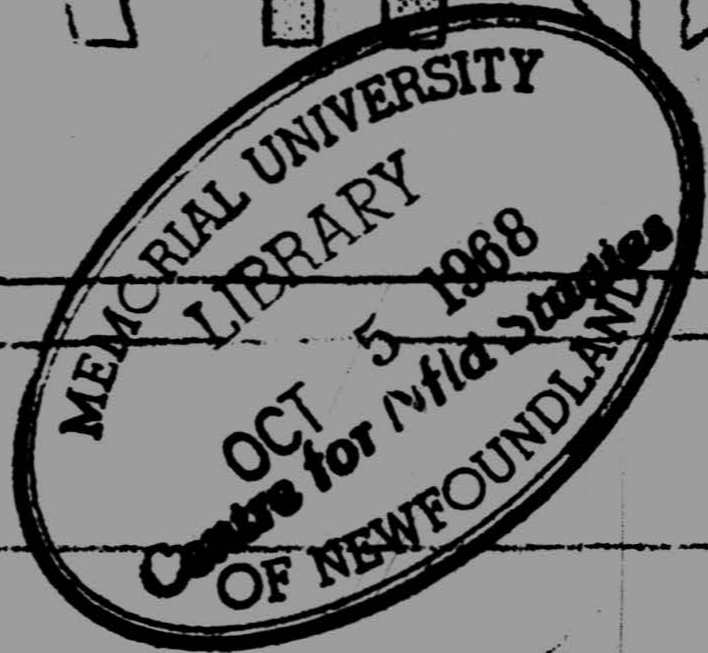

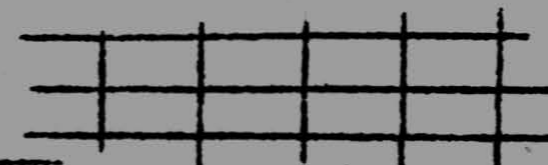

CORNER

LOOKING AFTER YOUR PETS

We are fast approaching winter now - a time for warm parkas and nice cozy boots to keep out the intense cold we have here in Labrador. For those of us who have experienced our long cold winters before, we know what to expect, and are prepared well in advance. Winter in Labrador is for most people a very enjoyable season, our towns provide the greatest entertainment and all the good things that make life pleasurable and worthwhile.

For some of our inhabitants however, winter means, pain, misery, starvation and even death by freezing. I refer of course to our animals. Domestic animals are not equipped to withstand the elements, and without our help they will surely perish. Nature didn't do this to them - man did - therefore man must provide food, water, and adequate shelter for them - THIS IS LAW.

Dogs of such breeds as Huskies, St. Bernards, Newfoundland dogs etc, prefer the outdoors, but adequate shelter must be provided even for them. Short-haired dogs should not be left tied outside for long periods, no matter how large he may be. His only protection is the coat that nature provided - no warm parka or boots to keep him from freezing to death. So this winter when you are sitting in your nice warm living room or lying in that cozy comfortable bed, give a thought to the misery some poor animal is suffering AND DO SOMETHING ABOUT IT.

Whatever happened to that little "fluff of fur, lined with a purr" that was so cute and cuddly six months ago - it's "just another darned old cat now" so out he goes, let him find another home, the kids have another toy now - the novelty has worn off. A KITTEN IS NOT A TOY, IT'S AN ANIMAL, it has feelings, it is very intelligent and contrary to some beliefs it is the cleanest and easiest of all domestic animals to house train. Like a dog it needs the warmth and companionship of home life. If you own a female cat and want to prevent unnecessary suffering to any offspring she may produce, make a visit to the vet with her, for chances are her kittens will end up like dozens of other poor cats that are roaming our towns right now, homeless, starving and doomed to die, come winter. The cruelest of all cruelties is abandonment of domestic pets, also according to the Criminal Code of Canada - a punishable offence.

A word on your pet's health. If you care enough for your pet, prevent unnecessary suffering by getting the vaccination against Distemper, Hard-pad, Infectious Hepatitis and Rabies. These are the diseases most common in dogs, but cats should also have their shots. We have had deaths lately here due to Distemper - don't let it happen to your pet. If you have some problem regarding your pet - give us a call, or better still JOIN THE S.P.C.A. and HELP US, HELP YOU.

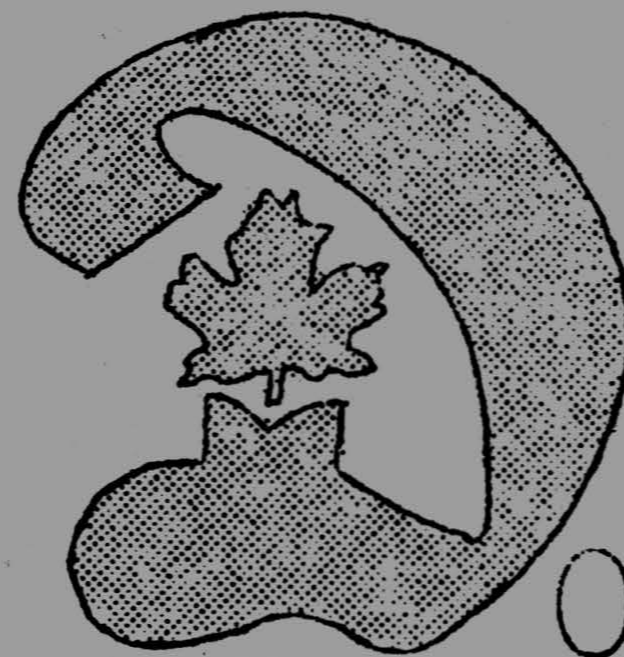

1 pastry shell  
2 pounds cooking apples  
6 onz sugar  
1 oz flour  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon  
1/2 pint double cream.

Prepare a 9-inch unbaked pastry shell.  
Bake 'blind'. Peel, core and slice apples  
thickly to fill. Combine sugar, flour, salt  
and cinnamon and add to apples. Toss lightly  
turn into shell. Pour cream over top and  
bake in hot oven (400°) for 35 to 40 mins.

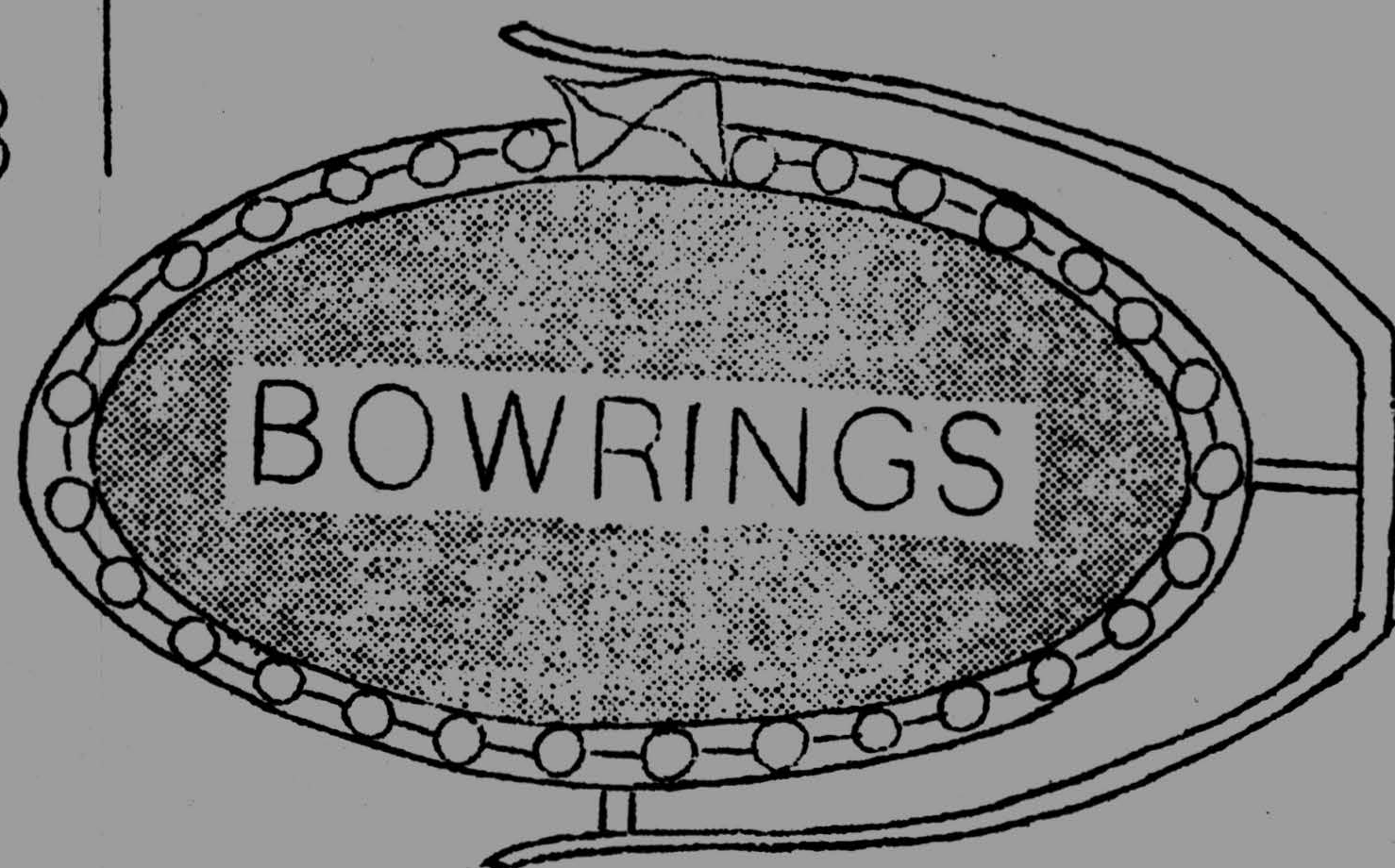
