Gander was the first team to arrive at the Wabush Airport on Tuesday. The boys checked in at 2:30 pm. followed by the Conception Bay South Cheer Leaders at 7:00 pm. The centres of Corner Brook, Grand Falls and St. John's are expected to arrive in time to open the tournament at 9:00 am on Friday, March 28th when Labrador City faces off against Corner Brook.

The Gander Pee Wee's won the 1967-68 "A" tournament held at Grand Falls last year and coach Bill Parrott reports the boys are in good shape - winning five exhibition games against the centres of Grand Falls, Lewisporte and Clarenville, prior to departing for Labrador City. Coach Bill Parrott is also director of the Pee Wee League at Gander and team manager, Jim Froake, an avid Minor Hockey promoter is affiliated with the Senior Gander Flyers Club.

Rollie Belleveau, Mrs Audrey Fifield and Wally Kerr made up the reception committee for the cheer leaders who were accompanied by Mr & Mrs Wilson Butler. Mr Butler is the acting chairman of the N.A.H.A. Minor Hockey Committee and coach of the Conception Bay Pee Wees. He has been active in Minor Hockey for many years in the St. John's and Conception Bay Areas, where his determination to provide hockey for his boys meant meeting difficult travelling schedules to and from St. John's for games and practices. Mr. Butler's team's strength is not known to us this year, but if last year's performance is anything to go by, they are not to be underestimated.

Corner Brook, unfortunately, is a 'dark horse' to us at Labrador City and we have had no 'scouts' on the West Coast. St. John's with its larger population from which to choose a team will present a challenge to everyone in the tournament. Grand Falls is always developing strength in their well-organized Minor Hockey programme, so the only real test is to buy a family ticket for \$1.00, come down to the arena and see the teams play!

Our own team coach, Jack Drover reports that his players are in fine condition and eager to start the tournament. So come on down to the arena, one family ticket enables you to see 15 games of action-filled hockey. The championship game which is to be played on Sunday, March 30th. is not included in your family ticket.

In conclusion I would like to thank all the mothers in Labrador City and Wabush for their kind cooperation and understanding in billeting the boys for much longer than the anticipated schedule.

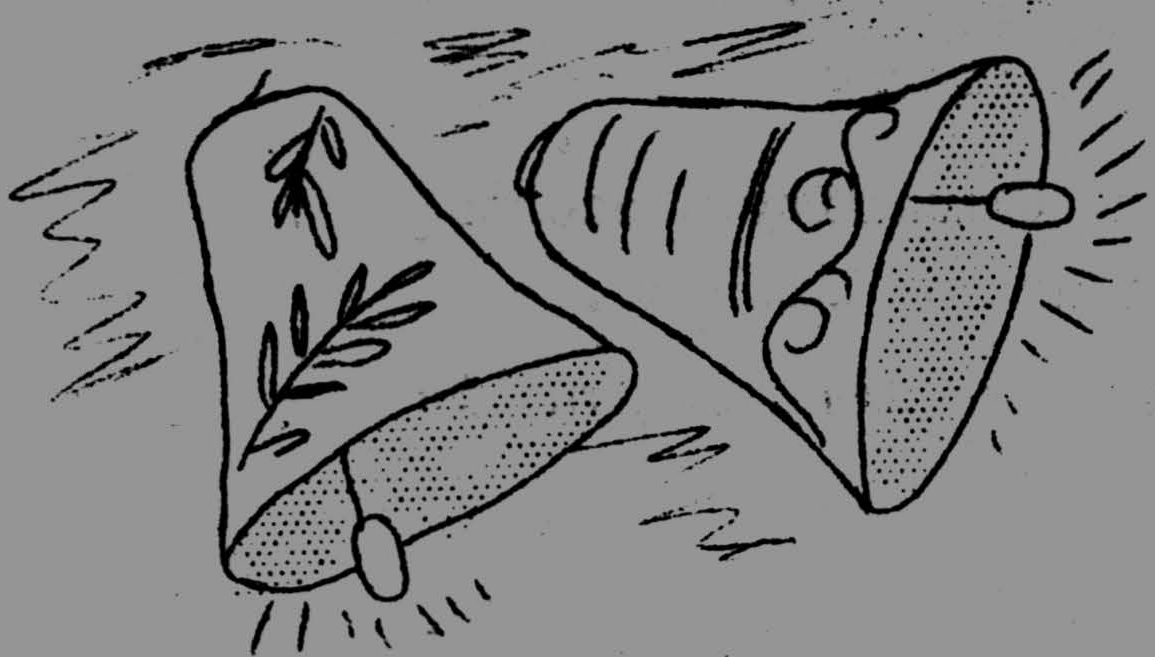

GRADE X CONFEDERATION SCHOLARSHIPS

As announced last year by the Honourable F.W. Rowe, Minister of Education, the Grade X Confederation Scholarships for 1969 will be awarded on the basis of a special scholarship examination. Formerly, these scholarships were offered to the two hundred and fifty students in schools of four classrooms and over receiving highest marks in the Grade X Public Examinations.

The scholarship examination will be constructed at a suitable level of difficulty for Grade X in English and Mathematics and will be written on MAY 12th. Application forms, if not already received by eligible schools, may be obtained from the Division of Public Examinations.

The Nursing Services Department of the Newfoundland Division of Red Cross reports a very active year. Programmes under this department include, among others, courses in Home Nursing and Sickroom Loan equipment.

The Divisional Headquarters reports that in 1968 there were 280 individuals who took advantage of the Care in the Home instruction courses given by Red Cross. This course covers Home Nursing, Nutrition, Hygiene, Baby and Child Care. The Course is conducted by volunteer registered nurses and provides ready information for volunteer nursing assistants who give many hours of service to hospitals and homes for the aged.

One thousand, two hundred and forty-nine people in Newfoundland used one thousand five hundred and eighty-one items of Sickroom equipment, which was loaned to them free of charge for periods of up to three months. Items available from Red Cross include hospital type beds, wheelchairs, crutches, backrests and numerous other small items.

By having this equipment available means, in some cases, patients can return from hospital earlier than would otherwise be possible and this also relieves valuable bed space in hospitals. For the protection of patients, a Doctor's or Registered Nurse's consent must be obtained before Red Cross will issue equipment.

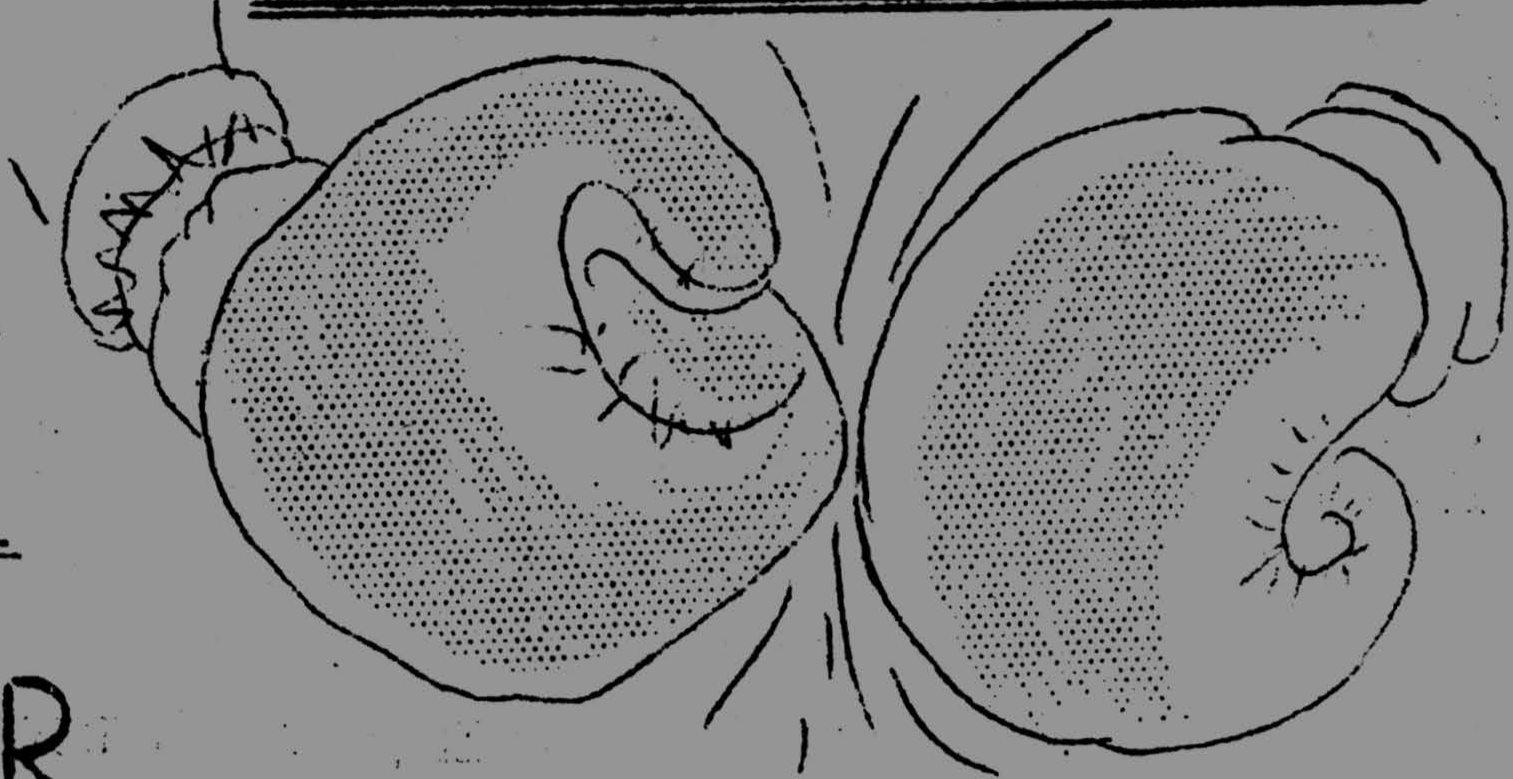

MAGISTRATES COURT

A Labrador City man was convicted of driving his vehicle on Avalon Drive while his ability was impaired by alcohol or a drug. He was fined \$50.00 and his driver's licence was suspended for six months.

A Labrador City resident and a Wabush resident were convicted of having a fire-arm in a place other than a dwelling house or a place of business without a valid licence. They were fined \$25.00 each.

A Labrador City man was convicted of illegal possession of alcohol and fined \$25.00.

A resident of Labrador City was convicted of impaired driving. He was fined \$50.00 and his driver's licence was suspended for six months.

A Labrador City man was convicted of assault and given a one-year suspended sentence. He was ordered to sign a bond in the amount of \$100.00.

A male resident of Labrador City was convicted of theft of an amount exceeding \$50.00. He was given a 2-year suspended sentence and was ordered to sign a bond in the amount of \$500.00.

A Labrador City resident was fined \$10.00 for not keeping his dog safely tethered or penned up at all times or under the control of someone capable of controlling it.

A Labrador City man was convicted on two charges of assault and one charge of damaging personal property. He was sentenced to one month in jail on each charge, the terms to run concurrently.

AMBLYOPIA is an eye condition which, if not detected before a child reaches the age of seven years, inevitably leaves its victim blind in one eye for rest of his life.

The earlier the detection however, the better is the child's chance to recover his vision through special eye exercises, patching, corrective lenses or muscle surgery.

Between four and seven per cent of the adult population are one-eyed people because of amblyopia. It is possible that approximately ten to fifteen per cent of our pre-school age population are suffering from this condition.

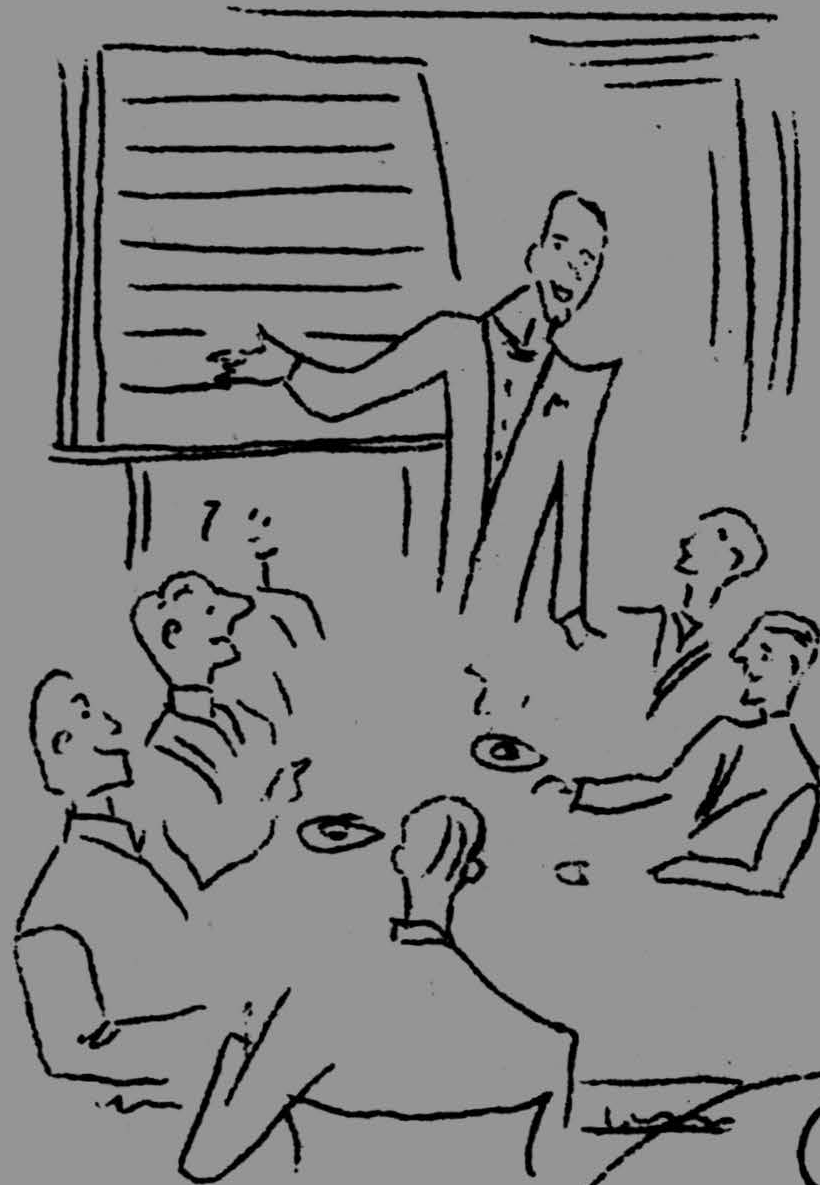

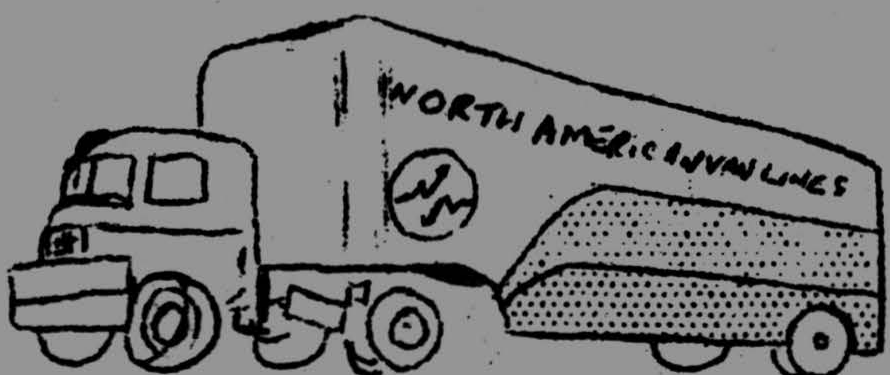
