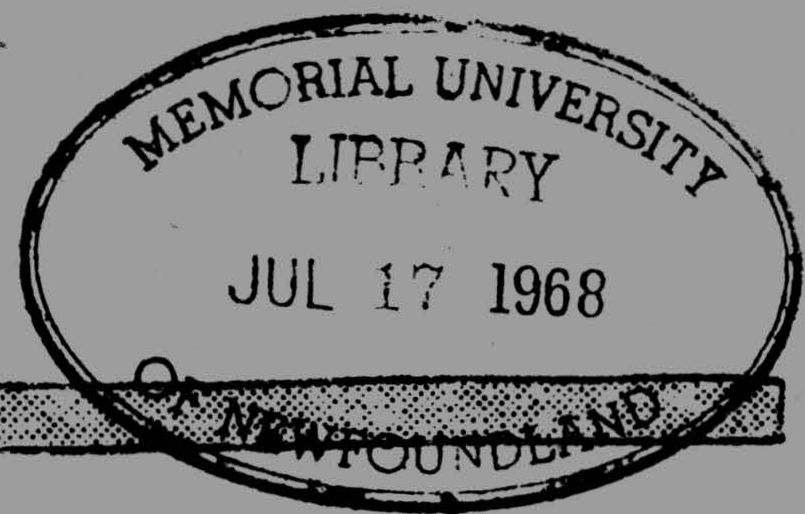

LOBSTER AU GRATIN

SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP

<u>INGREDIENTS</u>		<u>METHOD</u>
1 lobster	1/4 pint milk	Remove meat from lobster and mince it. Peel, slice and chop onion and mushrooms, and fry lightly in melted fat; add flour and lastly the milk, bring to boil, cook gently for 2 mins. Season well, add lobster and half cheese to this sauce. Reheat lobster then pile mixture into shells, sprinkle with rest of cheese and brown in a hot oven or under the grill. Serve immediately, garnished with lemon slices and watercress. Or serve in individual fireproof shells or dishes; grease containers, put in the mixture, brown under the grill and garnish.

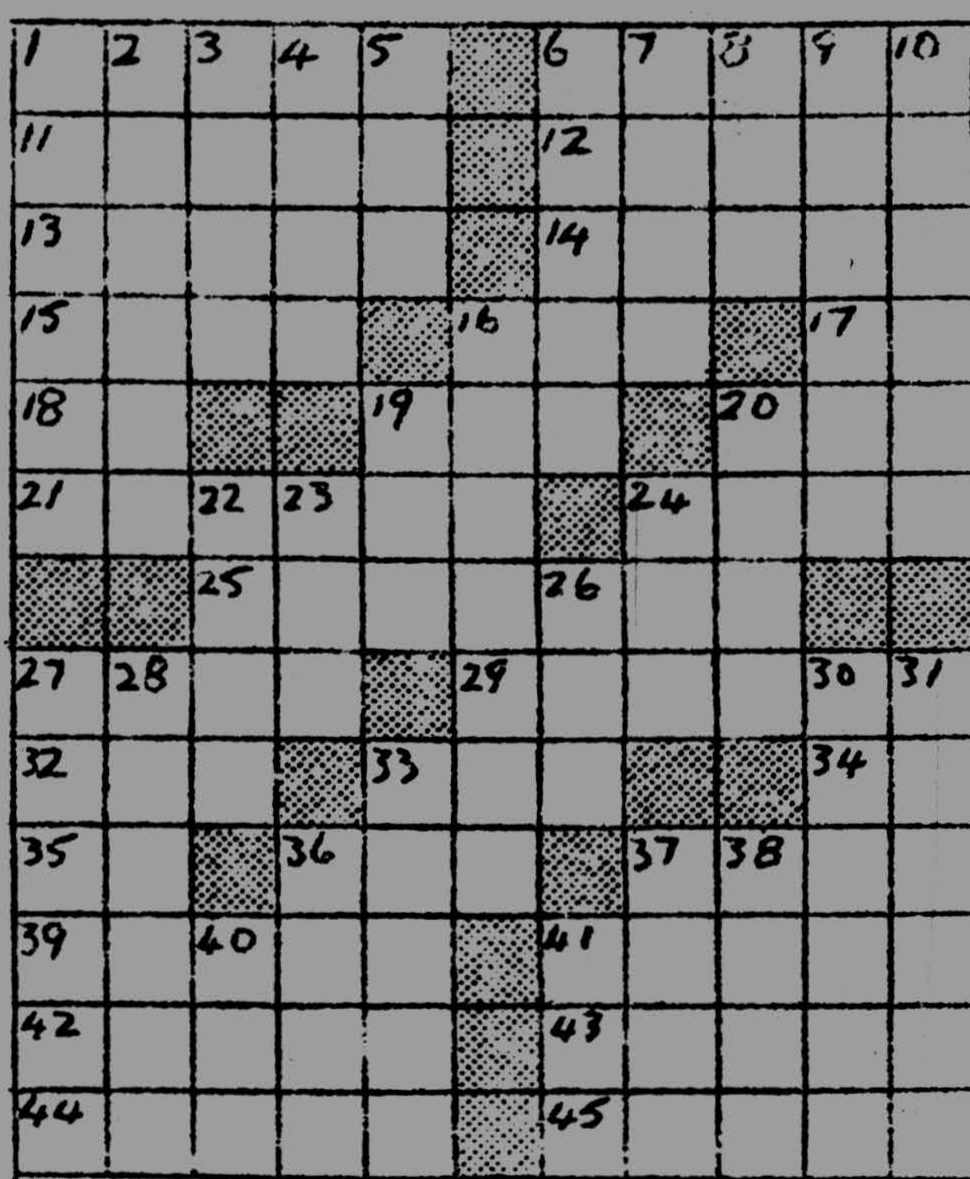

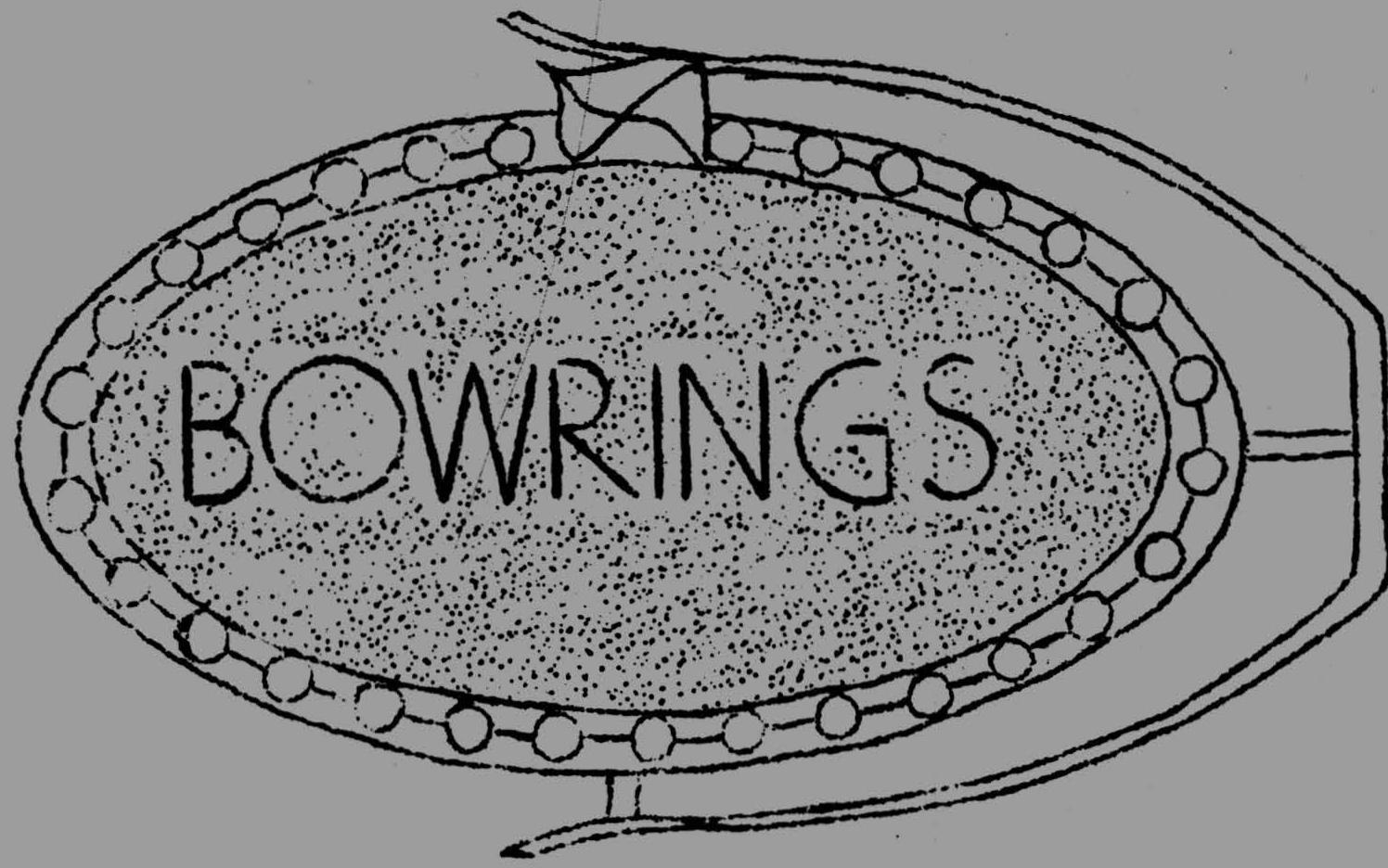
