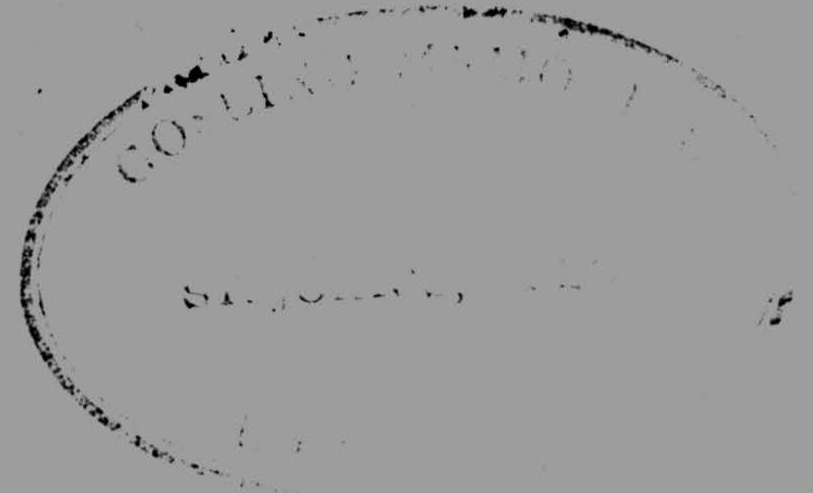

ESSENTIALLY A MAN OF PEACE, HE MET A VIOLENT DEATH IN MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE AT DUSK ON THURSDAY LAST.

ALL HIS LIFE, DR KING, SON OF A BAPTIST MINISTER HAD WORKED ONLY FOR THE GOOD OF HUMANITY, PREACHING LOVE AND BROTHERHOOD BETWEEN THE BLACK AND WHITE RACES. HE DIDN'T JUST SIT BACK WITH HIS ARMS FOLDED WISHING THE WORLD WAS A BETTER PLACE TO LIVE IN, LIKE SO MANY OF US ARE APT TO DO. INSTEAD HE 'GOT IN THERE' AND WITH INCREDIBLE ENERGY, WORKED WITHOUT REST TO MAKE HIS DREAM BECOME A REALITY. ROYAL CANADIAN SEA CADETS

Recently returned to Wabush is Leading Cadet, Deryck Collins who is acting Chief Petty Officer of R.C.S.C.C. "Labrador" the Sea Cadet Corp sponsored by Branch 47 of the Royal Canadian Legion in Labrador City.

Leading Cadet Collins looking bronzed and fit has just spent 10 weeks serving with the Royal Canadian Navy, aboard H.M.C.S. "St. Laurent" one of the latest destroyer escorts. The "St. Laurent" together with other units of the East Coast Fleet were taking part in exercise "Maple Spring '68" in Southern waters. During this time Collins visited San Juan, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands and New Orleans.

During his time on board he carried out part ship work, standing regular watch and station duties as an active member of the crew. He brought back a very good Divisional Assessment from his Divisional Officer.

Cadet Collins states that it was a wonderful experience and seems completely "sold" on the Navy. He advised all his fellow cadets to work hard and try to avail themselves of the same opportunity.

The R.C.N. as part of Cadet training regularly allots berths to selected cadets on their cruises. To be eligible cadets must have served 2 years with the Corp, be rated Leading Cadet or above, be 17 years old and must have at least one two week training period at Summer Camp.

This year, 6 cadets will be attending C.F.D. "Cornwallis" N.S. for 2 weeks summer camp and it is hoped that at least one senior cadet will be attending the 6 weeks Bosun's course. Cadet Collins is being recommended for the 6 week course on Practical Leadership.

THE CANADIAN RED CROSS SOCIETY OVER ONE AND A HALF MILLION ACTIVE YOUTH

There are, in Canada, today over one and a half million boys and girls, who are actively engaged in the humanitarian programmes of the Canadian Red Cross Society, Mr. Don Evely, Chairman of the Red Cross Youth Advisory Committee disclosed today.

In giving these figures, Mr. Evely said how proud he was to be associated with an organization which was doing such a great deal of work in eliminating suffering and helping the youth of the underdeveloped nations to help themselves and all this in addition to their activities on a local level in providing assistance for the less fortunate than themselves.

The administration costs of this programme are borne by the Red Cross Society. All the funds raised by the Junior members, themselves, are devoted to their work for youth here at home and abroad,

Pennies, nickles and dimes really mount up. Canadian Juniors raise about three hundred thousand dollars annually; with this money, they provide hearing aids, crutches, wheelchairs, dentures, heart surgery, special drugs, transportation to and from medical treatment centres and a variety of other forms of assistance for less fortunate children right here in Canada. Mr. Evely also pointed out that our Juniors are among the first to recognize that while charity begins at home, it does not end there.

They send health kits, school supplies, layettes, toys, technical help, medical assistance and cash grants to about thirty countries each year. It cost them about one hundred thirty thousand dollars. This is big money, but the money itself is only a means of expressing themselves.

Mr. Evely expressed the opinion that this is good citizenship in action and it is through Red Cross Youth that our children learn about this aspect of good citizenship. Mr. Evely said we take our hats off to the many thousand of school teachers, who carry on the Youth Programme in their classrooms.

- SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP -
EASTER BISCUITS

INGREDIENTS

4 oz butter
4 oz sugar
2 egg yolks
1 tsp. brandy
2 oz.currants
10 oz.flour
Egg white
Caster sugar

METHOD

Cream fat and sugar and beat in egg yolks. Add brandy
and fruit. Work in flour, with a very little milk if
needed to bind into a paste softer than pastry dough,
but possible to roll out. Prick, and cut into rounds
with a fluted cutter. Bake on a greased tin in a
moderately hot oven (400° F:) 15 - 20 minutes. After
10 minutes, brush cakes over with a little egg white
and dredge with caster sugar.

A LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Madam,

It is our earnest intention to reply to the rather slanderous remarks directed at the Newfoundland Labrador Amateur Basketball Association in the March 21st, 1968 issue of your paper and we hope that it is your policy to publish letters to the editor.

These cutting remarks of Mr. Winsor demand a reply from us. It seems to me that he, as a sporting gentleman, should have ascertained the facts before publicizing such an inference.

HERE ARE THE PRECISE FACTS:

The tournament was to open with all six teams in action Friday night. However, two teams (Baie Verte and Labrador City) requested that they not be scheduled until Saturday. This limited the draw and placed both teams into the first game on Saturday. If they had played Friday night, the maximum number of Saturday games would have been three.

With reference to Sunday play, the Torbay Recreation Centre is unavailable for competitive sport (Government policy). It was only through the action of the Minister of Provincial Affairs, Dr. Frecker, that we obtained the facilities for the championship game (s) on Sunday afternoon and such games had to be completed between the hours of one and five.

Thank you for informing us that Monday was a holiday. I am sure that all teachers, university students, and Bowater employees would be very happy to know that they had a holiday but still went about their business as usual.

Does Mr. Winsor think that the executive of the N.L.A.B.A. are living in oblivion? Does he think that all possibilities went uninvestigated? A perfect double elimination tournament had been planned by the N.L.A.B.A. for the weekend until an unfortunate change was requested and granted which necessitated Saturday's situation.

As for the ball control actions of Memorial University's basketball team, they were within Canadian Amateur Basketball rules, but certainly not within the spirit, as the tournament intended. However, these actions in no way condone the flagrant foul committed by a Labrador City player.

Incidentally, no one in sports pays much serious attention to comments of an individual who cannot spell FEILDLANS correctly.
