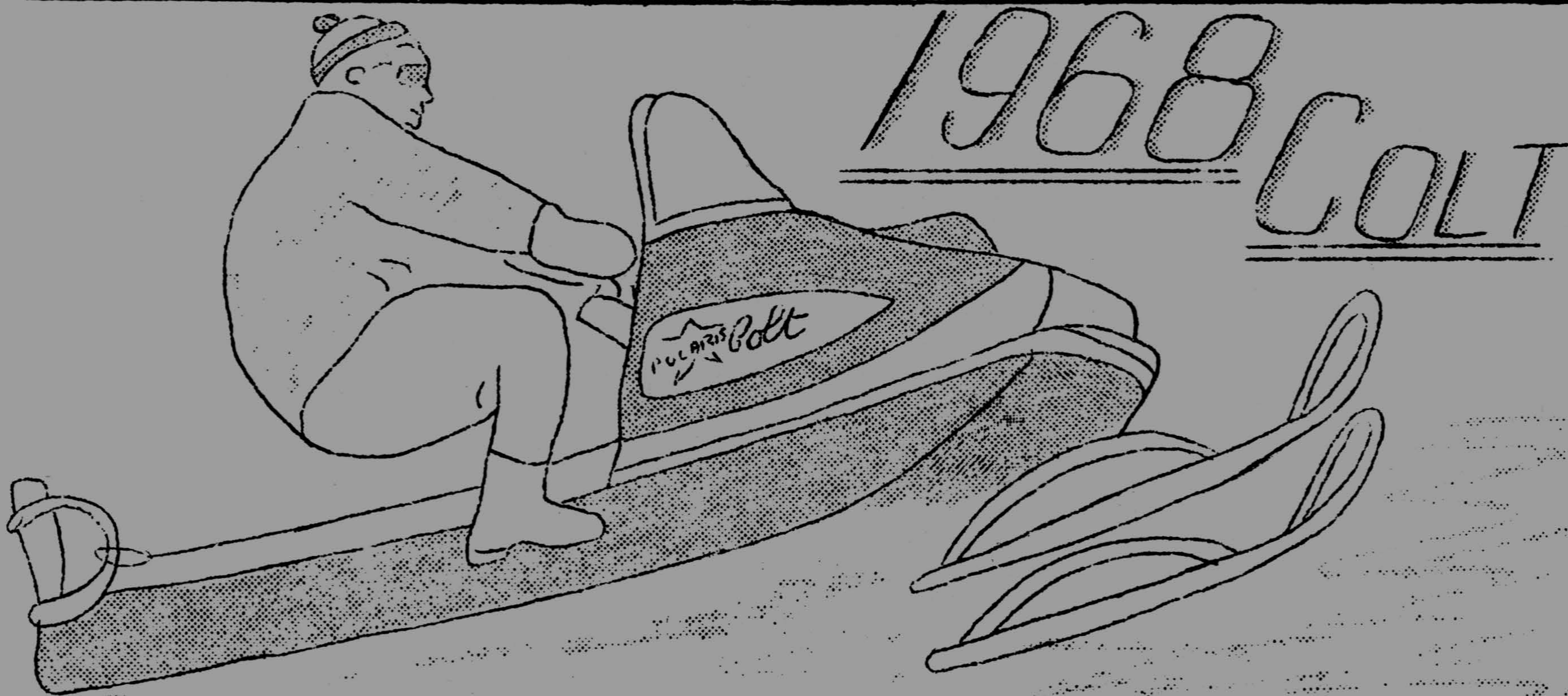

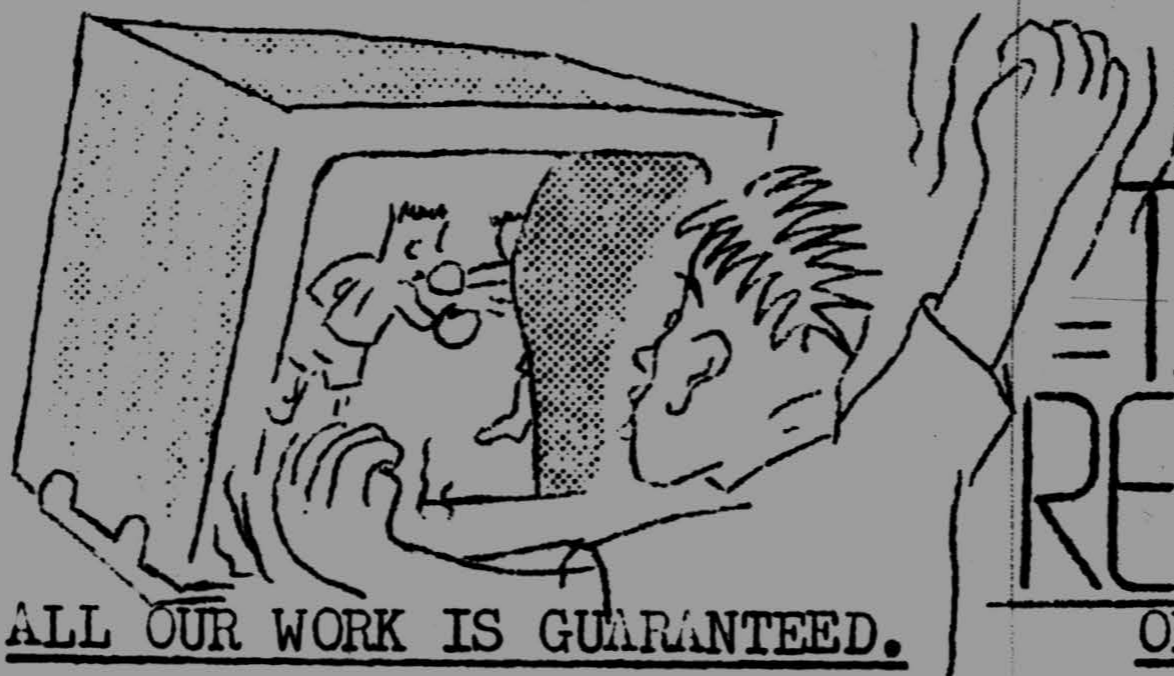

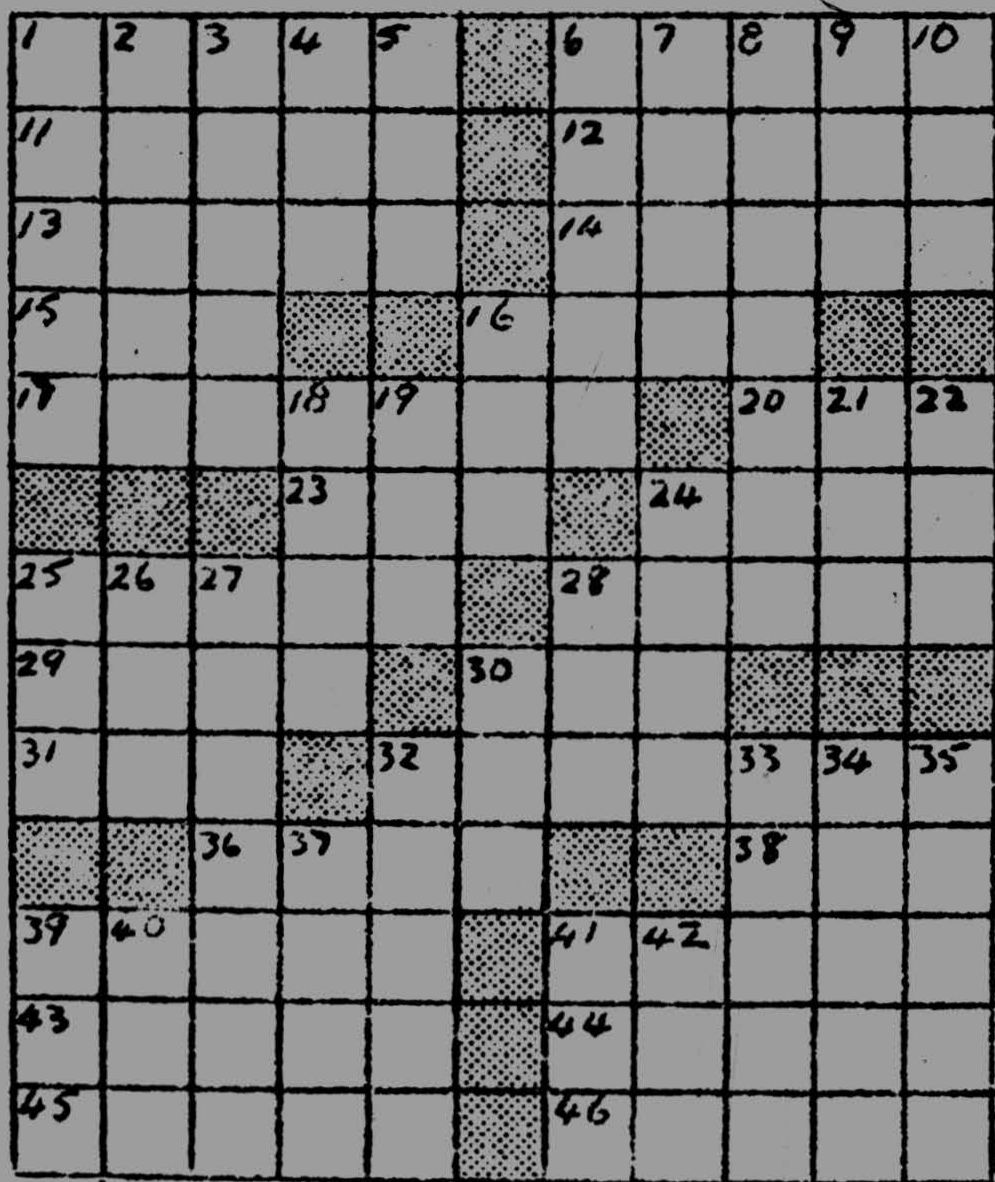

6 oz. self-raising flour PLUS 1 level
teasp. baking powder.
4 level teasps. baking powder
 $\frac{1}{2}$ level teasps. salt
 $\frac{1}{4}$ level teasps. pepper
2 oz Margarine or lard
3 oz grated cheese
2 oz rolled oats. 1 egg. About $\frac{1}{4}$ pint milk.

METHOD

Grease two baking trays. Sift flour, baking powder, salt and sugar. Add fat rub into flour. Mix in rolled oats and cheese. Add beaten egg with milk and mix firmly until dough is formed (not too sticky) Turn onto floured board, roll to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thickness, stamp into rings. Place on trays, brush with milk or beaten egg

BAKE: 10-15 mins. at 450°F.

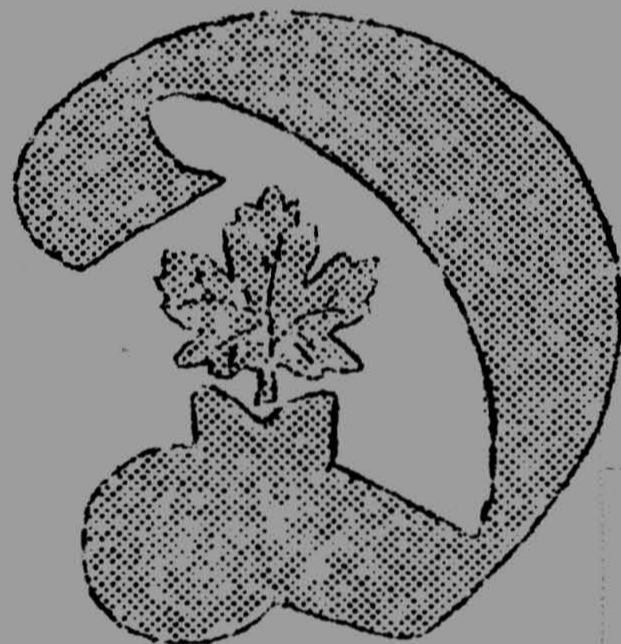

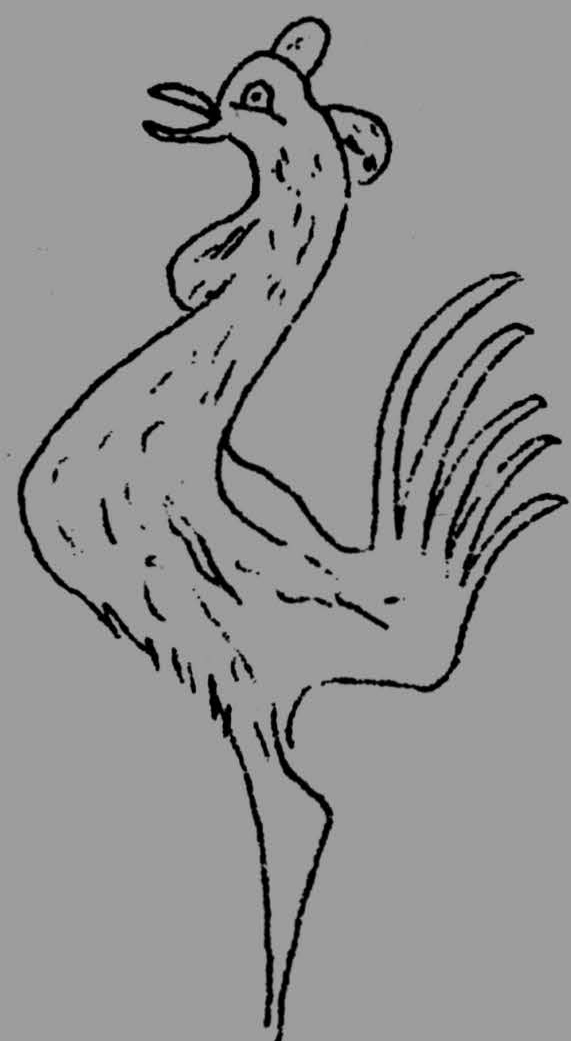
