- SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP -  
HOT CROSS BUNS

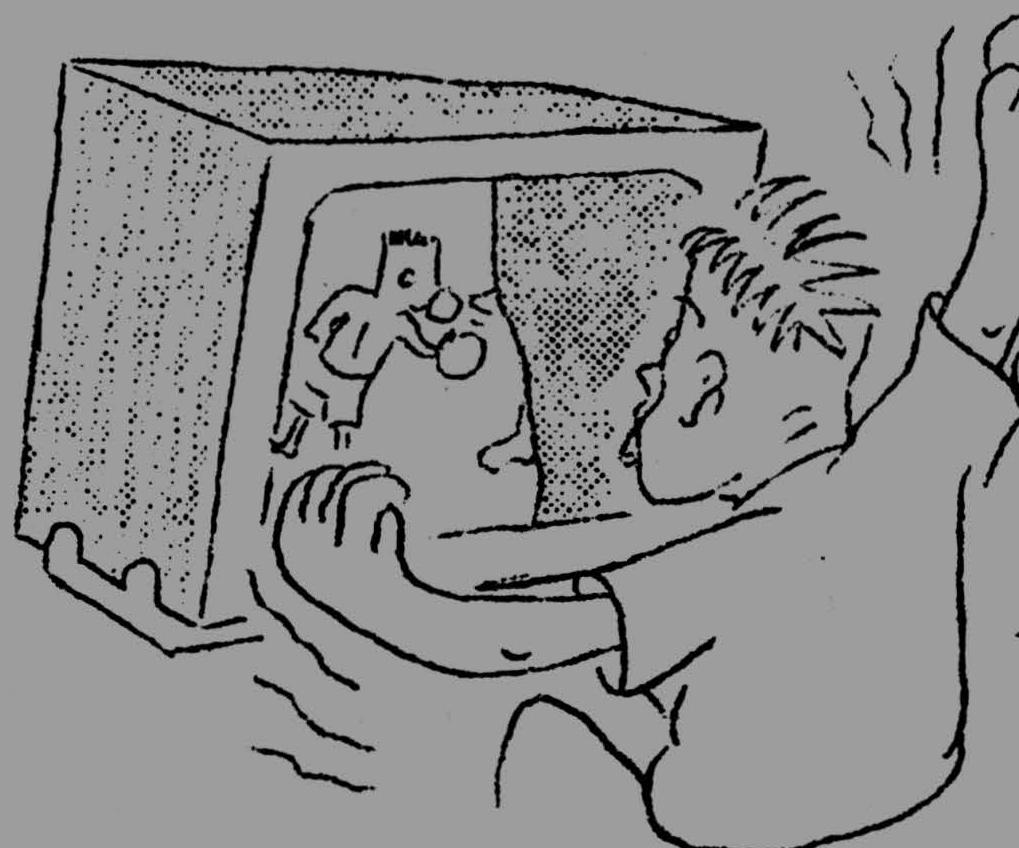
INGREDIENTS:

- 1 lb flour
- 1 level tsp. salt
- 1 oz. yeast
- 3 oz caster sugar
- 1/2 pint milk or milk and water (approx)
- 1/4 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp. grated nutmeg
- 4 oz currants
- 1 oz. chopped peel
- 2 oz. melted margarine
- 1 egg
- Milk and sugar to glaze.

METHOD

Sieve together flour & salt. Cream the yeast with 1 tsp. of the caster sugar, add tepid liquid, pour into well in centre of flour and sprinkle a little of the flour. Cover bowl and put in warm place for about 15 mins, till yeast begins to work. Add all ingredients, mix well, adding more milk if required. Cover, put in warm place for approx 1 hr, until double its bulk. Form dough into buns, put on greased tins and cut a cross in the top of each. Put to prove for 15 mins, then brush buns over with milk and sugar go glaze.

BAKE: in a hot oven (450° F. for about 15-20 minutes.
