This coming Sunday March 12th will mark an important milestone in the life of two of the churches in Labrador City. The congregation of Carol United and St. Paul's Anglican Churches will be joining forces after their morning services to participate in a sod-turning ceremony for the new church they will be building together on the corner of Matthew and Hudson Drive in Labrador City.

Planning on the church which the two congregations will build and operate jointly began in June 1967 and construction work is scheduled to begin in June of this year. The building has been designed by Mr. William Brown of Brown, Parsons and Vivian in St. John's.

Services for the two congregations have been conducted in the area since the project began in the late fifties. Both are at present using separate church centres which will be converted into homes for the ministers in the near future. Ministers are the Rev. Leonard Whitten who has served St. Paul's Church for almost six years and the Rev. Eric Snider who has been with Carol United Church since August, 1966.

This is the first time in Canada that churches of two denominations have cooperated in the erection of a joint church building to be shared by two separate congregations.

The general public is invited to attend the sod-turning ceremony at 12:15 pm. this coming Sunday in the vacant lot beside Carol United Church.

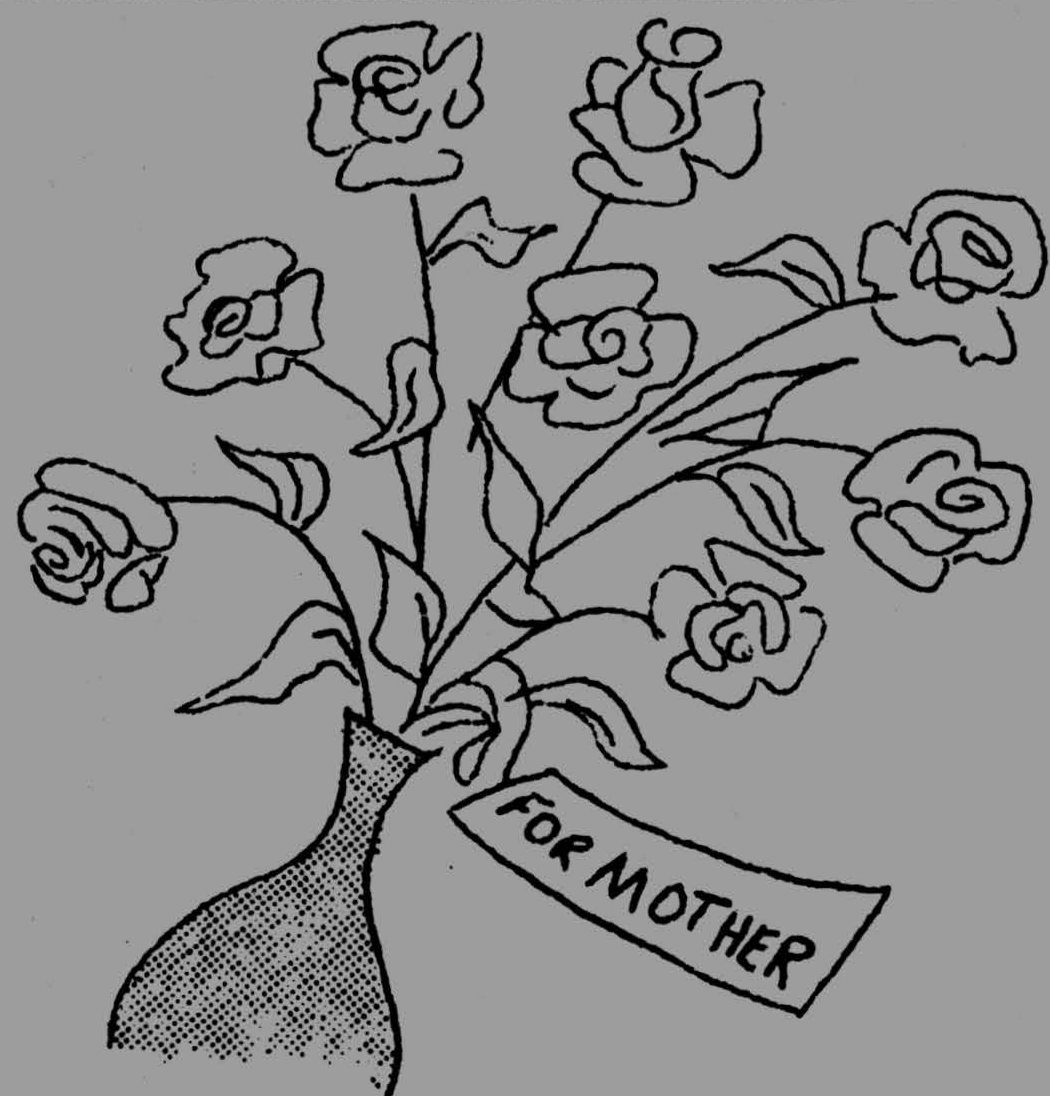

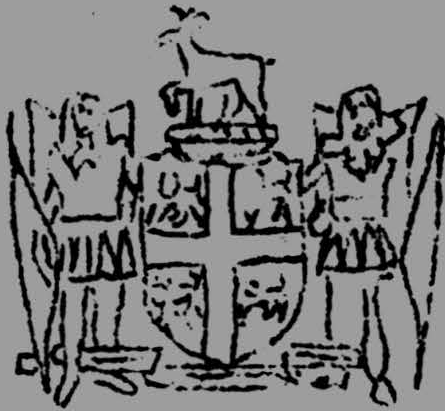

Under and by virtue of the powers conferred by the Minimum Wage Act, chapter 260 of The Revised Statutes of Newfoundland, 1952, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf and upon the recommendation of the Minister of Labour, His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following order.

ORDER

1. This ORDER may be cited as The Minimum Wage Order, 1968.
2. (1) In this Order
 - (a) "fish" means any fish and includes shellfish, crustaceans, marine animals and algae and any parts, products or by-products thereof;
 - (b) "private home" means a residence other than a place where board or lodging is provided for more than two persons for remuneration and as a business.
 - (c) "processing" includes cleaning, filleting, smoking, salting, icing, packing, canning, freezing, cooking, pickling, drying, curing, or preparing fish for market in any other manner; and
 - (d) "overtime" means
 - (i) with respect to employees who are assistants to whom the Hours of Work Act, 1963 applies, any period in excess of the working hours specified in subsection (1) of Section 6 of that Act, and
 - (ii) with respect to all other employees, any hour or part of an hour in excess of forty-eight (48) hours a week during which an employee is required to work or to be at the disposal of his employer.
- (2) For the purposes of this Order a person attains the age of sixteen years or nineteen years, as the case may be, on the day next before the sixteenth or nineteenth anniversary, as the case may be, of his birthday.
3. (1) Subject to subparagraphs (2) and (3) of this paragraph 3, this Order applies to every employer in the province who employs another person in any trade, industry, business or occupation and to every person so employed.
 - (2) This Order does not apply to persons employed in
 - (a) farming or market gardening; or
 - (b) domestic service in a private home.
 - (3) Paragraph 5 does not apply to the processing of fish on shore or in floating plants.
4. Subject to paragraph 5, an employer shall pay to
 - (a) a male employee over the age of nineteen years wages at a rate of not less than one dollar and ten cents (\$1.10) an hour;
 - (b) a female employee over the age of nineteen years wages at a rate of not less than eighty-five cents (85¢) an hour;
 - (c) a male employee over the age of sixteen years but not over the age of nineteen years wages at a rate of not less than seventy cents (70¢) an hour; and
 - (d) a female employee over the age of sixteen years but not over the age of nineteen years wages at a rate of not less than fifty cents (50¢) an hour.
5. An employer shall pay to an employee referred to in paragraph 4, for overtime, wages at a rate of not less than one and a half times the minimum rate applicable to such employee under that paragraph.
6. The minimum rates of wages prescribed by this Order apply to an employee whether he is paid on the basis of an hourly rate of pay or on the basis of a fixed wage for a week or a month or any part of a month.
7. Any reference in The Minimum Wage (Hotel and Catering Industry) Order, 1965 to the Minimum Wage (1963) Order is deemed a reference to this Order.
8. The Minimum Wage (1963) Order is revoked.
9. This Order shall come into effect on the 1st day of May, A.D. 1968.

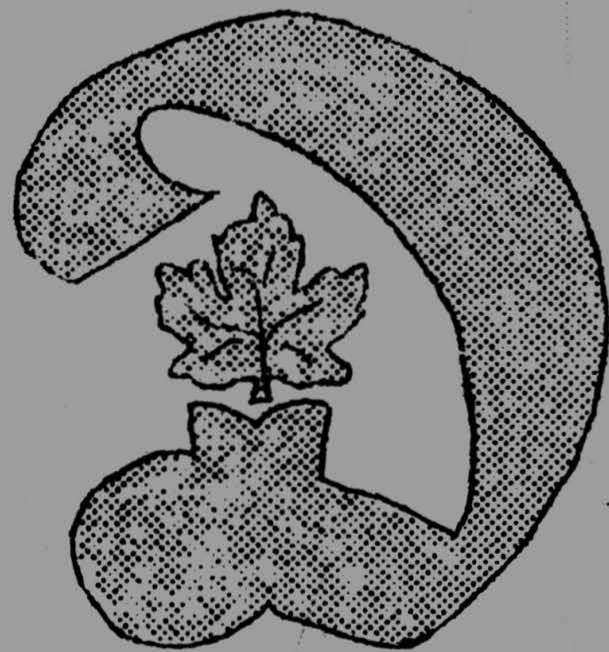
