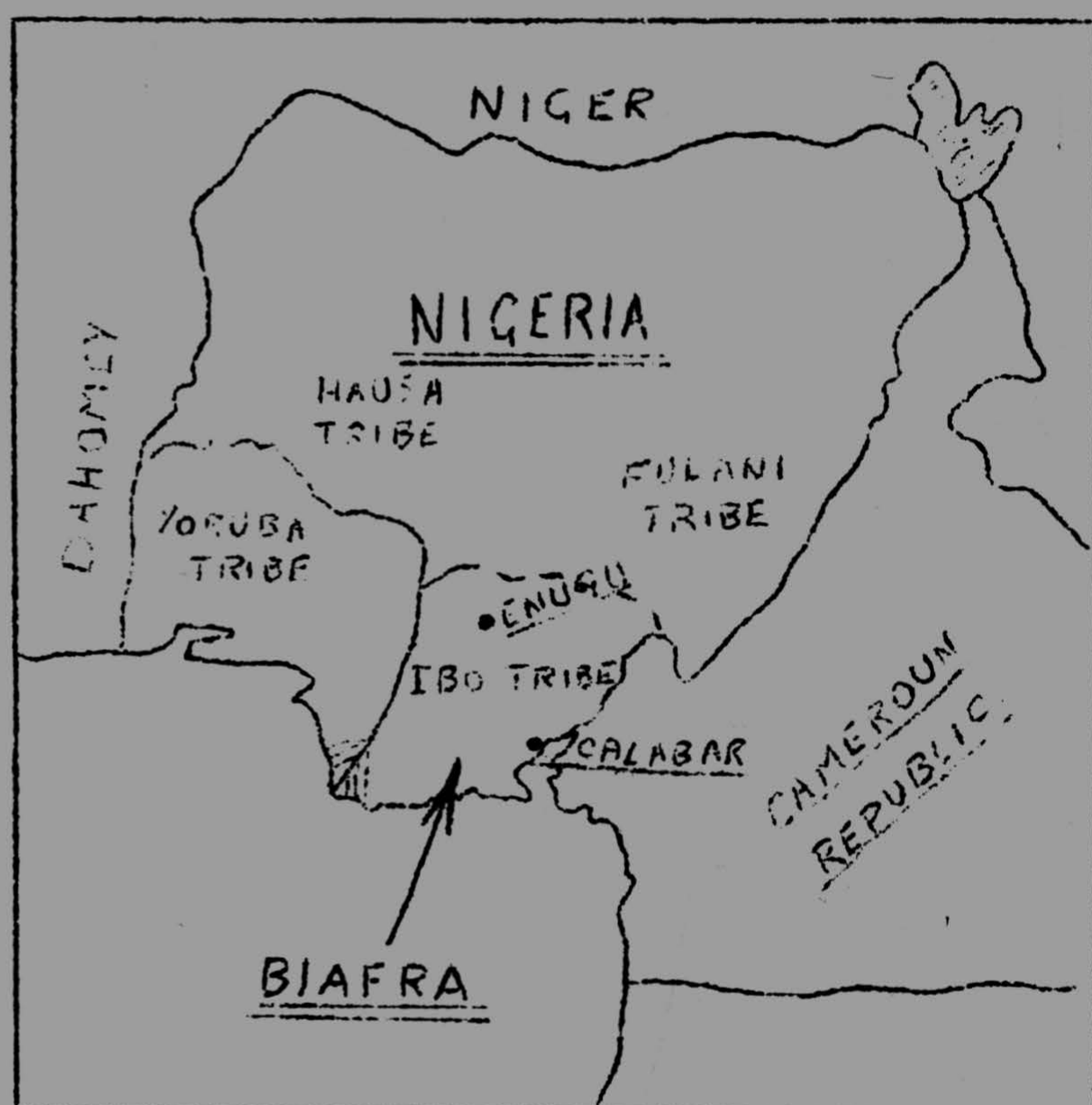

WE WERE PRIVILEGED OVER THE WEEKEND TO WELCOME BACK TO WABUSH AFTER AN ABSENCE OF FOUR YEARS, THE REV. DAVID CRAIG AND HIS WIFE NANCY.

IN THE FOLLOWING GUEST EDITORIAL, REV. CRAIG, UNTIL RECENTLY A MISSIONARY IN WAR RAVAGED BIAFRA, TELLS OF THE TRAGIC SUFFERING OF INNOCENT PEOPLE TRAPPED IN A CIVIL WAR.

The ancient missionary Isaiah was a dedicated man. His primary concern was "to bring good news to ordinary folk.....to bind up the broken-hearted..... to bring freedom to those who were enslaved to bring the peace of God to the hearts of men."

This same dedication 2,640 years later brought Jamaican and Scottish missionaries to the port town of Calabar in the Eastern Region of Nigeria, (now called Biafra). God blessed their work and many people became vital, committed Christians. Gradually the people of this area grew to appreciate and seek something else the missionaries brought; education. Because education arrived early to this area, the people rapidly gained a distinct advantage over other uneducated tribes. The Ibos, the major tribal group in the eastern area of Biafra were particularly aggressive and soon controlled most of Nigeria both economically and politically. (They had moved into Hausa, Fulani and Yoruba territory to take up excellent job opportunities for which they had become qualified.)

Unfortunately many Ibos, like many Canadians, had only a superficial veneer of Christianity. Desiring economic success they monopolized the business enterprises in the towns, excluding all non Ibos. They refused to intermarry with the other tribes. They tended to feel that because of their education they were somehow inherently better. They excluded non-Ibo children from their schools. Finally, whenever an Ibo man was in a position to employ others (which was often) he always turned to his own relatives and tribe, again excluding other tribal groups from opportunity.

Over the years feeling against the Ibos began to solidify. There were a number of incidents, which forced the Ibo to be even more exclusive. Finally in the fall of 1966, Hausa and other tribesmen, incensed by their leaders and in time aided by the army, began a systematic slaughter of Ibo people. An estimated 20 - 30 thousand died violently. Because of these organized slaughters Ibos from all parts of Nigeria fled for their lives. Approximately 2 million returned to their Eastern Region homeland, and were reabsorbed by town and village society. Then on May 30, 1967 their political and military leader Col. Odumegwu Ojukwu declared the former Eastern Region of Nigeria an independent republic to be called Biafra.

The Federal Nigerian government promptly replied by placing a blockade around Biafra, completely cutting it off from outside communication and shipping. War followed in July and eventually Biafra was completely encircled by Federal troops. Three minority tribal areas were taken by Federal Forces which left the Ibo people to fight on alone. Since the slaughters the Ibos have become completely convinced that to surrender would mean genocide. They believe rightly or wrongly that the Federal Government is pursuing a policy of complete annihilation. Meanwhile a colossal refugee problem is building up on both sides. Suffering, disease and death are everywhere. It has been conservatively estimated that one million refugees will die of starvation by the end of October. Some observers place the figure as high as three million.

This tragic conflict continues. Surely our role as Canadians ought to be one of humanitarian concern. Nigeria is a fellow member of the Commonwealth. Regardless of politics, starvation and death stalk on both sides of this conflict. We have already given food and drugs. But much more must be done.

pinch of salt
½ tsp. bicarbonate of soda
1 level tsp. cream of tartar
1 oz sugar
1 egg
¼ pint milk to mix (approximately)

Sieve the dry ingredients and add the sugar. Make a well in the centre and add the egg, (.mix carefully) Stir in the milk a little at a time, until the mixture is smooth and creamy. Pour mixture in tbsps. on to a hot girdle, and cook until it is golden, then turn and cook the other side.

Serve hot, with butter or jam.
