JAMBOREE REPORT

On reporting to the parents and the interested public in general, on the 1st Arctic and Northern Jamboree, my first feeling is that I should apologize for the dirty condition in which the boys returned home. My second thought, how thankful I am that the parents did not see them on Saturday.

Our tents were pitched on a very dirty camping ground owing to the whole area being burned over six years ago. There was no vegetation, only six to eight inches of ashes then sand, so as you can well imagine, keeping clean was an impossibility.

Sunday and Monday nights were very cold and the boys and leaders who had not taken extra blankets were very uncomfortable. On Tuesday, however, we managed to obtain more blankets but by this time the weather had improved and it was much warmer.

The food was good and there was enough, but of course we did not have home cooking. Some of the boys didn't like this and others didn't like that, but I don't think anyone went hungry. One thing I am sure of we all thought often of mom's home cooking and appreciate it more than ever now.

The Jamboree was well planned, game and activity wise, unfortunately we did not receive the programme until the Monday after we arrived. All the other troops had theirs at least one month in advance and were better prepared. All the same we managed to get 4 first prizes. LOJNE BROWN won 1st prize for the largest pike (2.1bs-10 oz) EDWIN KNIGHT received a 1st prize for leatherwork, ALFRED NEBUCETT a 1st prize for his wood carving and RAYMOND BENNETT - 1st prize for platting. We also had some high scores on the rifle range.

Our drummers under the direction of Scouter Ron Walsh performed on Tuesday night in the Talent Show (which was held every night) and on Saturday they were asked to play again at the final show. They did very well and were greatly appreciated.

To my mind the camp was a real challenge for every boy and leader alike. There were boys we expected a lot from, but got very little and on the other hand some of our first year tenderfoot campers proved themselves to be real scouts, they were cheerful, obedient, always helpful and considerate. This of course is true of all camps and it's a pity that we only get the chance, once a year to take less than half our boys to camp.

However, I am quite proud of our boys and I think that Labrador City was well represented at the Jamboree. Our troop was as good as any bar none, we were told this by our Sub-camp chief, Tom Yates one morning at flag brake and it was quite a compliment.

Finally I would like to say 'thank you' from troop and leaders to all who helped to make this trip possible. An extra special 'thank you' to Mr. Paul Burchert and Skipper Joe Sheppard for without their help we would have been far less prepared than we were.

DRUDGERY by Patience Strong

I often think that drudgery is a blessing
in disguise - I'm sorry for the people with

The following statement was made today by the Hon. Dr. F. W. Rowe, Minister of Education.

I am very happy to be able to announce that the Department of Education has completed plans to begin broadcasting television programmes designed for use in the schools of this province and that arrangements have been made with the Division of Schools & Youth Programming of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation to produce three television series.

These programmes will be broadcast on the CBC. T.V. network each week from October 14 to May 23 of the coming school year. The three subjects to be telecast in the first year of this new venture are Beginning French, Art, and Physical Fitness. These subjects have been chosen to give teachers in primary and elementary schools assistance which normally can be obtained only from a specialist teacher.

Twenty-six programmes in each subject are being prepared by persons competent in the several subjects. These weekly telecasts, together with the follow-up work done under the direction of the classroom teacher, will provide a complete year's work in each of the courses.

The Department feels that these programmes can do much to enliven and enrich the programme of many of our schools. Earlier this year I announced a 25% subsidy to encourage boards to purchase classroom television sets. It is hoped that many boards will provide the necessary equipment for their schools to make full use of school television programming as it is progressively developed by the Department.

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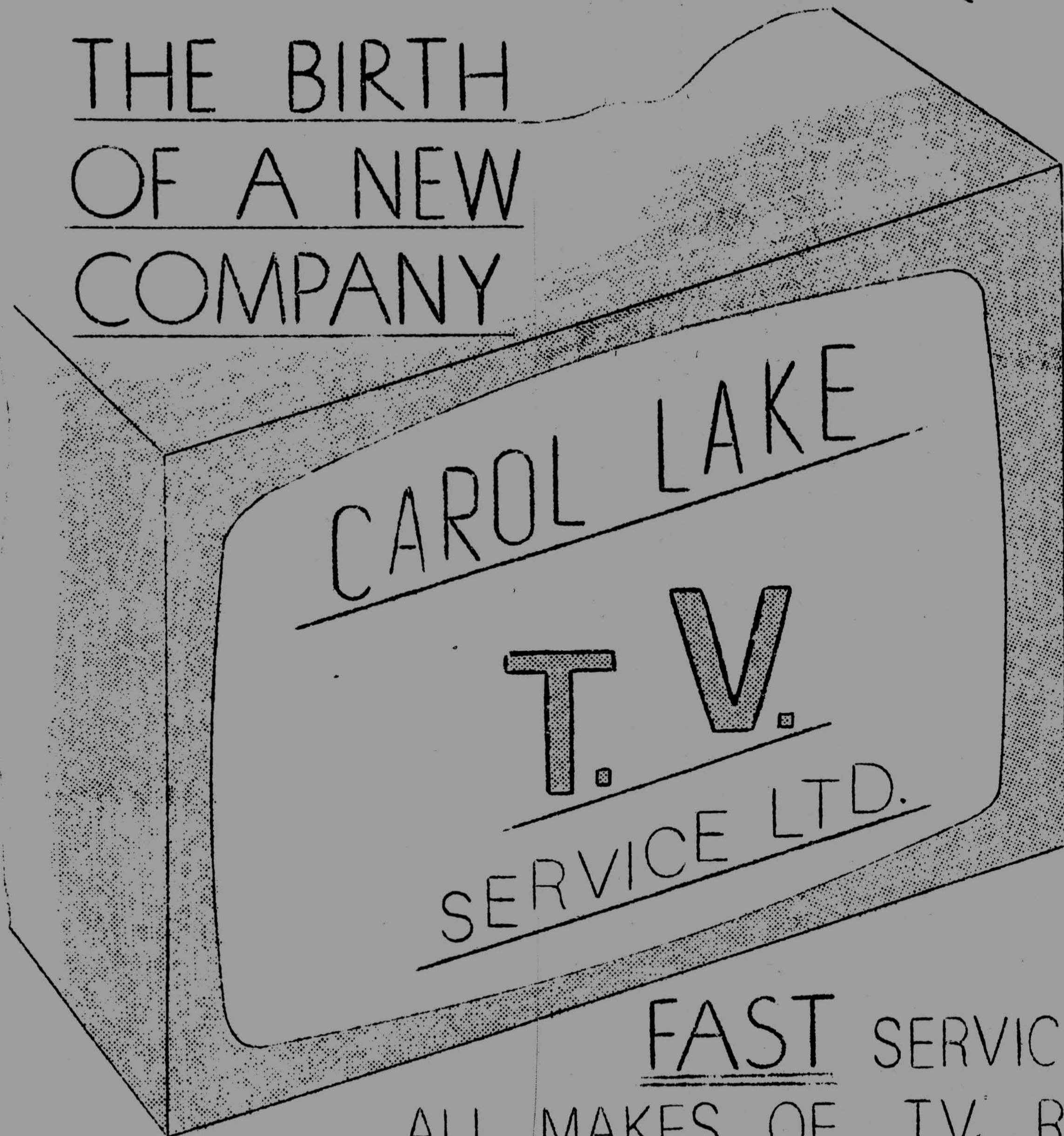

SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP

INGREDIENTS

8 oz flour  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1/2 oz. yeast  
1 tsp. sugar  
1/2 pt. warm milk  
4 eggs  
4 oz margarine  
4 oz. currants,  
candied peel and  
chopped nuts  
Hot rum syrup  
Cream and glacé  
fruits (optional)

RUM BABA (A FANCY BREAD)

Sieve the flour and salt into a bowl. Cream the yeast and sugar and add the warm milk. Pour the mixture into the centre of the dry ingredients and sprinkle flour on top. Put in a warm place to work for about 1/2 hour. Beat the eggs and add them with the melted fat to the mixture, beating well with the hand. Brush a large border mould or some small ones with melted fat, and put in currants, chopped peel and nuts. Half-fill moulds with yeast mixture, cover, and put in a warm place until the mixture rises to top of tins. Bake in a moderate oven (375°F) for about 3/4 hour, then turn out and prick the surface. Pour over some rum syrup (made by heating 4 oz sugar with 1/4 pint water, a squeeze of lemon juice, and rum to taste) and serve hot; or decorate with whipped cream and glacé fruits and serve cold.

PUBLIC NOTICE

The attention of the general public is directed to the fact that The Insurance Premiums Tax Act, 1968 has been proclaimed to come into force with effect from September 1st, 1968.

Persons who will be affected by the provisions of the Act are hereby requested to take due cognizance of the following sections thereof:

SECTION 3. Every person in the province who enters into a contract of insurance with an insurer shall pay a tax of seven per centum (7%) of the premium for such insurance and shall remain liable for the tax until it has been collected and remitted or paid to the Minister.

SECTION 4. (1) Where the insurer with whom insurance is to be effected maintains a place of business or has a representative in the province, the tax payable under this Act shall be paid by the person liable therefor to the insurer's agent through whom such insurance is effected and such insurer's agent shall receive the said tax on behalf of and in trust for Her Majesty and, if such person fails to pay the insurer's said tax, the insurer's agent shall immediately notify the Minister.

SECTION 5. (1) If the insurer with which the insurance is effected does not maintain a place of business in the province or does not have a representative within the province, then the person liable to pay the tax under this Act shall pay the tax to the Minister within one month after the date on which the premium in respect of which the tax is payable becomes due.

(2) If the person liable to pay the tax is not covered by subsection (1) or does not effect insurance through an insurer's agent in the province then the person shall pay the tax to the Minister within one month after the date on which the premium in respect of which the tax is payable becomes due.

It should be noted that the following classes of insurance, as defined by the Act, are not subject to the tax:

- (a) accident insurance or sickness insurance,
- (b) life insurance, or
- (c) marine insurance.
