" MINOR HOCKEY WEEK IN CANADA "

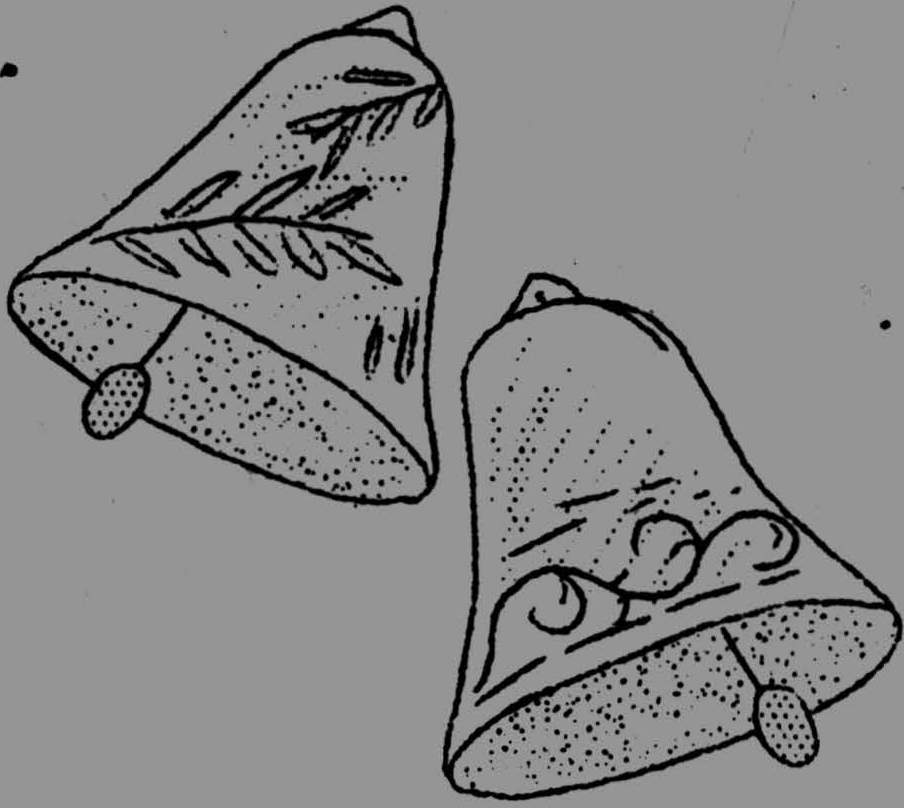
and request that all parents and others support this observance by attending games during Minor Hockey Week and thereafter until the minor hockey season ends.

CARE OF CATS

Cats are intelligent, and capable of affection and devotion. Talk to your cat, but never pet him when he wishes to be left alone. Many cats and dogs get on quite well together. Cats have keen sight and hearing. They are naturally very clean and should be let out of doors regularly, if the weather is suitable. Otherwise a box half filled with sand must be available. Cats like to lie on anything raised from the ground. A cat needs warmth and should not be left out-doors at night, in order to keep him safe from dogs, to prevent annoyance to neighbours, and protect the birds from his natural hunting instinct. MANPOWER REVIEW

General Information

Last week using a negative approach I attempted to point out the criteria necessary for a Mobility Grant under the Manpower Mobility Program. The article stressed the principle that a Mobility Grant was only given to an unemployed worker in order to move him to another area where work is available. Also the worker had to apply for the grant before moving and be authorized by a Canada Manpower Centre to move.

There are two types of Mobility Grants. First there is the exploratory grant which pays for the transportation of the worker to his new job. Second there is the Relocation Grant which will pay for the Transportation of the worker's dependents, their furniture and gives financial compensation to help establish them in their new area.

It must be noted that a Mobility Grant as it is applied to this area is usually only given to a worker who has a job before coming to Labrador City or Wabush. The reason for this fact is that 98% of the incoming workers who receive Mobility Grants are Mine employees and approximately 85% - 90% of the Mine employees are hired prior to coming to this area. However, in most cases an Exploratory Grant will be issued to a worker paying his transportation to his new job.

It is our job as a receiving office to determine if the worker is going to permanently relocate in this area before we continue with the second step - The Relocation Grant.

To determine whether the single worker is going to permanently relocate is somewhat difficult. We usually wait until the worker is on union status and gather recommendations on his working performance from his supervisors. If all information gathered indicates that the single worker will be staying permanently in the area, we will authorize a relocation grant. For the single worker a relocation grant involves \$200.00 payable over a period of five months.

However, the area in which we have given the greatest assistance in the past and which has proved most beneficial is the relocation grant as applied to the married worker. With the married worker we will authorize a relocation grant as soon as the worker finds accommodation for his family. This can be either in the form of an apartment, trailer or house. When accommodations are established we proceed to:

- (1) Pay the cost of transportation of the worker's dependants.
- (2) Move the family's furniture to the area.
- (3) Set up a re-establishment allowance to help the family become established.

The amount given is computed as follows: \$200.00 for the worker, \$200.00 for his wife, and \$100.00 for each dependant to a maximum of \$1000.00.

- (4) Finally, if the worker owned a home (house) in the area from which he previously came, he could either sell this house or buy a new house in the area. A payment of \$500.00 compensation for leaving this house could be issued - this is called Home Owner's Allowance.

I must finally stress that we authorize this relocation grant in most cases only after a worker has received a relocation grant to come to this area, or in other words, had his transportation paid to this area by Canada Manpower. I only re-iterate this because many workers who have not been authorized to move under the Manpower Mobility Program come to us asking assistance in helping to bring their families to the area. The program was designed to move the unemployed worker to a job - and only after this first step is accomplished do we give assistance to his family in order to have them join him.

Briefly I have tried to give you an idea of what is involved in the Manpower Mobility Program. It is a very sound Federal Project with good control and it has had 73% success over the past year in relocating unemployed workers in the Atlantic Provinces.

The impact of this program over the next ten to fifteen years will greatly enhance the balance of unemployment in Canada by moving family units to area where a good standard of living can be attained.

/// SIMPLE RECIPES TO CUT OUT AND KEEP ///

CHEESE CRUMBLE

2 onz sliced mushrooms
1 chopped onion
1/2 lb minced beef
1/2 lb sausage meat
4 tomatoes (sliced)
1 beef stock cube
salt and pepper to taste

TOPPING

margarine (about 2 onz)
4 onz. flour
2 onz. grated cheese
salt and pepper.

Fry onion in about 1 oz of fat, add mince and sausage meat and fry until is is brown. Dissolve cube in water and pour over mixture, adding salt and pepper. Place in ovenproof dish. Arrange tomatoe slices and mushrooms on the top. Rub margarine into the flour, adding seasoning and cheese. Sprinkle over meat mixture. Bake at 375° for approximately 40 minutes. Enough for 6 people.

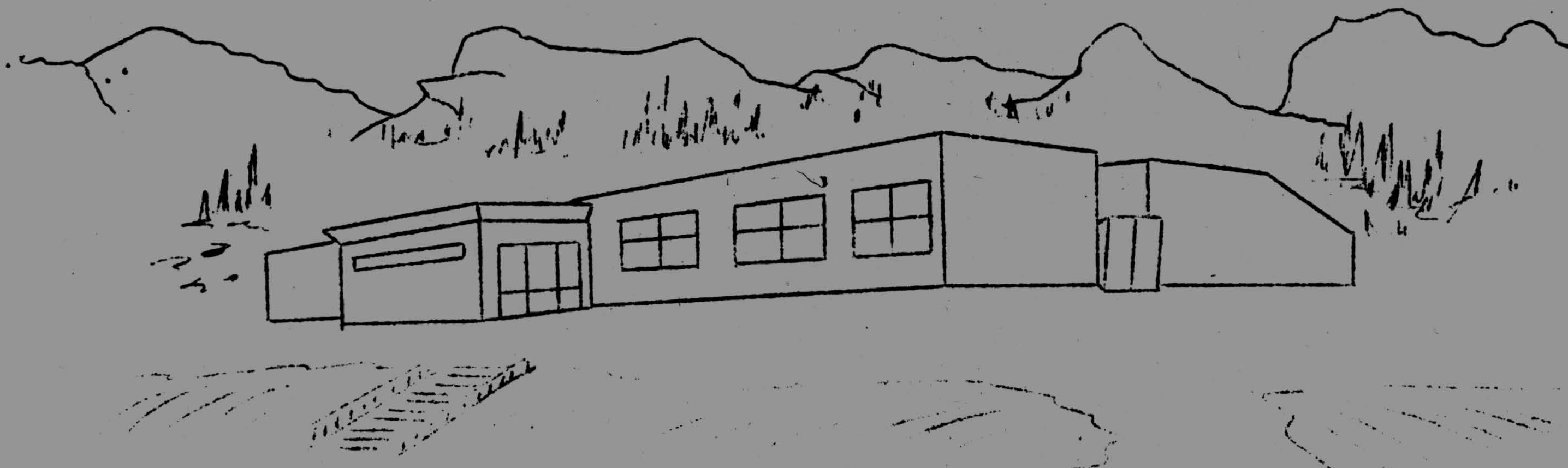

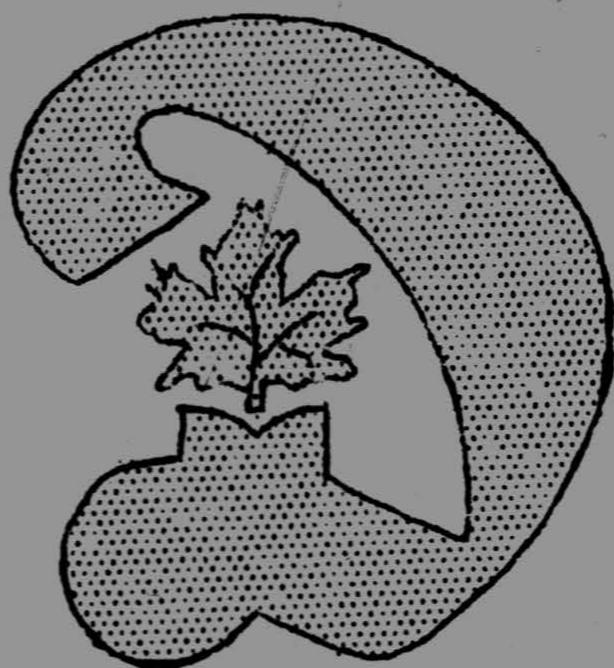
