

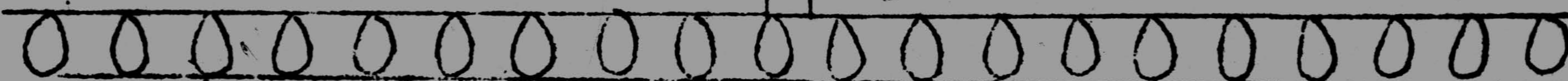

Many people have wondered where the old Labrador City Youth building which stood next to the Salvation Army church has disappeared to. As a matter of fact it has been dismantled and stored away in one of the town garages till next Spring, when we hope to sell it. The money will then be put towards a new building, that is, if we can get one at a reasonable price.

Nothing could be done to stop the building from being dismantled. In our contract with the Salvation Army church we agreed to have the building moved by the last of October - a promise we found very hard to keep, costs being so high.

If, in the Spring we are not able to sell the building, it will probably be re-constructed to serve us another year or so for our dances etc, until a new one can be constructed. However, a building such as this cannot be built over night, it takes money, time and patience and fortunately most of the people understand this and are trying very much to help us over these problems.

////// HOW TO CARE FOR YOUR ANIMALS ////

At Christmas children and even adults receive a pet as a gift, so to help you look after your pet, here are a few important things you should know in order to have a healthy animal. Take good care of him and no matter what happens be ready at all times to stick by him, as he would most certainly stick by you. When a person buys a new car, they look after it well to ensure that it will never let them down. They keep it clean they keep the gas tank full and have heaters to keep it warm so that it doesn't freeze up during the night. If a person didn't look after their car this way, in no time at all the car would cease to function. An animal, like a car, needs lots of attention, but unlike a car, it has feelings and suffers dreadfully if we don't attend to its need. A dog's basic needs for

example are:-

- (a) SHELTER FROM SUN, RAIN AND COLD.
- (b) COOL, FRESH WATER EVERY DAY.
- (c) GOOD NUTRITIOUS FOOD - AND ENOUGH OF IT.
- (d) RELIEF FROM PARASITES AND DISEASE. COMFORT WHEN HE IS ILL AND THE BEST MEDICAL ATTENTION POSSIBLE.
- (e) AND LAST BUT NOT LEAST COMPANIONSHIP FROM YOU, HIS MASTER OR MISTRESS.

Every cat needs:-

- (a) HIS OWN SPECIAL PLACE WHERE HE CAN LIE UNDISTURBED
- (b) GOOD NUTRITIOUS FOOD TO EAT AND MILK TO DRINK
- (c) FRESH WATER WHERE HE CAN GET IT ANYTIME HE FEELS THIRSTY
- (d) A SAND-BOX OR LITTER-BOX, WHICH SHOULD BE CHANGED OFTEN.
- (e) AND LOTS OF PLAYTIME AND LOVING WHEN HE FEELS LIKE IT.

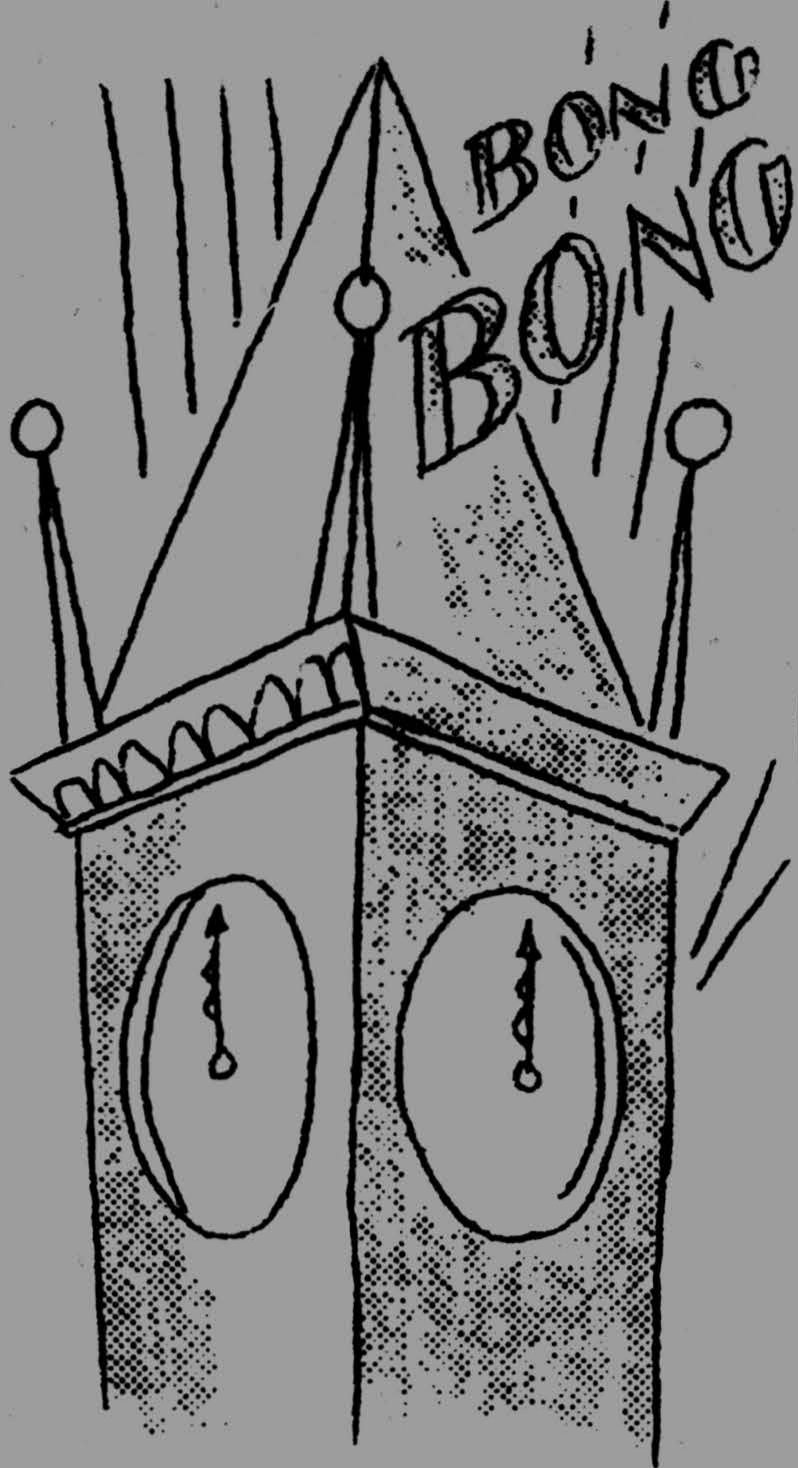

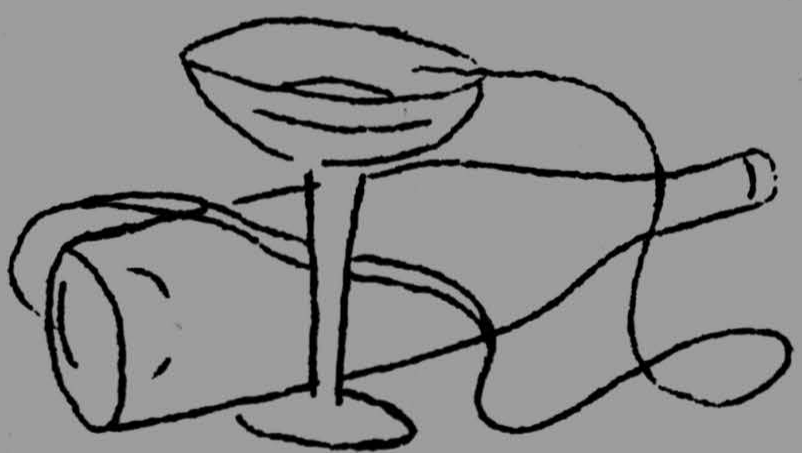

FLYING CLUB NEWS

The Wabush Aero Club is pleased to announce that they have obtained the services of a new flying instructor.

MR. GORDON WATT and his wife CHARMINE have taken up residence in Labrador City as of the fifteenth of this month. Gordon is an experienced instructor with more than 1000 hours behind him in teaching others to fly. In addition he has licences qualifying him to operate twin-engined equipment and helicopters. His wife is a pilot also, holding a valid private pilot's licence and working on her commercial ticket. Welcome to Labrador City folks !

For those who aren't familiar with our operation, the Wabush Aero Club is a non-profit organization licenced by the Department of Transport to provide flying, training and facilities for recreational flying from a base at the airport.

We operate two modern Cessna 150 training aircraft for this purpose and, as mentioned above, retain a full time professional instructor to conduct and supervise flying activities. The old airline terminal building at the airport has been renovated and provides us with a cozy clubhouse and office facilities.

Membership is open to the public at \$25.00 per year. This is a requirement of the Royal Canadian Flying Club Association of which our club is an associate member. Membership entitles you to rent fully insured, modern aircraft from both this and all member clubs in Canada for the purpose of obtaining a pilots licence or for recreational flying. Rental rates are reasonable and are comparable to clubs "outside".

At present we have more than sixty members, and approximately half of these are licenced pilots. In addition to the two club aircraft there are seven privately owned machines tied down outside the clubhouse which get airborne most weekends.

Persons interested in learning to fly can obtain more information by phoning the club at 282 - 6773 (from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm) Tuesday to Sunday inclusive, or better yet, drop out and view our facilities. For a nominal sum Gordon will take you up for a familiarization flight during which you will handle the controls and get an idea of what flying is all about. It is not necessary for you to be a club member to take this first flight.
